Introduction

Acquisition of literacy skills is critical for individuals to cope with their economic and social life. Participation in literacy programme has a variety of benefits ranging from having improved self-esteem, empowerment and creativity to critical thinking. With reference to financial support from Al-Maktoum Foundation, UNESCO Eastern Africa Regional Office commenced implementation of a project to promote literacy and life skills education amongst Somali Youth and adults with focus on women. The main thrusts of the project are development of literacy strategy framework, curriculum framework development, harmonization of learning materials, establishment of model community learning centers, capacity development of Federal and Regional Ministries of Education and delivery of literacy and life skills classes to target groups in all three regions of Somalia.

The 2nd Steering committee meeting

This is the follow-up of the first steering committee meeting. As of the project agreement that covers this project, a Steering Committee is going to meet in order to deliberate on the progress made, issues and challenges encountered, and agree on the way forward in terms project management. The first steering committee meeting took place in Nairobi on September 9, 2015. After that many activities have been implemented like need assessment of the literacy and skills for life, Preparation of literacy frameworks, drafting of teaching and learning materials. This 2nd steering committee meeting will take place in Nairobi on May 14, 2015 to oversee the implementation of the project for the last six months.
