Workshop	The countries in Eastern and Southern Africa have recognised the Artisanal and Small-scale Mining (ASM) operators in the new mining legislation and regulation. The important element in the legislation is the formalisation of the ASM operators and the issuing of special licenses for the ASM sector. The countries in Eastern and Southern Africa have use different approach to enforce the new legislation and the experience is different from country to country. Therefore, there is a need for a regional workshop to exchange lessons learned and receive inspiration from other countries in the Eastern and Southern Africa.
Approach and Training methods	The course is aimed at staff from "Ministry of Mines" meaning <i>national geological surveys</i> and <i>national mining authorities</i> as well as <i>universities</i> and other academic institutions. The course will apply an interactive mode of learning through established adult learning principles.
Timing, duration, and number of participants	The workshop is scheduled from 2 to 5 September 2015 at the Naura Spring Hotel in Arusha. No. of participants will be 40-50 from Anglophone countries mainly in the Eastern and Southern Africa Region It is anticipated that participants will be from: 1. National Geological Surveys 2. National Mining Authorities 3. Universities and other academic institutions 4. Association of ASM operators and 5. NGOs having an interest in ASM
