/ Preserving the Integrity of Sport Commitment to the values of sport and the fight against match fixing, doping and corruption in sport MINEPS was created to facilitate exchange in physical education and sport and to articulate a coherent international strategy in this domain. Accordingly, the Conference convenes government representatives, organisations from the United Nations system and the sport movement.

The first session of *MINEPS* was held at UNESCO Headquarters, in Paris, in 1976. Since its creation, three further *MINEPS* Conferences have been held (Moscow 1988, Punta del Este 1999 and Athens 2004). The recommendations arising from these fora have helped to strengthen the educational, cultural and social dimensions of physical education and sport.

As the only global platform of its kind in the world, *MINEPS* is unique. Its outcomes guide the implementation of effective policies and practices by governments around the world. Since 1976, *MINEPS* has made a number of substantial contributions to international dialogue and policy development – from the elaboration of the seminal International Charter of Physical Education and Sport (1978), which establishes the practice of physical education and sport as a fundamental right for all and which remains at the cornerstone of international cooperation in physical education and sport; to the negotiation of the International Convention against Doping in Sport (2005) which now has more than 170 States Parties.

The Conference is co-organised by the German Federal Government, represented by the Federal Ministry of the Interior (BMI), and UNESCO, with the support of the International Council of Sport Science and Physical Education (ICSSPE).
