Background: In pursuance of a proposal from the People's Republic of China for the establishment of an international centre on space technologies for cultural and natural heritage in Beijing, China as a category 2 centre under the auspices of UNESCO, the Executive Board, at its 179th session, examined the feasibility study presented by the Director-General.

Purpose: Following 179 EX/Decision 7, the present document contains a draft resolution recommended by the Executive Board for the approval of the establishment in Beijing, China of the above-described centre. For reference, document 179 EX/7 describes the proposal and analyses the feasibility of the centre which is in conformity with document 33 C/19 relating to the principles and guidelines for the establishment and functioning of institutes and centres under the auspices of UNESCO (categories 1 and 2) as approved by the General Conference in 33 C/Resolution 90, and contains, as an Annex, the Draft Agreement between UNESCO and the Government of the People's Republic of China.

- 1. The Executive Board, at its 179th session, considered item 7 on the proposed establishment in Beijing, China, of an international centre on space technologies for cultural and natural heritage as a category 2 centre under the auspices of UNESCO. Having examined document 179 EX/7 which describes the proposal and analyses the feasibility of the proposed centre in complete accordance with document 33 C/19 relating to the principles and guidelines for the establishment and functioning of institutes and centres under the auspices of UNESCO (category 2), as approved by the General Conference in 33 C/Resolution 90, the Executive Board welcomed the proposal to place this proposed centre under UNESCO's auspices.
- 2. The Executive Board recommended that the General Conference, at its 35th session, approve the proposal to grant to the said centre the status of a category 2 institute under the auspices of UNESCO and that it authorize the Director-General to sign an agreement with the Government of the People's Republic of China for the establishment and operation of the abovementioned centre (179 EX/Decision 7).
- 3. The Executive Board also requested the Director-General, in conformity with Article 16 of the Model Agreement contained in Annex II to 33 C/Resolution 90, to conduct an evaluation before any renewal of the agreement to be concluded between the Government of the People's Republic of China and UNESCO takes effect, and to share the results of such an evaluation with the Executive Board for its review.
- 4. In view of the above, the General Conference may wish to consider the following draft resolution:

- 2. Having examined document 35 C/20 Part I,
- 3. <u>Welcomes</u> the proposal of the Government of the People's Republic of China to establish an international centre on space technologies for natural and cultural heritage in Beijing, China, under the auspices of UNESCO, which is in line with the existing principles and guidelines for institutes and centres, as outlined in document 33 C/19, approved by the General Conference in 33 C/Resolution 90;
- 4. <u>Approves</u> the establishment of the International Centre on Space Technologies for Cultural and Natural Heritage in Beijing, China, under the auspices of UNESCO (category 2); and
- 5. <u>Authorizes</u> the Director-General to sign the Agreement between UNESCO and the Government of the People's Republic of China contained in the annex to document 179 EX/7, it being understood that the evaluation referred to in its Article 16 must be conducted before any renewal of the agreement and that the result thereof must be shared with the Executive Board for review.

Background: In pursuance of a proposal from the Government of the Dominican Republic for the establishment of a water centre for sustainable development in Central America and the Caribbean under the auspices of UNESCO, in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic, the Executive Board of UNESCO, at its 177th session, requested the Director-General to begin a study of the proposal (177 EX/Decision 68). At its 18th session, the Intergovernmental Council of the International Hydrological Programme (IHP) adopted Resolution XVIII-3 welcoming the establishment of the centre. The Secretariat proceeded to perform the corresponding feasibility study. Thereafter the Executive Board, at its 180th session, recommended (180 EX/Decision 19, Part I) that the General Conference, at its 35th session, approve the establishment of a centre for the sustainable management of water resources in the Caribbean Island States as a centre under the auspices of UNESCO (category 2), and that it authorize the Director-General to sign the Agreement between UNESCO and the Government of the Dominican Republic contained in Annex II to document 180 EX/19 Part I.

Purpose: Following 180 EX/Decision 19, Part I, the present document contains a draft resolution for the General Conference for the approval of the establishment in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic, of the above-described centre. For reference, document 180 EX/19 Part I describes the proposal and analyses the feasibility of the centre which is in conformity with document 33 C/19 relating to the principles and guidelines for the establishment and functioning of institutes and centres under the auspices of UNESCO (categories 1 and 2) as approved by the General Conference in 33 C/Resolution 90, and contains, as Annex II, the Draft Agreement between UNESCO and the Government of the Dominican Republic.

- The Executive Board, at its 177th session, at the request of the Government of the Dominican Republic, considered item 68 on the proposed establishment in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic, of a water centre for sustainable development in Central America and the Caribbean as a category 2 centre under the auspices of UNESCO, and requested the Director-General to begin a study of the proposal. At its 18th session, the Intergovernmental Council of the International Hydrological Programme (IHP) adopted Resolution XVIII-3 welcoming the establishment of the centre. At its 180th session, the Executive Board, having examined document 180 EX/19 Part I, which describes the proposal and analyses the feasibility of a centre for the sustainable management of water resources in the Caribbean Island States, in accordance with the guidelines contained in document 33 C/19 relating to the principles and guidelines for the establishment and functioning of institutes and centres under the auspices of UNESCO (category 2) as approved by the General Conference in 33 C/Resolution 90, welcomed the proposal for the establishment of this Centre. Background: In response to a request by the Government of the State of Israel for the establishment of an International Training and Education Centre in Proteomics, Functional Genomics and Bioinformatics (BIOmics) at the Weizmann Institute of Science, Rehovot, Israel, as a category 2 centre under the auspices of UNESCO, a technical mission was undertaken in February 2008. This mission sought to evaluate the feasibility of establishing the proposed centre.

Purpose: Following 181 EX/Decision 17, Part I, the present document contains a draft resolution recommended by the Executive Board for the approval of the granting to the centre of the status of a category 2 centre under UNESCO's auspices. Background: The Republic of the Philippines proposed to establish a South-East Asian Centre for Lifelong Learning for Sustainable Development (SEA-CLLSD) as a category 2 centre under the auspices of UNESCO. Following this request, a technical mission was undertaken in March 2008 to assess the feasibility of establishing the proposed centre. This was followed by further consultations and meetings between the UNESCO Secretariat and stakeholders in the Philippines in May 2008, September 2008 and June 2009. The evaluation of the centre was carried out in conformity with the criteria approved by the Executive Board in 181 EX/Decision 16, pursuant to 34 C/Resolution 90, concerning the creation of institutes and centres under the auspices of UNESCO. At its 182nd session, the Executive Board welcomed the proposal and recommended by 182 EX/Decision 20 (I) that the General Conference at its 35th session approve the establishment of the centre and authorize the Director-General to sign an agreement with the Government of the Philippines to establish the centre under the auspices of UNESCO.

Purpose: This document contains the draft resolution recommended by the Executive Board for the approval of the establishment in Manila, the Philippines, of the above-mentioned centre. For reference, document 182 EX/20 Part II describes the proposal and analyses the feasibility of the centre pursuant to the technical mission. It contains, as an Annex, the Draft Agreement between UNESCO and the Government of the Republic of the Philippines.

- 1. The Executive Board at its 182nd session considered item 20, Part II of document 182 EX/20 on the proposed establishment of a South-East Asian Centre for Lifelong Learning for Sustainable Development (SEA-CLLSD) in the Philippines as a category 2 centre under the auspices of UNESCO. The Executive Board subsequently recommended by 182 EX/Decision 20 (I) that the General Conference at its 35th session approve the creation of the said centre as a category 2 centre under the auspices of UNESCO and that it authorize the Director-General to sign an Agreement with the Government of the Republic of the Philippines concerning the establishment and operation of the centre.

Background: At the 34th session of the General Conference, the President of the Republic of Bulgaria announced his Government's intention to propose the establishment in Sofia (Bulgaria) of a regional centre for the safeguarding of intangible cultural heritage in South-Eastern Europe, as a category 2 centre under the auspices of UNESCO. In response to a Request for Action submitted in March 2009, the Director-General carried out a feasibility study on the proposed category 2 centre. The Director-General's report on his feasibility study was presented to the 182nd session of the Executive Board (182 EX/20 Part VIII).

Purpose: Following 182 EX/Decision 20 (VII), the present document contains a draft resolution recommended by the Executive Board for the approval of the granting of the status of a category 2 centre under UNESCO's auspices to the regional centre for the safeguarding of intangible cultural heritage in South-Eastern Europe. For reference, document 182 EX/20 Part VIII describes the proposal and analyses the feasibility of the centre which is in conformity with the relevant principles and guidelines for the establishment and functioning of institutes and centres under the auspices of UNESCO (category 2), and contains, in its Annex, the Draft Agreement between UNESCO and the Government of the Republic of Bulgaria.

- 1. The Executive Board, at its 182nd session, considered item 20 part VIII on the proposed establishment in the Republic of Bulgaria of a regional centre for the safeguarding of intangible cultural heritage in South-Eastern Europe under the auspices of UNESCO (category 2). Having examined document 182 EX/20 Part VIII which describes the proposal and analyses the feasibility of the centre in accordance with the relevant guidelines relating to the principles and guidelines for the establishment and functioning of institutes and centres under the auspices of UNESCO (category 2), the Executive Board welcomed the proposal to establish the Centre and to place it under UNESCO's auspices. The Executive Board recommended that the General Conference at its 35th session approve the proposal to grant to the said centre the status of a category 2 centre under the auspices of UNESCO and that it authorize the Director-General to sign an agreement with the Government of the Republic of Bulgaria concerning the establishment and operation of the centre (182 EX/Decision 20 (VII).
- 2. In view of the above, the General Conference may wish to consider the following draft resolution:

- 1. Recalling 33 C/Resolution 90, 34 C/Resolution 90 and 182 EX/Decision 20 (VII),
- 2. <u>Considering</u> that the international community should contribute to the safeguarding of the intangible cultural heritage in a spirit of cooperation and mutual assistance,
- 3. Welcomes the proposal of the Government of the Republic of Bulgaria to establish in Sofia a regional centre for the safeguarding of intangible cultural heritage in South-Eastern Europe under the auspices of UNESCO, in conformity with the Integrated Comprehensive Strategy for category 2 institutes and centres under the auspices of UNESCO adopted by the 181st session of the Executive Board (181 EX/Decision 16) under the authority delegated to it by the General Conference in its 34 C/Resolution 90;
- Approves the establishment in Sofia of the regional centre for the safeguarding of intangible cultural heritage in South-Eastern Europe as a centre under the auspices of UNESCO (category 2);
- 5. <u>Authorizes</u> the Director-General to sign the Agreement between UNESCO and the Government of the Republic of Bulgaria contained in the annex to document 182 EX/20 Part VIII.

Background: In March 2009, the Government of Burkina Faso submitted a detailed proposal for the establishment of a regional centre for the living arts in Africa (CREAF) in Bobo-Dioulasso under the auspices of UNESCO. At its 182nd session the Executive Board welcomed this proposal and, in 182 EX/Decision 20 (XII), recommended that the General Conference, at its 35th session, approve the establishment of the centre by designating it as a category 2 centre and invite the Director-General to sign the corresponding agreement with the Government of Burkina Faso designating the aforementioned centre as a category 2 centre.

Purpose: Pursuant to 182 EX/Decision 20 (XII), this document contains a draft resolution recommended by the Executive Board for the approval of the establishment of a regional centre for the living arts in Africa (CREAF), under the auspices of UNESCO. For reference, document 182 EX/20 (Part XIII) describes the proposal and analyses the feasibility of the centre, which is in conformity with document 33 C/19 concerning principles and guidelines for the establishment and functioning of institutes and centres under the auspices of UNESCO (categories 1 and 2) as approved by the General Conference in 33 C/Resolution 90, and the draft agreement between UNESCO and the Government of Burkina Faso is annexed thereto.

- 1. At its 182nd session (September 2009), the Executive Board, under agenda item 20, examined Part XIII of document 182 EX/20, concerning the proposed establishment, at Bobo-Dioulasso, Burkina Faso, of a regional centre for the living arts in Africa (CREAF), as a category 2 centre under the auspices of UNESCO. Having examined document 182 EX/20 Part XIII, which described the proposals and analysed the feasibility of the centre in accordance with the guidelines set out in document 33 C/19 concerning principles and guidelines regarding the establishment and operation of institutes and centres under the auspices of UNESCO (category 2), as approved by the General Conference in 33 C/Resolution 90, the Executive Board welcomed the proposal that the centre be established under the auspices of UNESCO. It would be hosted by the Government of Burkina Faso at Bobo-Dioulasso, and enjoy the necessary functional autonomy and legal capacity for the execution of its activities. The Board recommended that the General Conference, at its 35th session, approve the establishment of the centre under the auspices of UNESCO (category 2), and invite the Director-General to sign the corresponding agreement with the Government of Burkina Faso (182 EX/Decision 20 (XII)).
- 2. In the light of the foregoing, the General Conference may wish to adopt the following draft resolution:

- 1. Recalling 33 C/Resolution 90 and 182 EX/Decision 20 (XII),
- 2. Having examined document 35 C/20 (Part XXIII),
- 3. <u>Welcomes</u> the proposed establishment by the Government of Burkina Faso of a regional centre for the living arts in Africa (CREAF) under the auspices of UNESCO, in accordance with 33 C/Resolution 90 concerning principles and guidelines regarding the establishment and operation of UNESCO institutes and centres (category 1) and institutes and centres under the auspices of UNESCO (category 2);
- 4. <u>Approves</u> the establishment, at Bobo-Dioulasso, Burkina Faso, of the regional centre for living arts in Africa (CREAF), under the auspices of UNESCO, as recommended by the Executive Board at its 182nd session (182 EX/Decision 20 (XII));
- 5. <u>Invites</u> the Director-General to sign the corresponding agreement between UNESCO and the Government of Burkina Faso, annexed to document 182 EX/20 (Part XIII).
