The property had **no buffer zone** at the time of its inscription on the World Heritage List

The buffer zone in the rural parts of the Site, is mapped as a visual envelope, agreed by the Local Authorities and extending between 1 and 3 km from the Site, depending on the topography. The whole buffer zone shall be determined in details in the Management plan.

4.2. Protective Measures

In the last years, the Government has intensified its activities in relation to the improvement of the legislation for this property, with the adoption of, i.e. Law on Managing the World Natural and Cultural Heritage in the Ohrid region; Law on declaring

the old city core of Ohrid for cultural heritage of great importance.

4.2.2 - Is the legal framework (i.e. legislation and / or regulation) adequate for maintaining the Outstanding Universal Value including conditions of Integrity and / or Authenticity of the property?

An adequate legal framework for the maintenance of the Outstanding Universal Value including conditions of Authenticity and / or Integrity of the World Heritage property exists but there are **some deficiencies in implementation**

The property had **no buffer zone at the time of inscription** on the World Heritage List
