





## 1 – 11 September 2011 WHV – Aného- Glidji

WH Tentative List - Agglomération Aného-Glidji, Togo

To meet the goal of encouraging the communities of Aneho and Glidji to preserve the remains and the cultural authentic practices of Guin people, the site was cleaned, 250 brochures was distributed. In these processes local youths were engaged. Volunteers visited 2 traditional Guin places. There, they planted more than 250 trees to reforest the area. Informative meetings and interviews were organized to sensitize the main stakeholders such as state and local officials on WH importance and need for preservation.

Volunteer visited residents of area door-to-door and to inform them about WH. As a result, volunteers were able to communicate with local people in personal level. This provided opportunities for volunteers and local residents to freely share their opinions about the heritage in Togo. Some residents posed questions directly to volunteers.
