It is not only important to promote intra-African collaboration in higher education and research, it also paves the way towards a better articulated, transparent and harmonized world higher education area, by putting in place an innovative global convention on mutual recognition of qualifications.

Meanwhile, as vice-minister of education of China, I would also like to seize this opportunity to express our firm commitment to support the development of quality higher education in Africa, as a potent pathway to achieve the MDG goals and to rejuvenate this charming continent.
