## Call for nominations: UNESCO-IPDC Prize for Rural Communication

Sir/Madam,

On behalf of the Director-General, I am pleased to invite you to submit nominations for the UNESCO-IPDC Prize for Rural Communication, which will be awarded for the twelfth time during the twenty-eighth session of the Intergovernmental Council of the International Programme for the Development of Communication (IPDC). The meeting will take place at UNESCO Headquarters in Paris (France) from 21 to 23 March 2012.

The purpose of the UNESCO-IPDC Prize for Rural Communication is to draw attention to particularly meritorious and innovative activities undertaken by public or private institutions, or by persons or groups of persons working on a personal basis or as staff members of such institutions, with a view to improving communication in all its forms. Particular consideration is given to local newspapers, radio and television programmes, printing equipment and films in rural communities, primarily in developing countries.

Awarded every two years, the Prize consists of a sum of **US\$20,000.00** and a diploma.

Nominations shall be submitted to the Director-General by the governments of UNESCO's Member States in consultation with their National Commissions for UNESCO, or by non-governmental organizations maintaining official relations with UNESCO<sup>1</sup>.

The nomination shall be accompanied by a written recommendation by the governments of UNESCO's Member States in consultation with their National Commissions for UNESCO, or by non-governmental organizations maintaining official relations with UNESCO, which shall include, in English or French, *inter alia*:

- (i) description of the candidate's background and achievements;
- (ii) summary of the work or the results of the work, publications and other supporting documents of major importance; and
- (iii) description of the candidate's contribution to the Prize's objectives.

The candidature should be submitted using the attached form accompanied by any supporting documentation, including reports, brochures, photographs, video and/or audio on the work carried out by the candidate.

The Prize winner(s) shall be selected by the Director-General of UNESCO on the basis of assessments and recommendations made by the Jury of the Prize, which is composed of the eight members of the Bureau of the Intergovernmental Council of the IPDC.

The submission should be sent <u>by post</u> and <u>by e-mail</u> by **30 September 2011** at the latest to the Secretariat of The Prize at the following address and e-mail:
