How did the idea emerge?

- Idea of capacity building of adult educators has been highlighted in CONFINTEA, Belem Framework of Action and ASEM Network on Professionalization of Adult Education and several other forums.
- It is a mandate of ALADIN
- It was reiterated when UIL sponsored a Country Study on ALADIN in 2004.
- It was discussed and ratified in a National Workshop held in 2005 (Cosponsored by UIL) in which 45 organizations participated.

PALDIN 4.

The need for a capacity building programme?

- Limitations of existing training programmes
- > Inadequacy of Diploma/Certificate courses
- Limited availability of professional manpower

Why PALDIN?

- Indian study noted four different types of ALADIN organizations with four categories of personnel with a variety of job specifications not possessed by many.
- Small organizations with one or two staff had limited expertise and were greatly handicapped.
- The challenge was -how to equip the staff with all the requisite expertise through a comprehensive program of short duration.

WHY -Open Distance learning mode?

- Large numbers & geographically scattered personnel.
- 200 potential ALADIN members.
- 600 District Adult Education Coordinators
- 200,000---300,000 Field Coordinators

How did we design the curriculum?

- Survey of existing courses
- Need Assessment survey –structured Questionnaire
- Focused Group Discussion
- Sharing of experiences -International Workshop (March 2006)
- Preparation of a Curriculum Framework

Main suggestions of stakeholders

- The majority preferred short duration program of 4-6 months.
- Maximum study hours-two per day.
- Mode of learning-75% preferred ODL format with a contact session in the beginning.
- IV. Only 10% opted for E-learning;

- 3. Provide learners with opportunities to apply what they have learned in each unit so that they can reflect on their new learning and apply it in their day-to-day work situations.

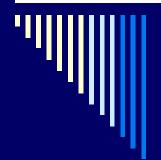
