

## Chan Chan Archaeological Zone, Peru

Cultural site inscribed in 1986 (List in Danger)

The Chimu Kingdom, with Chan Chan as its capital, reached its apogee in the 15<sup>th</sup> century, not long before falling to the Incas. The planning of this huge city, the largest in pre-Columbian America, reflects a strict political and social strategy, marked by the city's division into nine 'citadels' or 'palaces' forming autonomous units.
