2. Purpose and main lines of the meeting

The congress is focused on the theme "How to use drama, theatre, dance, music and visual arts in young people's education in collaboration with refugees and immigrants." The aim is especially to find new ways to benefit and learn from the peaceful coexistence with the different artistic and cultural backgrounds and knowledge that are presented by refugees and immigrants in European countries, USA and Canada.

The presenters of the congress will share their experiences and cases to all participants and work then also in small groups developing their ideas together with colleagues of other art forms as well as from other countries.

Arts play the most valuable and effective role in the education, when handling such important, but non-measurable elements of life as love, fear, friendship, desire, dreams etc.

The arts are also by nature focused on differences and different ways to experience this world and its phenomenon, and therefor they are also one of the best way for peace education and to learn self-confidence and social skills.

In this ARTS IN EDUCATION -congress 2003 the experienced teachers of different arts will gather together their experiences, increase and deepen the integration and publish the results afterwards to the benefit of education in Europe, USA and Canada.

An important working session for all participants is also the planning of the UNESCO World Congress - ARTS IN EDUCATION 2005.

3. Participants and target group

Arts in education -experts of Europe, USA and Canada.

The target group will be those, who are grass root art educators as well as those in charge of the training of teachers of different arts. The aim is to get a good presentation of different art forms and different countries.

Approximately 60 participants altogether, including specialist observers from Africa, Asia and Latin America.

DREAM GROUPS will develop in their brain storm all the fantastic and positive ideas and visions that arise from the presentations and share them to all participants.

NIGHTMARE GROUPS will put on words and make visible all possible negative responses and visions that might arise from the presentations, and share them to all participants.

The aim of the group work (1 - 8) is to plan good strategies, how to develop ideas of the presenters for the teaching of arts in different school levels. How to promote understanding and finding of new ways for the peaceful co-operation with pupils, who belong to majorities and/or minorities in their communities.

The official language of the meeting is English.
