Executive Summary

Disclaimer: The objective of the Executive Summary is to highlight the key salient issues and not to provide a comprehensive coverage of all topics discussed in the report.

Media and Major Events

January was a particularly quiet month for UNESCO in terms of media coverage. The story that attracted most media interest was the statement calling on Italian authorities to limit the number of cruise ships entering the Venice Lagoon, and approaching other fragile heritage sites in coastal areas. This was followed by the furor sparked in Austria over the decision by the Austrian National Commission to remove Viennese Balls from a national list of elements proposed for inclusion on the Intangible Heritage Register. This story was reported in all regions of the world. Also widely reported was the move, led by the US and UK delegations, to have Syria removed from UNESCO's CRE and NGO Committees. Most coverage of this story occurred in the United States.

Of the events directly organized by UNESCO during the month, the most successful in terms of media coverage was the nomination of Óscar Tabárez as a UNESCO Champion for Sport, which received exhaustive coverage across Latin America and in Hispanophone elsewhere.

Our monitoring of the media for January also showed that North America accounted for the greatest number of articles published in which UNESCO was referenced. Some 2,542 articles were monitored in North America over the month, compared to 2,510 in Europe and 2,496 in Asia. These figures indicate the relatively high interest of the North American media in the Organization (see graph to the right.)






UNESCO Website

January saw solid and increasing traffic. The main highlight was the concert for the 40th anniversary of the World Heritage Convention and Óscar Tabárez's nomination on 30 January, which respectively drew traffic from Jazz to heritage communities and the Latin American audience. Natural Science's efforts on web editorial and news paid off in January with a strong increase in traffic.

UNESCO Social Media Channels

In 2011 UNESCO saw dramatic growth in its social media presence, especially in Facebook and YouTube where it was among the top gainers in the UN. In the second half of the year the Twitter messaging got refocused from institutional language to advocacy, almost doubling weekly growth to 800.

The new year kicked off with new initiatives, such as UNESCO's first ever podcast (through Soundcloud) and Skype interview recordings. For the 24 January UNESCO Future Forum "The Arab spring-1 year later-Egyptian Perspectives" UNESCO broke new ground and allowed the online public to send live questions via Twitter. The strong response resulted in 200+ new followers in less than 48 hours on the Arabic channel. In the coming months more such participatory activities are planned.

The Fotopedia/Heritage "app" for iPhone/iPad has been particularly successful this month with an increase of downloads by almost 130%, mainly due to a website's special offer to get free 'apps'. Referred visits to us and page views increased by over 60% (see 2nd graph to the right).


UNESCO Publications


After the holiday-period dip in consultation of PDFs on UNESCO's web site the overall picture shows a sharp upturn and compares well with January 2011 (an increase of over 3,000 views). But this is still much lower that the October 2011 best (see graph to the right). The number of consultations of publications on Google Books is slightly lower than in December 2011 but still a vast improvement on January 2011. Education (including UIS publications) dominates the top 10 downloads but mainly older titles.


For sales of publications World Heritage titles continue to perform well in the bookshop while earth sciences have had some success on-line.


UNESCO Visits

The number of visitors has been maintained at the high level of December 2011. It has more than doubled with respect to January 2011.









Major events:

I. Teaching Respect for All - Launch of the project (18 January 2012)

The "Teaching Respect for All" project, born of cooperation between UNESCO, the United States and Brazil, was launched on 18 January at UNESCO Headquarters in the presence of the Director-General, the Assistant Secretary of State for International Organization Affairs, Department of State, Esther Brimmer, and Executive Secretary of the Secretariat on Policies of Promotion of Racial Equality in Brazil, Mário Theodoro Lisbôa. This event brought together government representatives, experts and practitioners from different parts of the world.

Students in Bagunçaço Youth Centre, Salvador, Brazil and Tallwood High School, Virginia Beach, US, took also part in the event via videoconference which allowed them to interact with the Director-General and speakers. Chris Plutte, Executive Director of the Global Nomads Group, moderated.

Building respect in and through education was the focus of the second part of the event. Moderated by Maria Aparecida da Silva Bento of the Research Centre on Laboor Relations and Inequality in Brazil, panelists from different areas of expertise presented multiple approaches to address racism and discrimination and foster respect. Panelists were Anwar Kemal, Chairperson, Committee on the Elimination of Racial Discrimination (CERD), Sgt. Susan Westenberger, Youth Education Team, Calgary Police Service, Dr. Peter Kirchschlaeger, Co-Director, Centre of Human Rights Education (ZMRB), Dennis Sinyolo, Senior Coordinator, Education International, and Mutlu Ergün, author, researcher and performer, "Edutainmnet Attacke!". During the discussion, the important role of municipality and community-level actors in education was stressed. Sgt. Susan Westenberger shared her experiences as a member of the Police Service who has been working closely with schools to counter hatred and discrimination.

Press coverage:

Press coverage of this event was limited mainly to online Brazilian media. Some online Armenian media also published articles on the story.

Social media: Information about the "Teaching Respect for All" project was received too late to launch a proper social media campaign that would have maximized the project's full potential. More could have been done if the information had been communicated to all relevant parties, at least one full month ahead of the planned launch date.

- Twitter: Live tweet of US Assistant Secretary of State Esther Brimmer and Brazil Minister Mario Theodoro's respective speeches at UNESCO: 10 tweets, carefully coordinated with the US State Department, privileging the use of hashtag #dignity4all in a cross-promotional scheme that resulted in an estimated 831 conversations about the educational initiative on Jan 17. The secondary hashtag #respect4all generated 97 conversations that same day. Although the Education team working on this project wanted to push #respect4all, ERI decided it was in the campaign's best interests, at least at this inaugural stage, to be affiliated with #dignity4all, a hashtag that the US State Dept regularly uses for select projects and that notably has been a top Twitter trending topic. As numbers demonstrate, #Dignity4all has the advantage of allowing significantly more users to discover this UNESCO initiative, and also inscribing UNESCO's work within an established, ongoing discussion about the values that unite our organization with the USA. + Brasilia Office: 13 tweets, 124 retweets
- Facebook: Poll: "What forms of discrimination are NOT sufficiently taught in schools?" received 80 votes, with approximately ½ of voters saying that schools aren't doing enough to combat biases against other countries. Link to Esther Brimmer's speech was posted and resulted in 121 likes, with 109 likes for the video. Brasilia Office: 3 posts, 23 likes, 1014 people reached, 20 shares. Interview to CBN posted on Twitter and Facebook, resulted in 13 likes, 11 shares and 385 people reached.

II. International Day of Commemoration in Memory of Victims of the Holocaust (27 January)

On the occasion of the International Day of Commemoration in Memory of Victims of the Holocaust, UNESCO organized a series of educational and commemorative events from 23 to 31 January 2012.

This week of activities started on 23 January with a video-conference with the BREDA to discuss educational challenges related to the teaching of the history of the Holocaust and genocides. BREDA welcomed 40 participants, including representatives of civil society and ministries of education of Burundi, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Rwanda and Senegal around a conference given by French historian Georges Bensoussan, representing the Shoah Memorial in Paris. The session was moderated by the Minister of Education of Senegal, Mr. Kalidou Diallo and explored how to deal in the context of countries covered by the BREDA with the history of the Holocaust and other genocides that occurred in the XXth century. On this occasion, BREDA presented an exhibition of the Shoah Memorial entitled "The Holocaust in Europe".

On 27 January, the Director-General appointed officially at Headquarters, Dr Samuel Pisar, Honorary Ambassador, Special Envoy for Holocaust Education. Mr Pisar is a Holocaust survivor, a writer and an eminent international lawyer and will support UNESCO's programme on education for Holocaust remembrance. The designation ceremony was followed by a visit led by Irina Bokova and Ms. Katalin Bogyay, with UNESCO officials and Ambassadors representing regional groups, at the Shoah Memorial, Museum, Centre for Contemporary Jewish Documentation in Paris, where they had the opportunity to meet with a group of children attending an educational workshop and to lay a wreath in memory of Jewish victims of Nazism (see also page 6).

The conference on 31 January on the theme "International Dimensions of Holocaust Education" explored the challenges of education on the Holocaust in a globalized world, and its role in the promotion of Human Rights and in the prevention of genocide and mass atrocities. The conference was introduced by historian Yehuda Bauer, Professor at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, at Yad Vashem, and a member of the Academy of Sciences of Israel, and included historians, political scientists, lawyers and diplomats from France, Israel, Argentina, Rwanda, the Netherlands and the United States. It ended with a discussion between Dr. Samuel Pisar and Ambassador Hannah Rosenthal, US Special Envoy to Monitor and Combat Antisemitism.

The day ended with a ceremony in remembrance of the victims of the Holocaust, focusing on the fate of Jewish children during World War Two. It featured music, a short film presenting letters of hidden children by Robert Bober, speeches by the Director-General, the President of the Shoah Memorial, Eric de Rothschild, the French Minister for European Affairs, Mr. Jean Leonetti, and Professor Yehuda Bauer. Henri Borlant, one of the rare children who survived the Holocaust, deported from France to Auschwitz-Birkenau in 1942 at the age of 15 years-old, gave a testimony. UNESCO presented on this occasion an exhibition on "The Righteous of France", in partnership with the Shoah Memorial.

Press coverage:

Press were informed of the event, but none were accredited to cover it and coverage was negligible.

Social media: Social media actions focused on communicating on two of UNESCO's unique contributions to Holocaust Remembrance, via Memory of the World Inscriptions (Anne Frank's Diary and Ringelblum Archives) and World Heritage Site Auschwitz. The advantage is that the organizations in charge of these items have social media sites, and an incentive to promote their association with UNESCO through them. The Anne Frank House provided exclusive photos and a sound file of Anne Frank's father speaking about discovering the diary. This podcast quickly became one of our most viral content (3% according to Facebook Insights, as opposed to our average 1%), cumulating 224 likes within days of its publication. The E. Ringelblum Archives also provided photos, which performed moderately well with 84 likes but the podcast that was supposed to be the centerpiece of our social media campaign arrived only in early February. All materials will enrich the Memory of the World Archives listings. By contrast, Auschwitz seemed uninterested in collaboration even outside the context of Jan 27. The Memorial of the Shoah (which the DG visited on Jan 31) claimed that it was too busy around this time.

Brasilia office translated and used HQ posts: 9 tweets and 1 post resulted respectively in 100 retweets, and 27 likes, 392 people reached, 14 shares.

Other social media actions include the recording of an iTunes university interview with 3 Holocaust historians, including the eminent Yehuda Bauer.

III. Dr Samuel Pisar, UNESCO Honorary Ambassador, Special Envoy for Holocaust Education – Designation Ceremony (27 January 2012)

On the occasion of the International Day of Commemoration in Memory of the Victims of the Holocaust, which took place at UNESCO HQ on 27 January, UNESCO Director-General, Irina Bokova designated the writer, lawyer and holocaust survivor, Dr Samuel Pisar, as Honorary Ambassador and Special Envoy for Holocaust Education.

This designation came "in recognition of his fight against anti-semitism, racism, intolerance and all forms of discrimination, his indispensable support for the teaching, the memory and research on Holocaust, his unwavering dedication for the mutual understanding between peoples, and his commitment to the ideals of the Organization".

The designation of Dr Pisar is part of UNESCO's ongoing efforts to promote Holocaust awareness and fight against all forms of Holocaust denial. It also recognizes the tremendous work that Samuel Pisar has accomplished in this area throughout his life.

After the designation ceremony, Samuel Pisar and Irina Bokova visited the Shoah Memorial in Paris, UNESCO's partner-organization in Holocaust-related activities, to lay wreaths in memory of the Holocaust victims.

Dr Samuel Pisar's first action as Special Envoy for Holocaust Education was to speak at the UNESCO symposium entitled "International Dimensions of Holocaust Education", which was held on 31 January last, to explore the relevance of Holocaust education in a globalized world.

IV. Opening Ceremony of the 40th anniversary celebrations of the World Heritage Convention (30 January 2012)

UNESCO Director-General, Irina Bokova, launched the 40th anniversary celebrations of the World Heritage Convention in a ceremony at UNESCO Headquarters on 30 January. It was the first of a series of events States Parties to the 1972 Convention are organizing round the world over the coming year, and ending with a final event in November 2012 in Kyoto, Japan.

The launch featured an acoustic concert by jazz legend and UNESCO Goodwill Ambassador Herbie Hancock, with performances by Corinne Bailey Rae, Esperanza Spalding, Manu Katché and Stephen Brown. An original song composed by Esperanza Spalding, "Pyramid", to celebrate World Heritage was performed for the first time during the concert.

Successes and challenges in implementing the World Heritage Convention were also showcased through audiovisual presentations during the event, which was supported by Panasonic, Jaeger-LeCoultre and Citibank. Speaking of World Heritage, the Director-General described the early 70s' idea of the international sharing responsibility and expertise at the service of safeguarding the natural and cultural heritage of humanity as "a dream" and said it has turned into a "beautiful adventure".

Before his performance, Herbie Hancock spoke of his commitment to World Heritage and his desire to have a positive impact in his role as Goodwill Ambassador for Intercultural Dialogue.

The Salle des Actes was used as a VIP reception room before the concert. VIPs included the CEO of Air France, the Panasonic CEO for France, and several UNESCO Goodwill Ambassadors and Artists for Peace.

There was also a cocktail for 400 persons on the 7th floor after the concert, with the artists present, and brief speeches by the Director General, the Chair of the World Heritage Committee, the Ambassadors of the United States and Japan, and the Chair of the General Conference.

Press coverage:

The main launch event was closed to the public, which significantly affected media coverage. A few stories were published, based mainly on the press release issued about the anniversary.

Social media:

Social media's unique contribution to the opening ceremony is a <u>video interview with Herbie Hancock</u>, featured on the UNESCO.org homepage from Jan 30 to Feb 2. It is UNESCO's 1st ever use of Skype for an official interview.

Given that this was an internal event, social media communications focused not on the ceremony but on the WHC's 40th anniversary. A photo of our 1960 Abu Simbel campaign raked in 214 likes within 48 hours; video footage, shown during the ceremony, of the challenges and triumphs of the WHC over the years was also posted on Facebook where it garnered 99 likes. Tweets driving followers to this multimedia were retweeted 20 times on average.

V. Óscar Washington Tabárez UNESCO Champion for Sport – Designation Ceremony (30 January 2012)

Mr Óscar Washington Tabárez, the Uruguayan national football team manager, was designated UNESCO Champion for Sport by the Director-General, during a ceremony at UNESCO Headquarters on 30 January 2012.

This designation came "in recognition of his commitment to promote education and sport programmes for vulnerable children in Uruguay, his charitable activities in the framework of the Tabárez Project, and his dedication to the ideals and aims of the Organization." Diego Lugano, captain of the Uruguayan national team and defender of the Paris Saint-Germain football team also attended this ceremony.

Known as "El Maestro", Óscar Washington Tabárez, was born in Montevideo in 1947. He began his career in football with the Montevideo Football Club (Institución Atlética Sud América) in 1967 and, after qualifying as a teacher, combined careers in teaching and football.

Working in primary schools in poor neighbourhoods, he also contributed to literacy training for adults and education for the visually handicapped. In Uruguay, Tabárez works with programmes such as Sport for Peace and Development and Sport for All, which use sport to favour the inclusion of the under-privileged.

After playing for five Uruguayan and one Mexican team, Tabárez, became a professional coach. His trophies as national football manager include the 2011 Copa América, won by Uruguay and the country's fourth place in the 2010 World Cup (South Africa). He has also coached teams in Colombia (Dportivo Cali), Argentina (Vélez Sarsfield and Boca Juniors), Spain (Oviedo) and Italy (Cagliari and AC Milan).

Press coverage:

This one the only event organized at Headquarters during the month which attracted significant attention from the media. The nomination of Mr Tabárez was exhaustively covered by leading newspapers and online news sites across Latin and Central America and in leading Spanish language media elsewhere. In Uruguay, the nomination was published on the front page of the four main newspapers. Background footage (B-roll) from UNESCO audiovisual section was used by 5 Uruguayan TV channels in prime time.

Official designations being not really likely to interest UNESCO social media followers, impact may be optimized by liaising with the designees' communications managers, well in advance of the event, to establish a cross-promotional scheme and help spread UNESCO's message.

UNESCO publishes a wide array of web content. Although the majority is today available primarily in English and French, content is increasingly available in the six official languages of the Organization, as well as in certain subportals in Portuguese, Vietnamese, and others. Today over 5.68 million unesco.org pages (many of course database driven) are referenced by Google.

UNESCO's website traffic is measured today through tags embedded in pages. With these, **page views**, **visits**, and **visitors** are tracked. It must be noted that the totals do not cover all UNESCO traffic as **not all content is yet tagged**, and some UNESCO content is currently published in non unesco.org sites (eg Google docs, Facebook, Twitter, certain institute and field office websites, etc.). Thus traffic totals may be lower than in reality. Certain other statistics, such as publication downloads (which are measured through our UNESDOC tool) may be far too high since we can only currently measure hits on a document rather than successful downloads.

Traffic indicators explained:

Page views: The page view is the most widely used indicator to reflect the level of traffic to a website. A page view is counted when the page requested by the user is loaded into the internet browser. Note: Page views are very different from the outdated concept of 'hits'. A 'hit' is counted for each of the many elements in a Web page (i.e. image, animation or video are all counted as separate 'hits', while a page view counts all elements on a page as one page view).

Visits: A visit is defined as a series of page requests from the same uniquely identified client with a time of no more than 30 minutes between each page request.

Visitors: A Visitor counts once within the timescale of 30 minutes. A visitor can make multiple visits. Identification is made to the visitor's computer, not the person, usually via cookie and/or IP+User Agent. Thus the same person visiting from two different computers will count as two Visitors.


New statistics via Google Analytics:

In September 2011, UNESCO began using new traffic analysis tools to provide more accurate, detailed, and user friendly statistics, at a lower cost. In the coming months, new features, such as heat maps and further developed statistics will be provided.

All pages in the main web content management system are now being tracked, but many older legacy, field offices, and specialized programme pages are not yet tracked. As a result new statistics should not be comparatively viewed against prior months.

1.4 Geographical origin of visits in January 2012









The highest peak in coverage during January (24/25) is due to the call by UNESCO for restrictions on cruise ship traffic in the Venice lagoon and other sensitive coastal sites on the World Heritage List. The peak around 19/20 January is due to a story from Austria concerning the National Commission's decision to withdraw Viennese Balls from the national list of intangible heritage that could be proposed for UNESCO listing, following concerns about connections of some of these events with extremist groups.



3. UNESCO's Social Media Channels

In 2011 UNESCO saw dramatic growth in its social media presence, especially in Facebook and YouTube where it was among the top gainers in the UN. In the second half of the year the Twitter messaging got refocused from institutional language to advocacy, almost doubling weekly growth to 800.

The new year kicked off with new initiatives, such as UNESCO's first ever podcast (through Soundcloud) and Skype interview recordings. For the 24 January UNESCO Future Forum "The Arab spring-1 year later-Egyptian Perspectives" UNESCO broke new ground and allowed the online public to send live questions via Twitter. The strong response resulted in 200+ new followers in less than 48 hours on the Arabic channel. In the coming months more such participatory activities are planned.

The Fotopedia/Heritage "app" for iPhone/iPad has been particularly successful this month with an increase of downloads by almost 130%, mainly due to a website's special offer to get free 'apps'. Referred visits to us and page views increased by over 60%.

Separate photobanks in the sectors are not tracked but also get significant downloads.

The **UNESDOC** database – managed by MSS/BKI Clearing House - contains the full text and bibliographic records of documents and publications published by UNESCO since 1945 as well as bibliographic records of library acquisitions. These documents and publications are produced by UNESCO Headquarters, UNESCO Offices and Institutes and cover all areas of its activities: education, natural sciences, social and human sciences, culture, communication and information. An application has been specially developed for conducting the statistical consultation of electronic files (PDFs) from 1 January 2006.


In January there were **130 872** (130 784 in December) records available online in PDF format, including documents, publications, communication material and other working documents.




The UNESCO Library collections offer an overview of the Organization's current and past activities and programmes as recorded in print publications and other resources.


'UNESCO publications' cover the output of the programmes of the Organization and feature in the biennial Publications Plan. They are produced in a variety of formats (books, CD-ROMs, ebooks, etc.) and are classified into different categories (global and regional reports, monographs, reviews, technical studies, atlases, etc.). They are distributed for free via UNESCO's networks and on-line, or as sales products under the 'UNESCO Publishing' imprint.

After the holiday-period dip in consultation of PDFs on UNESCO's web site the overall picture shows a sharp upturn and compares well with January 2011 (an increase of over 3,000 views). But this is still much lower that the October 2011 best. The number of consultations of publications on Google Books is slightly lower than in December 2011 but still a vast improvement on January 2011. Education (including UIS publications) dominates the top 10 downloads but mainly older titles.

For sales of publications World Heritage titles continue to perform well in the bookshop while earth sciences have had some success on-line.



Since 1948, *The Courier* is the UNESCO flagship periodical. The magazine has changed a great deal over the years, both in content and in form, but it pursues its original mission: promote UNESCO's ideals, maintain a platform for the dialogue between cultures and provide a forum for international debate.

Presently, it is a quarterly 56 pages magazine published in the 6 official languages. The PDF is available on *The UNESCO Courier* website, and sent by e-mail to the subscribers. The printed version is sent to the Member States/Partners mailing list.

Due to the present financial restrictions, no new issue has been programmed for publication. Several new articles have been added to the UNESCO Courier website, but only in French.

As a result of the absence of new issue since November 2011, the number of new subscribers has dramatically decreased in January 2012:

September 2011: 713 new subscribers (new issue released: How Youth Drive Change)

October 2011: 508 new subscribers

November 2011: 664 (new issue released: Humanism: a new idea)

December 2011: **447** new subscribers January 2012: **273** new subscribers

This month, the Spanish edition has the highest number of new subscribers: 103.





10.1. Patronage

Patronage is UNESCO's most prestigious form of moral support. It is granted to demonstrate UNESCO's endorsement of an activity organized under the responsibility of an external organization. UNESCO's patronage is granted to a range of activities, such as cinematographic and audiovisual productions, publications, meetings, conferences and cultural performances, award ceremonies, as well as a range of other events of regional and international scale. Information on patronage requests and their follow-up is recorded in a central database managed by ERI/DPI/PBM. The database is updated daily and shared with the focal points for UNESCO name and logo use of each Sector.
