Executive Summary

Disclaimer: The objective of the Executive Summary is to highlight salient issues and not to provide a comprehensive coverage of all topics discussed in the report.

Media and Major Events

World Press Freedom Day received excellent coverage this year, with almost 5,000 articles devoted to the subject monitored across all regions, including numerous reports and editorials in national media looking at press freedom in their countries.

The Global Education for All meeting, held in Oman, also generated reasonable press coverage, mostly in the Arab region.

Although a number of interviews were done on UNESCO's meeting on safeguarding Syria's cultural heritage, notably with Al Jazeera and Le Monde, this story did not generate widespread coverage. This was largely due to the fact that the meeting was closed to media, and the lack of any major news announcement.

UNESCO was referenced in many of the thousands of reports on the abduction of the Nigerian schoolgirls. The Director-General's statement on this topic was quoted widely in Latin American media, while UNESCO's statistics on girls' education were cited in many other stories in several regions.

Stories on the 2014 World Heritage Committee meeting began making headlines during the month of May, following the publication of documents for the session, indicating which sites would be recommended for listing.

Internationally, the biggest World Heritage story, concerned Australia, with headlines on a possible danger listing for the Great Barrier Reef and a controversial request from the Federal Government to change the boundaries on the Tasmanian Wilderness site. This generated a steady stream of stories in leading media in all regions throughout the month.

However, the biggest story of the month for UNESCO, came out of China, following Egypt's protests towards the end of May over the construction of a copy of the Great Sphinx. This story was picked up all over the world, with headlines announcing that Egypt had complained to UNESCO and asked the Organization to intervene with China on the issue.

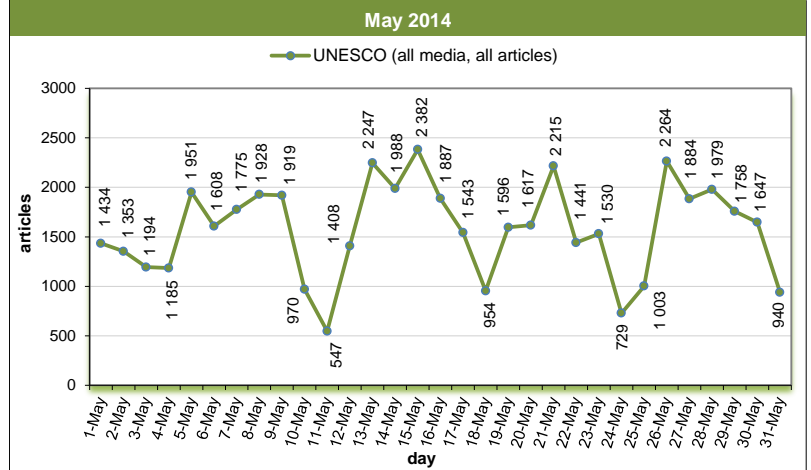

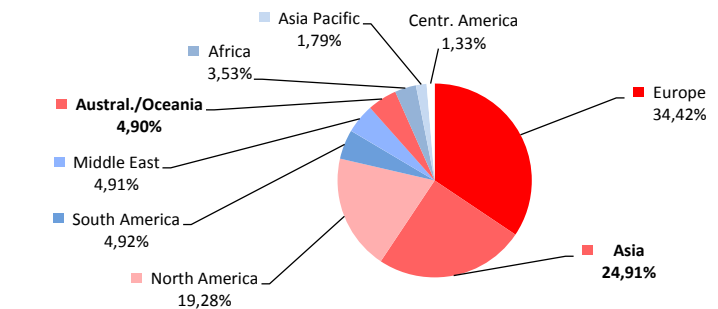

Again, almost 80% of articles were monitored in Europe, Asia and North America - Number of articles rose by 140% in Australia/Oceania

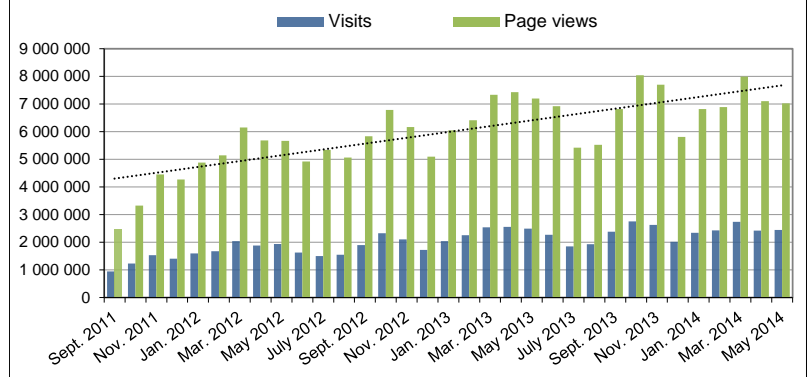


Breakdown by region of 48 876 articles monitored in all media sources mentioning "UNESCO" in May 2014

external links, and is looking at one page only. Even if some major events brought a significant number of visits, it is not enough to maintain high visibility. With the preparation for the launch of the 38th session of the World Heritage Committee, the World Heritage Center website was by far the most visited part of our website followed by Careers and the Education entry page. As expected, Unescommunity traffic suffered from the many holidays at Headquarters, resulting in a 36% drop in page views.

May was once again a strong month for UNESCO's social media channels. Our language channels all demonstrate growth, with the strongest results on Spanish and Portuguese Facebook. The month was marked by a social media campaign for World Press Freedom Day – perhaps the most innovative yet done at UNESCO. Messages about press freedom figure prominently in this month's top tweets, thanks to a Twitter partnership we negotiated directly with Twitter. UNESCO became as such the first UN agency to partner with Twitter for joint, coordinated advocacy. Twitter also offered us a promoted hashtag - #pressfreedom translated in national languages - to help raise the profile of press freedom in different country versions of Twitter.

Publications

Online viewing of UNESCO top ten publications in May has increased since April of this year (27%) and compared to May last year (8%). The two main flagship reports of UNESCO, the *EFA Global Monitoring Report 2013-2014* (in English and in Spanish) and the *World Water Development Report 5*, continue to fare extremely well in the top ten downloads. Titles in Spanish account for half of the publications in this table. Bookshop sales were largely dominated by World Heritage titles while for online and international sales the publication from the Kathmandu Office, *The Sacred Garden of Lumbini - Perceptions of Buddha's Birthplace* did the best this month.

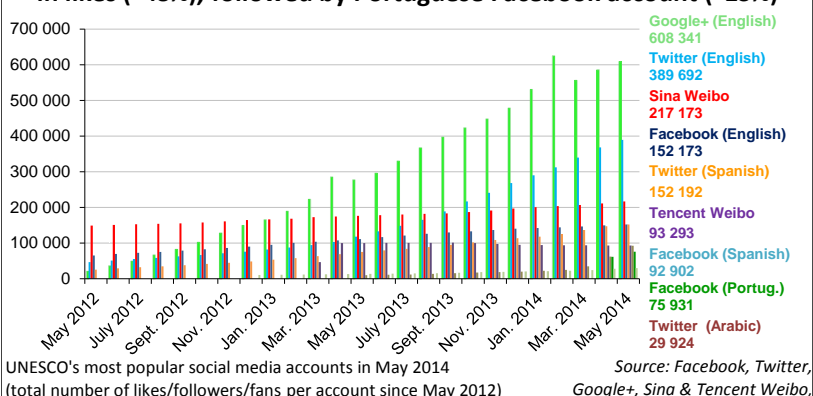
UNESCO visits

Almost 50% of visitors were High School students with an increasing share from disadvantaged neighborhoods. This desired trend is the result of contacts with school leaders in suburbs or priority education zones. The completion of the relocation of the institutional OPEN UNESCO exhibition in the Saxe wing of the building allows to welcome particularly well this public sensitive to visual presentations. E.g., a group of 112 young people was able to follow in situ a one-hour briefing with a Secretariat team on the commitment of UNESCO to peace. Another specificity of this month was the traditional European Night of Museums. Within 4 hours of evening opening 1,557 visitors came to discover our Headquarters (1,400 last year).

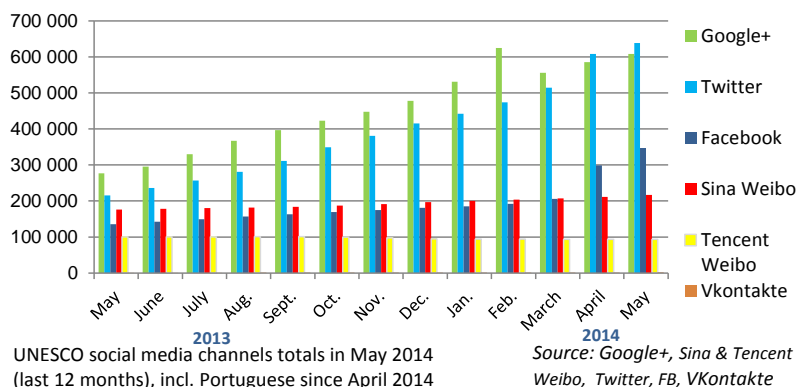

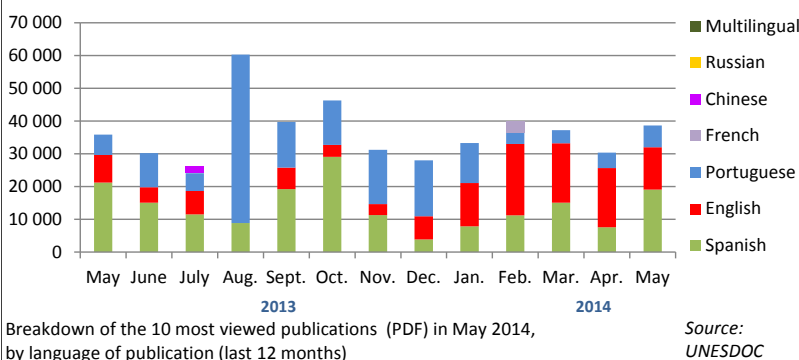

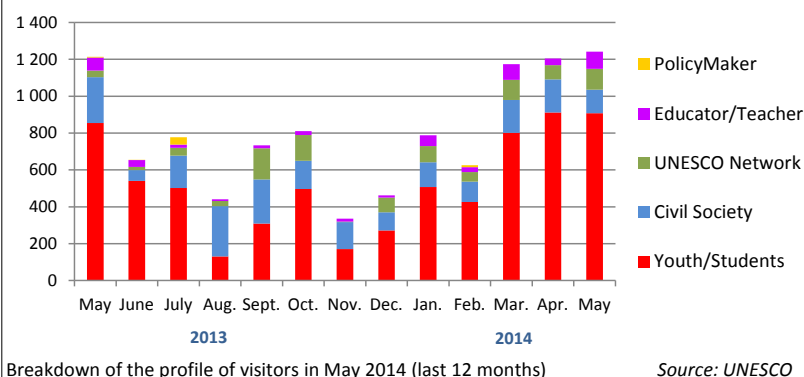

Major events:

I. UNESCO/Guillermo Cano World Press Freedom Prize 2014 (02 May) and World Press Freedom Day (03 May)

The main celebration of the World Press Freedom Day (WPDF) took place at UNESCO Headquarters from 5 to 6 May 2014. The event was organized by UNESCO and included an international conference entitled "Media Freedom for a Better Future: Shaping the Post-2015 Development Agenda". On 6 May, the participants of WPDF, including media professionals and non-governmental civil rights organizations, adopted the Paris Declaration. The Paris Declaration was submitted to UN Secretary-General, Ban Ki-moon as one of UNESCO's contribution to the post-2015 sustainable development debate.



The UNESCO/Guillermo Cano World Press Freedom Prize ceremony took place on 2 May, prior to the international conference at UNESCO Headquarters. UNESCO Director-General, Irina Bokova presented the award to journalist, writer, and photographer Mr Ahmet Şık from Turkey. The media coverage, nationally and internationally (both print and electronic media) during the events gave UNESCO a high visibility. Globally, more than 100 events took place around the world.

Participants: The WPDF brought together more than 400 participants from 86 nationalities. 47 percent of the participants were women. There were 68 speakers in nine sessions, 30 of them were women. UNESCO partnered with 31 organizations during this WPDF event. UNESCO/Guillermo Cano WPF Prize 2014 ceremony: 130 participants.

Audience: The conference was opened to all and included media practitioners, academia, NGOs, IGOs, UN Agencies, and Members States. VIPs included Mr Rémy Pflimlin, President of France Télévisions, Mr Mostefa Souag, Acting Managing Director, Al Jazeera Media Network, Qatar, Ms Catalina Botero, Special Rapporteur for Freedom of Expression, Inter-American Commission on Human Rights, OAS, Ms Dunja Mijatović, Representative on Freedom of the Media, OSCE, Mr Frank La Rue, UN Special Rapporteur on the Promotion and Protection of the Right to Freedom of Opinion and Expression and Ms Ana Maria Busquets de Cano of the Guillermo Cano Foundation.

UNESCO partnered with France Medias Monde group in airing two live broadcasts ([7 milliards de voisins](#) and [Le débat du jour](#)) from UNESCO HQ (6 May) in conjunction with the Int'l conference and WPDF. France Médias Monde, in charge of French int'l broadcasting services, comprises the trilingual news channel France 24, the international radio station RFI and the Arabic-language radio station Monte Carlo Doualiya. From Paris, they broadcast to the world in 14 languages. Every week, France 24 boasts an average audience of 41.7 million viewers, RFI 34.5 million listeners and Monte Carlo Doualiya 6.7 million listeners. All up some 4,733 articles were monitored in the world media on the Day. Many of these stories mentioned the awarding of the World Press Freedom Prize (although not as many as in previous years). This year, many media focused on the situation of press freedom in their countries, with editorials and analysis of national situations.

Social media: WPDF 2014 saw one of UNESCO's most innovative social media campaigns ever. To promote freedom of expression & press freedom, UNESCO became the first UN agency to partner with Twitter in a Twitter campaign. As a result, messages about press freedom figure prominently in this month's top tweets, as well as Facebook posts. [Twitter blogged its thoughts on World Press Freedom Day](#)

As in past years, WPDF was a trending topic in Latin America. To raise awareness in countries where this topic would not have naturally trended, Twitter offered us a promoted hashtag - #pressfreedom translated in national languages - in countries such as the UK, United States, India, Australia and Ireland where no promoted hashtags had been purchased for the period of May 3 to May 4. This campaign could be said to be worth 200,000 USD, the price that Twitter charges for promoted hashtags.

It must be noted that this is the first time UNESCO has established working ties with a leading social media platform. More should be done to develop these ties, what a number of UN agencies have been doing for the past few years.

II. 2014 Global Education for All Meeting (12-14 May)

How close is the world to achieving Education for All? How much progress has been made since the six EFA goals were established at the World Education Forum in Dakar, Senegal, 2000? And what are the new education challenges that must be identified and included in the world's post-2015 development agenda? These were the key questions under discussion at the 2014 Global EFA Meeting held in Muscat, Oman, 12-14 May 2014.

The 2014 GEM was the last global meeting of all EFA partners before the World Education Forum which will take place from 19 to 22 May 2015 in the Republic of Korea and which will mark the target date of the Dakar EFA goals. The discussions of the GEM focussed on the actions required during the last part of the road towards 2015 and on the post-2015 education agenda. Participants also reviewed commitments taken at the 2012 GEM, debated and reflected on EFA related strategies, exchanged their experiences and agreed on joint actions for addressing education challenges in the years to come.

Over 250 participants attended the meeting, including the Prime Minister of the Democratic Republic of the Congo, 20 education ministers and vice-ministers, as well as representatives from UN agencies and Member States, intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations, academics, researchers and other stakeholders.

In their final statement, the **“Muscat Agreement”**, participants stressed that "education is a fundamental human right" which must be at the top of the global development agenda, one based on fairness and inclusion, with a particular focus on gender equality. They pledged to galvanize international support for the overarching goal to “ensure equitable and inclusive quality education and lifelong learning for all by 2030”, and to use the Muscat statement as a reference for negotiations on the post-2015 development agenda to ensure it features a strong education component.

Participants: More than 250 participants.

Audience: The Prime Minister of the Democratic Republic of Congo, 20 ministers and vice-ministers mostly of national education ministries, representatives from UN agencies and Member States, intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations, academics, researchers and other stakeholders.

Press coverage: Most of the coverage for this event came from Oman and other media in the Arab countries, as well as media accompanying some of the participating ministers, including the Prime Minister of the Democratic Republic of the Congo. The Omani news agency filed several reports daily from the meeting, and this was the main source of news for most of the published stories.

Social media: The messages performed relatively well (up to 60 RT), for a meeting that was of a highly technical nature. Traffic was driven to the web stories summarizing the event's conclusions – namely the proposed new goals of the post 2015 agenda.

III. International Expert Meeting: Rallying the International Community to Safeguard Syria's Cultural Heritage (26-28 May)

In the framework of the 'Emergency Safeguarding of the Syrian Cultural Heritage' project funded by the European Union, UNESCO organized an International experts meeting at its Headquarters from 26 to 28 May 2014, with the support of the Flemish Government. The aim of the meeting was to rally the international community to safeguard Syria's inestimable cultural heritage which has been affected by the conflict with the destruction of its most important monuments, the looting and destruction of its movable cultural heritage and the rupture in the practice and transmission of its intangible heritage.



After plenary presentations, the participants were divided into three workshops on built, movable and intangible heritage. The two-days meeting with the experts was followed on 28 May by an information session to State Parties and a press conference.

The Meeting achieved the key result of building stronger alliances by gathering the entire community of experts dealing with the matter around a common goal: safeguarding of Syria's heritage, regardless of any political or ideological consideration.

The meeting provided suggestions for the implementation of the Action Plan adopted in August 2013 and allowed significant progress regarding this Action Plan as it set the basis of international cooperation. The experts insisted on the importance of regular monitoring of the damages, better exchanging information and comprehensive mapping of on-going activities and expertise to plan the recovery phase. In this regard, they agreed that UNESCO Observatory for the Safeguarding of Syria's Cultural Heritage was an adequate tool to achieve efficient cooperation. They also called for the adoption of a UN Resolution to fight illicit traffic, encouraged larger interaction between existing platforms and databases and underlined the need to involve local communities in safeguarding activities to the widest possible extent.

Participants: Experts meeting: more than 120 participants from 22 countries. Press conference: 20 journalists.

Audience: Intergovernmental organizations (UN, ICCROM, UNIDROIT, INTERPOL), national specialized bodies (Carabinieri, French OCBC, WCO), national technical bodies of Syria and neighboring countries, non-governmental organizations (ICOM, ICOMOS, ICCROM, Blue Shield, national NGO, museums (Louvre, Smithsonian, etc.), universities (Berlin, Leuven, Naples, Copenhagen, Paris, Rome, Florence, Bern, Bale, Pennsylvania, UCLA, Damascus, Lattakieh, Irbid in Jordan, Saint Joseph in Lebanon, etc.), archeological missions (Ebla, Palmyra, Mari, Europolis Doura), private auction organizations (Sotheby's, Christie's).

Press coverage: This meeting was not open to the media, which dissuaded many media from following it. The press conference held at the close of the meeting was well attended, but there was very little hard news announced. Subsequently, coverage of the event was disappointingly light. A few interviews were organized with experts, notably on Al Jazeera, which interviewed Francesco Bandarin. Le Monde also planned a story, to be published in June as part of the newspaper's coverage of the World Heritage meeting in Doha.

Social media: The final output of this meeting generated little interest on Twitter with 33 RT. This is understandable, in that the plans for a new observatory have only been announced, but not yet materialized. It must be noted that social media sites have regularly and rigorously covered the issue of Syrian heritage, whenever politically appropriate, during the past 18 months.

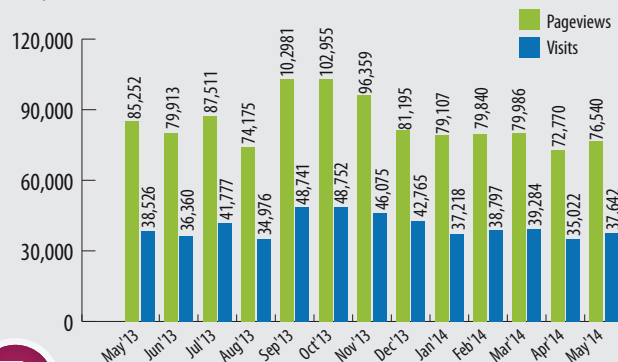

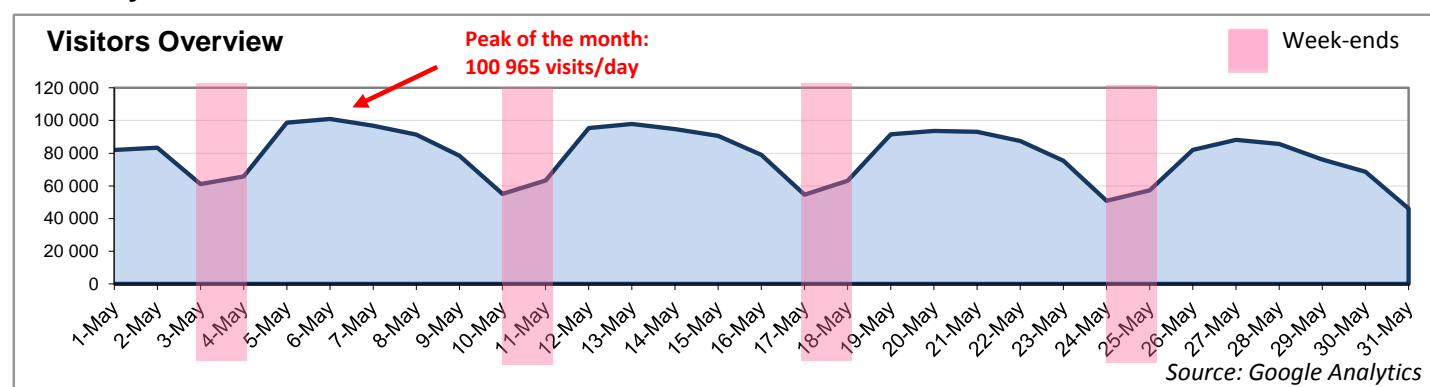

Both a communication and a knowledge management tool, UNESCO's websites, with over 2.7 million pages of content, are today a key component of its public information strategy. Maintained by Corporate Web Services in close collaboration with the Programme Sectors, the main site is updated continually in all 6 UN languages (with some subportals also in Portuguese, Vietnamese, et al).

Web traffic shown here (page views, visits, visitors, country and language of visit, etc) has been measured since September 2011 with the free Google Analytics toolset via tags embedded in pages. 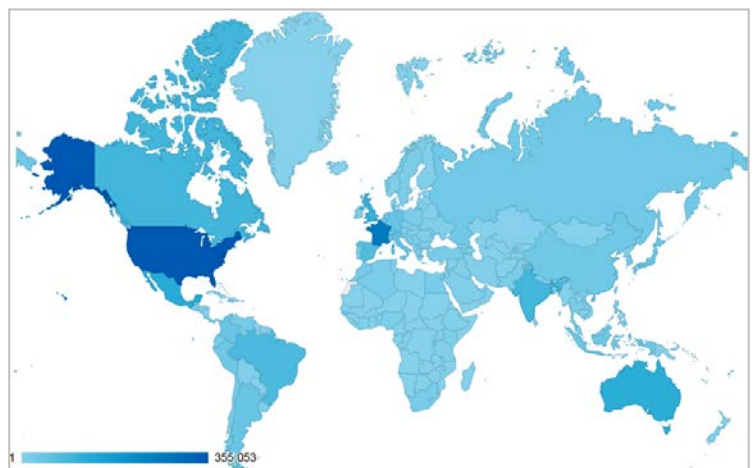

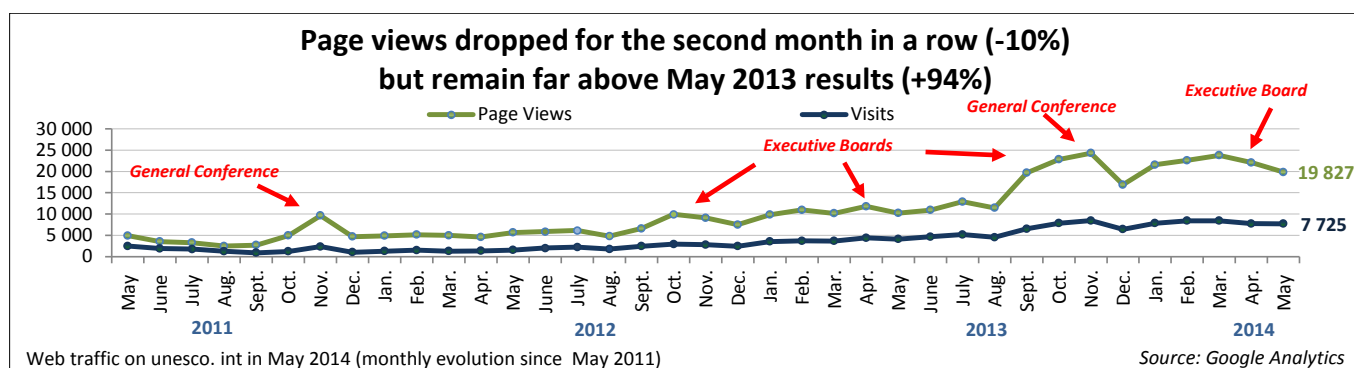

Identification is made to the visitor's computer, not the person, usually via cookie and/or IP+User Agent. Thus the same person visiting from two different computers will count as two Visitors.

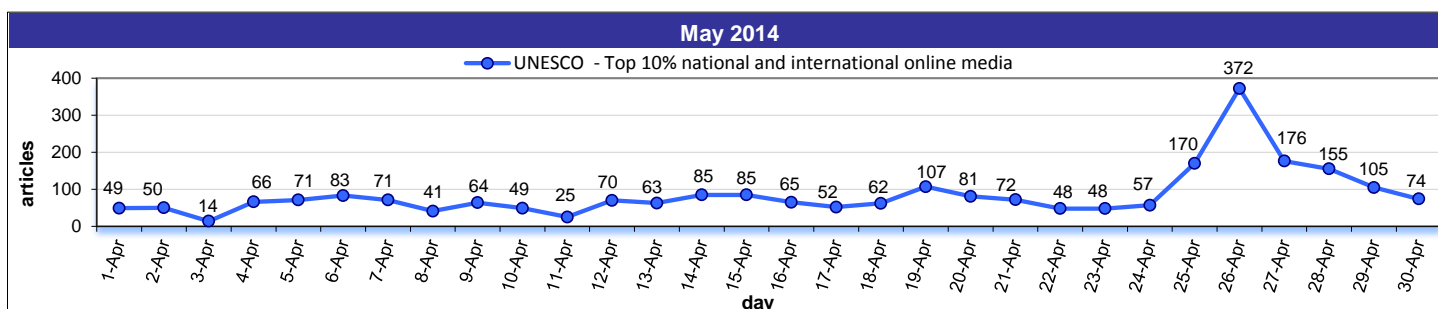

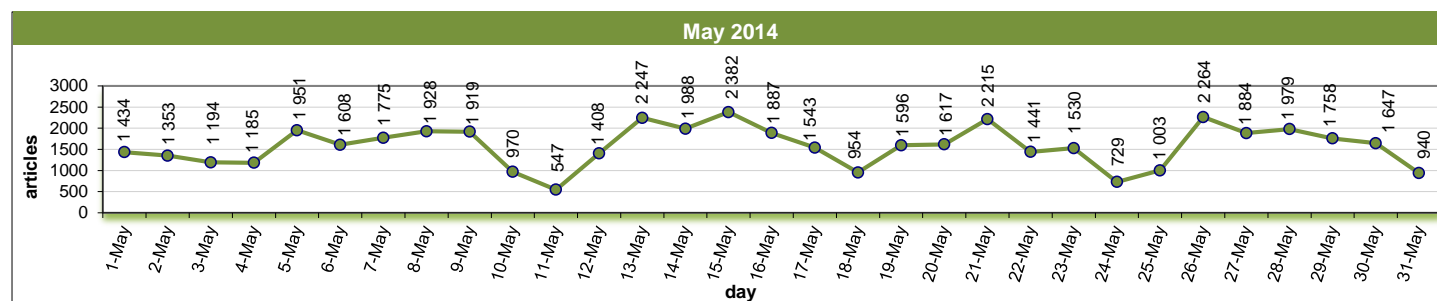

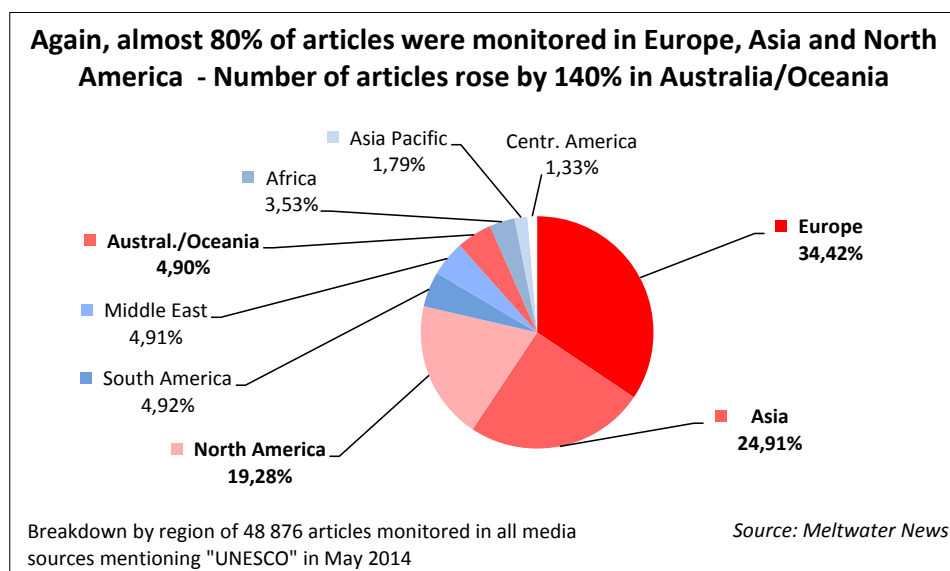


Media coverage was steady throughout the month. Most coverage was generated by World Press Freedom Day, the release of documents concerning the June World Heritage Committee, and the abduction of the Nigerian schoolgirls (prompting numerous references to UNESCO's education statistics). The sharp peak toward the end of May was due largely to the story of the "fake" Sphinx constructed in China.

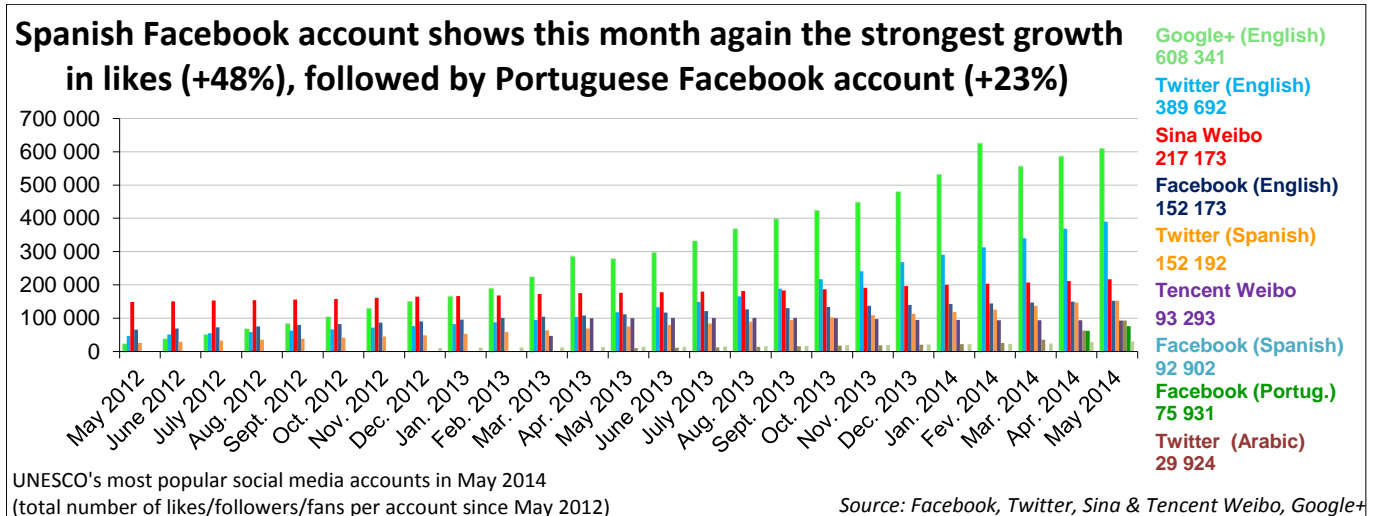

3. UNESCO Social Media Channels

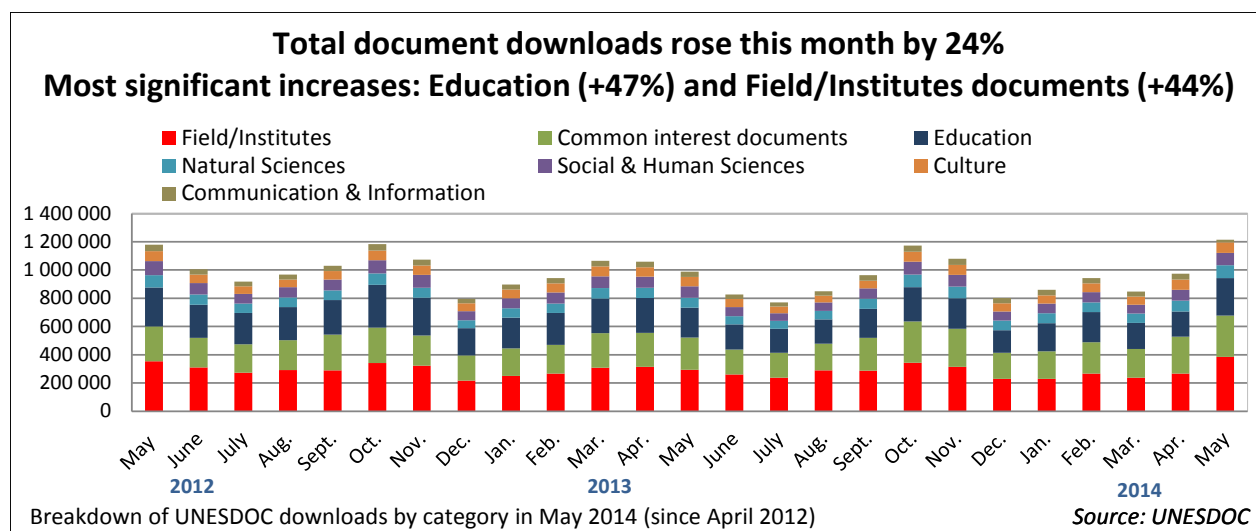

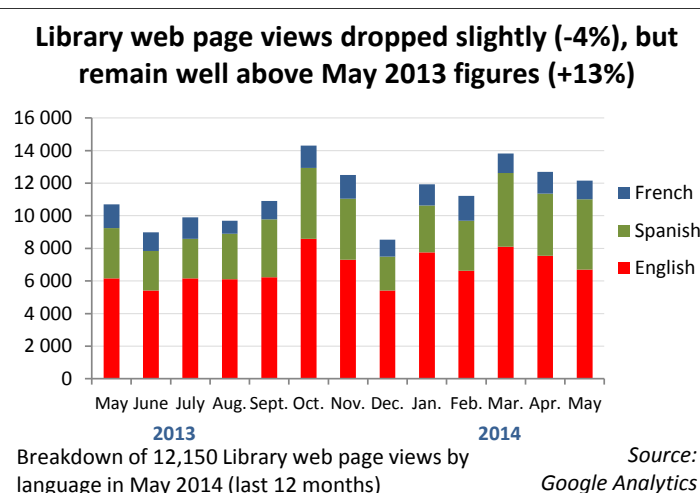
The UNESCO Library collections offer an overview of the Organization's current and past activities and programmes as recorded in print publications and other resources.

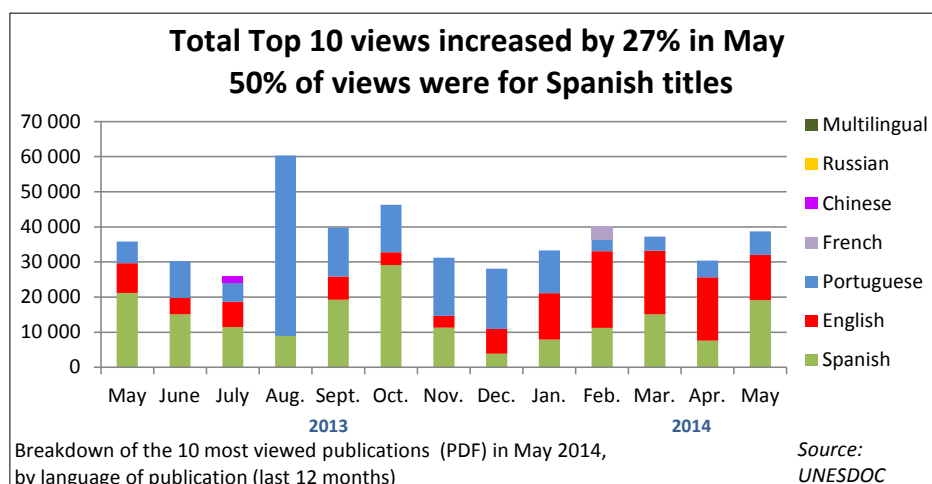
'UNESCO publications' cover the output of the programmes of the Organization and feature in the biennial Publications Plan. They are produced in a variety of formats (books, CD-ROMs, ebooks, etc.) and are classified into different categories (global and regional reports, monographs, reviews, technical studies, atlases, etc.). They are distributed for free via UNESCO's networks and on-line, or as sales products under the 'UNESCO Publishing' imprint.

Online viewing of UNESCO top ten publications in May has increased since April of this year (27%) and compared to May last year (8%). The two main flagship reports of UNESCO, the *EFA Global Monitoring Report 2013-2014* (in English and in Spanish) and the *World Water Development Report 5*, continue to fare extremely well in the top ten downloads. Titles in Spanish account for half of the publications in this table. Bookshop sales were largely dominated by World Heritage titles while for online and international sales the publication from the Kathmandu Office, *The Sacred Garden of Lumbini - Perceptions of Buddha's Birthplace* did the best this month.

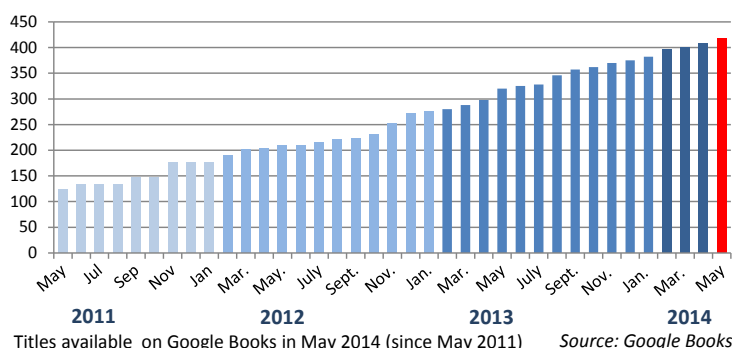

8. UNESCO Headquarters

Due to its position in Paris, its architectural value, well-known works of art and facilities, the UNESCO Headquarters building offers excellent communication and visibility opportunities. Therefore its meeting rooms as well as external and internal spaces are used for UNESCO related activities organised by the Secretariat and other institutions Secretariat's purposes but also for external rentals.

Conferences and meetings, organized by sectors, constitute an integral part of programme implementation and thus contribute to the achievements of the Organization's goals and objectives. UNESCO also hosts conferences and meetings organized by its Member States, through their delegations, as well as by other educational, scientific and cultural entities which share the Organization's mandate. 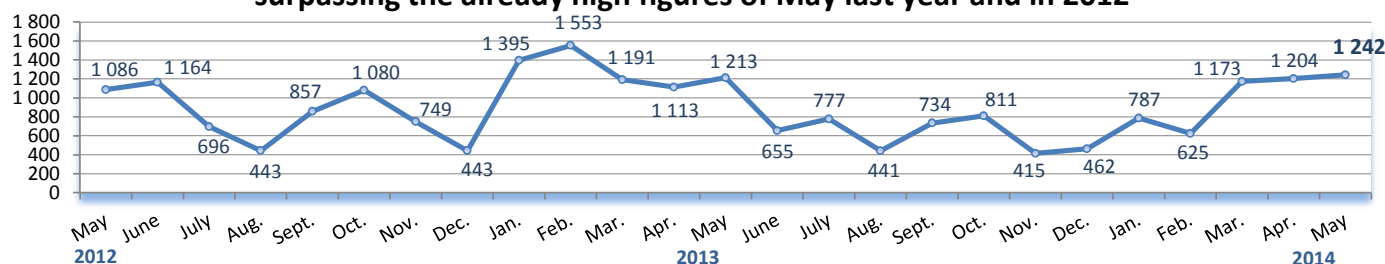

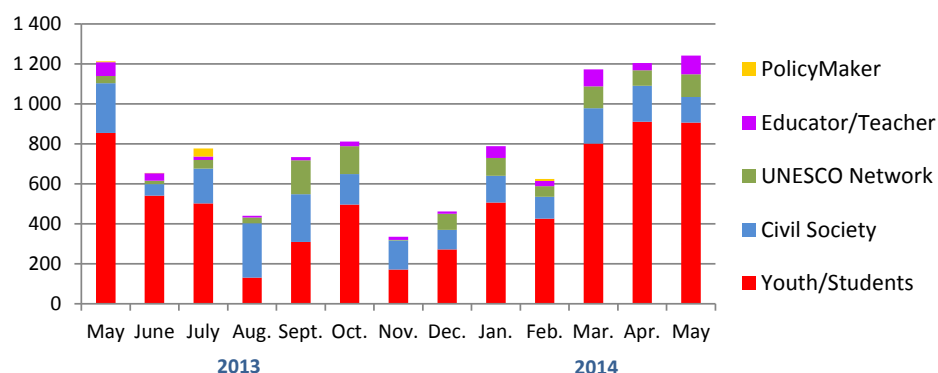

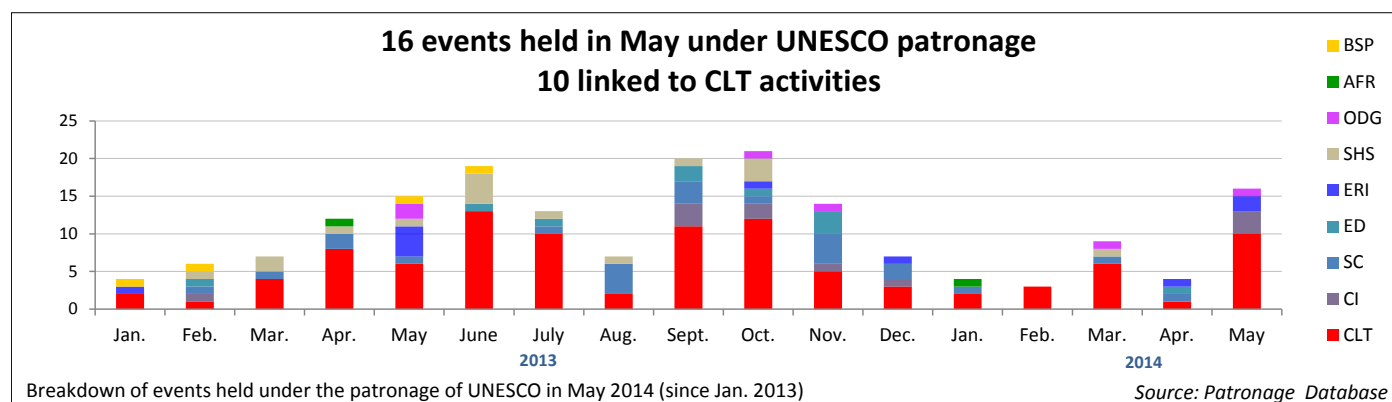
9. UNESCO logo exposure

9.1. Patronage

Patronage is UNESCO's most prestigious form of moral support. It is granted to demonstrate UNESCO's endorsement of an activity organized under the responsibility of an external organization. UNESCO's patronage is granted to a range of activities, such as cinematographic and audiovisual productions, publications, meetings, conferences and cultural performances, award ceremonies, as well as a range of other events of regional and international scale. Information on patronage requests and their follow-up is recorded in a central database managed by ERI/DPI/PBM. The database is updated daily and shared with the focal points for UNESCO name and logo use of each Sector.
