Where is Nias Island?

- Located in North Sumatra province, 125 km southwest Sibolga, Nias Island is divided into two districts, Nias and South Nias. The capital town of Gunung Sitoli is located in Nias and the town of Telukdalam is in South Nias.
- The Island is 5,625 km2 in size and has an approximate population of 710.000.







Background

- The Indian Ocean Tsunami on 26 December 2004 killed 30 people, left hundreds homeless and 20% of sub district area damaged in Nias Island.
- The Earthquake on 28 March 2005 killed more than 800 people, thousands injured and damaged infrastructure in Nias island where almost 80% of
 - buildings damaged were in Gunung Sitoli and Telukdalam.

UN JOINT PROGRAMMING

Vithin the framework of the UNDP Aceh-Nias mergency Response and Transitional Recover ERTR) Programme, a UN Joint Programming in elukdalam, South Nias was launched in eptember 2006. UNDP, UNESCO, UN-HABITAT and ILO are involved in this UN Joint programming in Telukdalam, South Nias.

Culture project focuses on rebuilding tourism while protecting the Cultural Heritage of Nias Island in close collaboration with BAMPER MADANI, a local NGO partner. Project activitic mostly cover villages in Telukdalam, South Nia with Bawomataluo in Telukdalam selected as the pilot project site.
