Comparison of Assessment Methodologies for "Research" and "Health Research" Systems

This special session aims to compare and contrast methodologies for assessment of overall national research systems with those employed within the special context of health research systems.

Such issues are particularly important because much research that impacts on health is more traditionally viewed as basic science, engineering or agriculture, among many other fields. Furthermore, health-related research plays a major role in the research systems of low and middle income countries, and can also be a significant driver for development across the health, education and economic sectors.

The Council on Health Research for Development, the Global Forum for Health Research, and the World Health Organization are all involved in work on health research system assessment, which will feed into the 2008 Global Ministerial Forum on Research for Health (to be held in Bamako, Mali in November 2008). This will be the first international conference to situate "research for health" in the broader, multi-disciplinary sense within the context of the national research system as a whole.

Short 10 minute presentations will describe the methodologies used in current work. This will be followed by facilitated discussion with all participants to share experiences and lessons learned relevant across the different contexts encountered.
