### **I** Activities

### 1. Education/research/ Training

Education :

A Master of sciences degree in sustainable development of small islands and small states will be created according the following chart : Overview modules : 12 credits Culture for sustainable Island development Lead University: USP in collaboration with UWI

Economics for sustainable Island development Lead University UMT in collaboration with UMU

Environmental issues for sustainable island development: Lead universities : UWI in collaboration with UMU, UVI

Social issues in sustainable island development Lead universities : UMT in collaboration with UWI

Specialisations in the core area : 9 credits

Electives : 3 credits

Research/dissertation/project : 12 credits

Total: 36 CREDITS (72 ECTS)

It was agreed that the UCSIS will work towards the development of a program of study that will exist at each university, have a common name and share the same core courses. There will be flexibility with the electives. The degree granted will be awarded from the UCSIS University at which students enrol for at least 50% of their coursework in collaboration with the other UCSIS universities

Training :

The UCSIS intends to deliver the MSc as a modular programme. This will permit the UCSIS to use the modules to train Parliamentarians across SIDS as well as other Government Officials who represent these countries at international meetings on diverse matters.

Another focal area is Teacher Education for Sustainable Development

The principal outcome of this strategic intent is that the UCSIS is indeed the first ever Cross Border, Trans-disciplinary Higher Education Initiative which focuses specifically on the Millennium Development Goals and the implementation of the Barbados Plan of Action (BPoA). It is this focus that separates it from all virtual Higher Education networks as well as all other attempts at Quality Provision of Cross Border Higher Education at this time.
