In 2006, a database was created with the aim to bring together those higher education institutions and study programmes which approach sustainable development. The database (accessible online at http://www.leuphana.de/infu/chair/networking/institution.php) is constantly building up, containing to date approx. 100 institutions and study programmes from many world regions.

II. Outcomes

On national and European level, the UNESCO Chair's activities helped bringing forward the concepts of inter- and transdisciplinary education and research, to counterbalance disciplinary approaches which are equally needed to achieve sustainability.

On a regional level, activities led to the successful restructuring of the curriculum at Lüneburg University. On a broader level, the UNESCO Chair has been influencing national and international policy on higher education for sustainable development. As a member of the German working group on higher education of the UN Decade of Education for Sustainable Development (ESD), the Chair continuously works on the inclusion of sustainability as a paradigm for higher education in Germany and Europe.

Since its inauguration, the UNESCO Chair Higher Education for Sustainable Development is active to stimulate international debate about the meaning of sustainability as a paradigm for higher education institutions. Two international conferences in 2005 and 2007 discussed various aspects, among them regional interpretations of sustainability needs. Both conferences helped starting a global network of higher education representatives active or interested in sustainability issues, which needs continuous broadening. In 2006, a database was created with the aim to bring together those higher education institutions and study programmes which approach sustainable development. The database accessible online is constantly building up, containing to date approx. 100 institutions and study programmes from many world regions.

The curriculum development of an International Master Programme Sustainable Development and Management brought together 9 higher education institutions from Europe and Latin America. In July, the curriculum development has been successfully terminated.

III. Forthcoming activities

For the remainder of the current biennium 2006/2007, the UNESCO Chair's primary focus will be on promoting the results of the International Conference "World in Transition", which took place in July, 2007. This will be done by both online publication and printed and enriched version of the proceedings.

Next to this, increased efforts to improve the global database are being undertaken. In the forthcoming weeks, the discussions with international partners on how to launch, maintain and enlarge a global resource database for higher education for sustainable development will be brought forward.

Thirdly, a survey shall be launched to identify global and regional needs among already identified members of the global HESD community. This survey should yield guidance on the development of the global web-based HESD database and identify most urgent sustainability challenges for higher education in different world regions.

IV. Development prospects

The INFU – Institute for Environmental and Sustainability Communication works along three paths for embedding sustainable development into higher education.

Firstly, INFU is active in acquiring new projects and already carries out projects, which target sustainable development issues at universities. These third-party funded projects allow for scientific research and transfer of knowledge in regard to sustainable development. The project-related funds currently also form the backbone of INFU's financial resources to conduct broader activities in regard to higher education for sustainable development.

Secondly, INFU maintains educational activities and qualifications for students of environmental sciences. A third way of promoting sustainability in higher education is pursued by taking a pro-active role in the development of national and international policy on education for sustainable development.

It is the institute's permanent goal to secure and broaden the financial basis for the UNESCO Chair by acquiring projects, which allow the funding of scientific research and the dissemination of results in regard to higher education for sustainable development.

International cooperation on higher education for sustainable development will remain a main pillar of the UNESCO Chair's activities. Efforts are being undertaken to continue activities of the "Sustainable University" project on an international scale.

INFU will continue developing the UNESCO Chair's dimension of international networking and exchange, in order to enhance the recognition of sustainability as a new paradigm for higher education institutions worldwide. INFU is aware that not all world regions have been approached evenly in the past biennium. It is one development goal to intensify debate with partners from Asia and Africa in the years to come.

To secure the needed continuity in stimulating international debate on higher education for sustainable development, INFU is currently heading for core funding for the purposes of the UNESCO Chair.

Furthermore, actions are foreseen to stimulate international debate by means of a globally accessible and interactive web-based data collection. In the short and medium term, finances and partners for the maintenance of this resource website will have to be acquired to let the needed global exchange in HESD resources become a success.
