I. Activities

1. Academic activities

Education

During the 2007 period of activity, the UNESCO Chair offered courses on: the mass media situation in Russia and countries of the former USSR; the global informational processes; foreign languages, cultures and media studies.

Target group: postgraduate students in the Faculty of Journalism at Moscow State University and affiliated international centers.

Research

Research projects on the democratization of mass media and the role of mass media in the development of democratic civil society. Other projects focus on the emergence of an information and technological society in post-socialist Russia.

2. Conferences/Meetings

Conference of the International Association for Media and Communication Research Date and Place: July 2007, Paris

The UNESCO Chair organized annual trainings for journalists, politicians, diplomats and scholars in humanitarian studies.

During the 2007 activity period, the UNESCO Chair offered seminars and conferences on topics including: media-education, human rights, communication technologies, digital divide, media images, media ethics, information law and legal practice, International humanitarian law, gender problems in journalism, mass-media and culture, and freedom of the press.
