II. Outcomes

The main project was the conference "Towards the New Standards of the Development of the Social Sciences in Central Asia" held in October 2006. It allowed to define a framework for a joint project of a new kind – the publication of two big books - "The History of Central Asia: From Ancient to Modern Times" and the book-album "The Art of Central Asia"

III. Forthcoming activities

The action plan of the Chair for 2007-2008:

- 1. International Conference "Islamic Civilization in Central Asia: Past, Present and Future", 4-6 September 2007, Almaty. This conference will be organized together with the IRSICA (International Research Center on the Study of the History, Culture and Art at the Organization of the Islamic Conference, OIC). The main domain of the conference will be the questions of the science and spiritual, cultural interaction in Central Asia in retrospective and prospective; the role of Central Asian great ancient scholars and philosophers such as al-Farabi, al-Biruni, etc. on the spiritual and cultural life in the region; the modern science-culture interaction.
- 2. International Conference "China-Mediterranean Worlds Up to 12 century" is scheduled for May 2007, Almaty. The questions of Kazakhstan and Central Asia as a part of the Great Silk Road from China to Europe, its role, significance and potentials are among the issues of this conference.
- 3. There is the project of the Chair on "The Role of Education in the Inter-cultural and Inter-Religious Dialogue" that could be implemented together with the UNESCO Chairs Network. Within the frameworks of this project could be organized the interdisciplinary workshop "Ethics of the Science, Education and Information in the Cultural and Religious Spheres".
- 4. Publication of the books: "The History of Central Asia: From Ancient to Modern Times" and the book-album "The Art of Central Asia".

IV. Development Prospects

Action aimed at obtaining a stable permanent status of the Chair/Network in the structure of the Institution

Short and medium term: The Chair will continue to benefit from the Institute's status as one of the leading academic research center in Kazakhstan. This means, first of all, the financial, human and material support from the Institute. In 2007 the Institute was granted the status of the national institution which implies its higher status in the field as well as the new possibilities for development.

Long term: With the spreading of **the Bologna Process in Kazakhstan** (till 2010) the Institute will strive for getting an opportunity to implement MA (and then – BA) education. This means that the Chair will also become involved in this process through preparing the special courses within its framework, educating students and inviting foreign lecturers.

Expanding activities and broadening partnerships: At these first years of the Chair's activity we implemented a series of mainly research activity. Now it is a time to expand it at the more broad community – other universities and institutions (through joint projects and network) as well as general public (through public lectures, TV appearances, etc). This means the continuation of the fundraising activity and new agreements.
