Draft criteria for the allocation of funds

Projects submitted should comply with one or several elements in each of the following areas:

1. Millennium Development Goals

- 1.1. Eradicate extreme poverty and hunger
- 1.2. Achieve universal primary education
- 1.3. Promote gender equality and empower women
- 1.4. Reduce child mortality
- 1.5. Improve maternal health
- 1.6. Combat HIV/AIDS, malaria, and other diseases
- 1.7. Ensure environmental sustainability
- 1.8. Develop a global partnership for development

2. WSIS Action Plan Areas

- 2.1. Information and Communication Infrastructure
- 2.2. Access to Information and Knowledge
- 2.3. Capacity Building
- 2.4. Building Confidence and Security in the Use of ICTs
- 2.5. Enabling Environment
- 2.6. ICT Applications
- 2.7. Cultural and Linguistic Diversity, Local Content
- 2.8. Media
- 2.9. Ethical Dimensions of the Information Society

3. UNESCO's Medium Term Strategy 2002-2007 (31 C/4)

- c) The project implementation shall involve the national IFAP Committee;
- d) The project shall build on previous experiences.
- e) The objectives of the project shall be specific, measurable, achievable, realistic and time bound precise.
- f) The budget range shall be as follows:

National projects US\$ 25,000 Regional projects US\$ 35,000 International projects US\$45,000
