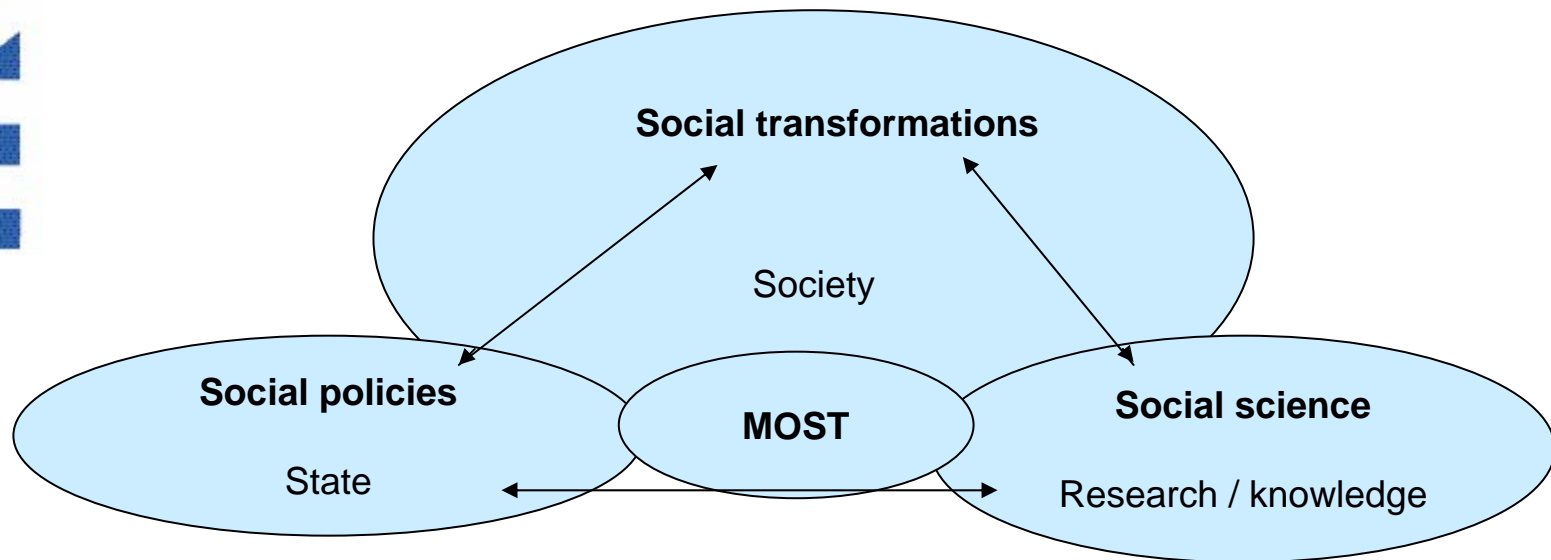
Mission

MOST Clearing House and Digital Library

2004-2005: MOST Clearing House up-graded with UNESCO Content management software ('Simplify').

Digital Library hosts 164 MOST research reports indexed in 3 languages according to a policy-sensitive methodology.

Materials include: best practices, books, book reviews, city templates, discussion papers, journal reviews, reports, newsletters, policy papers and working papers.



New Policy Papers Series & Methodology

New methodology developed:

Enhanced readability through standard structuring of content; helps produce different types of documents from the same information (Papers, Briefs); easy indexing in data-based tool.

Online Policy Research Tool

Based on the afore-mentioned Policy Paper methodology.


Offers speedy access to policy-relevant comparative information:

- To create research profiles based on subject categories, geographical & issue-specific criteria.
- To evidence contexts & issues, policies & programmes, initiatives & recommendations, operational aspects.

Uses content of each section in the Policy Papers as a fully-fledged knowledge item (i.e. a document *per se*):

- To produce customized reports with select content from original documents.
- To compare cases with similar characteristics & assess relevance of the options available.

Coordination and Evaluation

- A review of the structure, operations & impact of the MOST National Liaison Committees (NLCs).
 - Exploring the best-suited modalities to strengthen the NLC's platform function for MOST.
 - Draft NLC Evaluation Report to be presented to 7th IGC Session for further input and recommendations.
 - Exploiting useful synergies between NLCs & UNESCO-UNITWIN Chairs.



Funding and Assessment

MOST online policy research tool allotted high priority within SHS fundraising strategy.
