# Ethiopia and Zimbabwe join the World Network of Biosphere Reserves

At its last meeting held in UNESCO, Paris in June 2010, the International Coordinating Council of UNESCO's Man and the Biosphere Programme (MAB-ICC) has added 13 new sites and 7 extensions in 15 different countries to the World Network of Biosphere Reserves (WNBR), which now has 564 sites in 109 countries. First biosphere reserves in Ethiopia and Zimbabwe were also approved. More and More

#### Ecuador Signs Historic Fund Agreement for Non-Drilling of Yasuni Biosphere Reserve Oil

The Government of Ecuador and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) signed a historic deal establishing a trust fund to step up protection of Yasuni Biosphere Reserve from oil-drilling. The fund's objective is to hold at least 50 percent of the estimated US\$7 billion that tapping the oil would bring. More Contact: carla.rossignoli@undp.org

#### Cooperation Agreement between Biosphere Reserves in Chile and France

A three year contract was recently signed to formalize cooperation aimed at partnered training of biosphere reserve management skills. As La Campana – Peñuelas (Chile) and Fontainebleau - Gâtinais (France) biosphere reserves have similar characteristics due to their comparable location in a metropolitan context, this partnership will allow them to exchange information and experiences and pave the way for sustainable regional development.
