

Doing together - Learning together Tatry Biosphere Reserve, Stará Lesná, Slovakia Academia Congress Center 27 - 30 October 2009

Main objectives

- To co-build a EuroMAB Network strategy for contributing to the World Network of Biosphere Reserves and for implementing the Madrid Action Plan 2009-2013.
- To prioritize main thematics and activities for the EuroMAB Network.
- To share experiences and effective approaches to sustainable development, best practices and know-how.
- To identify and promote potential benefits of EuroMAB biosphere reserves for sustainable development.

Process

The EuroMAB 2009 meeting will use an interactive and participatory method adapted from AmericaSpeaks/Global Voices "21st Century Town Meetings®".

The organizers want to share concrete examples and success stories. To achieve this, the organizers will suggest several possible test cases/questions and ask participants to interact and discuss ideas based on their work in the biosphere reserves, within MAB National Committees, and in the EuroMAB Network, to better understand their expectations and needs. Participants will use these questions to suggest ideas for an effective EuroMAB Network that builds on the work and experience of biosphere reserves to share best practices on sustainable development.

Participants are most welcome to bring their papers and power point presentations which will be printed in the proceedings. A special hour is set aside each day for additional presentation of participants and partners. Please contact the organizers if you would like to make such a presentation.

Outcome

- The last day of the meeting the participants will receive a summary of the workshop results in bullet points as well as main recommendations.
- A co-built pilot web sharing platform for working together.
- A EuroMAB strategic paper will be made available to the participants via internet.
