The Executive Board,

- 1. Recalling 101 EX/Decision 8.1 (I), 106 EX/Decision 7.1 (I), 111 EX/Decision 7.1 and 118 EX/Decision 7.1 concerning the terms of reference of the Special Committee, and also 122 EX/Decision 9.2,
- 2. <u>Decides</u> that the Board shall refer to the Special Committee, for its consideration and report, questions of general and special interest which do not fall clearly within the terms of reference of the Programme and External Relations Commission or the Finance and Administrative Commission, concerning particularly:
  - (a) the organization of the work of the General Conference and Executive Board, including that of their commissions and committees;
  - (b) the report of the Director-General on the activities of the Organization, prepared in accordance with Article VI 3(b) of the Constitution;
  - (c) studies in depth, assessment, or elaboration of methods of evaluation, of selected aspects of programme execution;
  - (d) relations with the United Nations Joint Inspection Unit, and consideration of reports prepared by the Joint Inspection Unit which are not referred to the commissions of the Board;
- 3. Further decides to instruct the Special Committee:
  - (a) to follow the implementation of the reforms approved by the Executive Board, including those concerning its own functioning, and of the measures taken on the initiative of the Director-General with a view to improving the functioning of the Organization, and to report thereon to the Executive Board;
  - (b) to assess the above-mentioned implementation and the results obtained and, in the light of that experience, to consider, if necessary, the advisability of suggesting to the Executive Board any adjustment to the decisions already adopted that may be desirable;
- 4. Also decides that:
  - (a) the Special Committee shall be composed of 18 members, three from each electoral group, any other decision of the Board on this subject being abrogated;
  - (b) the Special Committee shall continue to meet immediately before each regular session of the Executive Board, which may decide on the advisability of convening an extraordinary meeting of the Special Committee.

  - (b) 21 C/Resolution 7/11 concerning international nongovernmental organizations maintaining relations with Unesco and in which bodies or individuals from Taiwan still participate in the name of China,
  - (c) 22 C/Resolution 30 concerning the septennial report by the Executive Board on the international non-governmental organizations in categories A and B,
  - (d) 22 C/Resolution 15.3 concerning Unesco's co-operation with international non-governmental organizations,
- 4.  $\underline{\text{Decides}}$  that the terms of reference of the Committee on International Non-Governmental Organizations shall be as follows:
  - (a) to carry out, at the intervals laid down by the Executive Board at its 61st session (61 EX/Decision 15.2, II), studies of new applications for admission to consultative status (categories A and B) and for changes in category;

  - (b) that invitations to send observers to the Conference shall be sent to any other State in Latin America and the Caribbean that may become a member of one or more agencies of the United Nations system prior to the opening of the Conference, and to the Holy See;
  - (c) that invitations to send representatives to the Conference shall be addressed to the agencies of the United Nations system listed in paragraph 11 of document 123 EX/3, with which Unesco has concluded an agreement providing for reciprocal representation;
  - (d) that invitations to send observers to the Conference shall be sent to the organizations, foundations and institutions listed in paragraph 13 of document 123 EX/3.

The Executive Board, in accordance with resolution 23 C/PLEN/DR.13 Rev. adopted by the General Conference at its twenty-third session, <u>decided</u> to entrust the Chairman of the Board with the task of presiding over the group of members of the Board who Will be responsible for discussing with the authorities of the State that has withdrawn from the Organization the question of its financial contributions. It further <u>mandated</u> him to select, taking into account the views expressed on this matter during the session, the three or four members who will form this group.
