#### ITEM 3. METHODS OF WORK OF THE ORGANIZATION

3.1 Terms of reference of the Special Committee of the Executive Board: Recommendations of the Committee concerning the terms of reference which it might be given by the Executive Board (82 EX/ 2)

- 1. <u>Recalling</u> the decision adopted at its 81st session (81 EX/Decision, 6. 1) by which it set up its Special Committee,
- 2. <u>Having examined</u> the report of the said Special Committee containing its recommendations concerning the terms of reference which it might be given for the two-year period 1969-1970 (82 EX/2).
- 3. Having heard the oral report of the Chairman of the Special Committee,
- 4. Decides to give the Special Committee the following terms of reference for 1969-1970:
  - (i) to consider the organization of the work of the sixteenth session of the General Conference, more particularly with a view to reducing its length in pursuance of resolution 15 C/Resolution 36, and to report to the Executive Board at its 84th session (spring 1970);
  - (ii) to examine the mode of election and the length of the term of office of members of the Executive Board, in pursuance of resolution 15 C/Resolution 11.2, and to report on this item to the Executive Board, if possible at its 83rd session (autumn 1969)) in order to enable the Board, if necessary, to formulate within the statutory time-limits any amendment to the Constitution that it might wish to propose;
  - (iii) to undertake a study in depth, of a preliminary character, of the important matters regarding the execution of the programme arising out of the Director-General's printed report on the activities of the Organization in 1969, and to report on the subject to the Executive Board at its 84th session, it being understood that, in accordance with decision 77 EX/Decisions, 3. 1. III, the Board might, if appropriate, further direct the Committee, in its capacity as an organ for reflection and study, to undertake, in the same manner, the examination of any other report on any particular aspect of the execution of the programme;

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- (iv) to consider the nature and form of the Director-General's printed reports on the activities of the Organization and of the procedure for their examination and to report on the subject to the Executive Board at its 84th session;
- (v) to make the study envisaged in the resolution adopted by the Executive Board at its 80th session (80 EX/Decisions, 3. 1) concerning the interim report of the Director-General for the first six months of the second year of the biennium (C/3), and to submit its recommendations to the Executive Board at its 84th session;
- (vi) to study working methods which will enable the Finance and Administative Commission of the Executive Board to examine more thoroughly the administrative, financial and budgetary aspects of Unesco's programme and to report on this subject to the Executive Board at its 84th session;
- 5. <u>Invites</u> the Special Committee to meet immediately after the present sessionin order to establish its time-table of work.

#### ITEM 4. EXECUTION OF THE PROGRAMME

- 4.1 Report by the Director-General on the activities of the Organization
- 4.1.1 Printed Report for 1968
- 4.1.2 Report of the Special Committee on its examination of the Report of the Director-General on the activities of the Organization (Printed Report for 1968) (82 EX/3)

The Executive Board,

- 1. <u>Having examined</u> the Report of the Director-General on the activities of the Organization in 1968 and having heard the oral presentation by the Director-General of this report, in which he referred in particular, to his Introduction to the Report,
- 2. <u>Having received the report of its Special Committee on its examination of this</u> Report (82 EX/3) and <u>having heard</u> the comments that its Chairman made while presenting the report,

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3. <u>Expresses</u> its general satisfaction with the manner in which the programme of the Organization was implemented in 1968;

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- 4. <u>Considers</u> that the contents of the Introduction by the Director-General constitute the "critical and synthetized survey, on a selective basis, dealing with the important issues, achievements and difficulties arising in each sector and in general as regards the execution of the programme", which the Board had envisaged when it adopted its decision on the subject at the 77th session (77 EX/ Decisions 3. 1. II) and that such a critical appraisal of the work of the Organization and of the problems it faces is most valuable to the Board in the discharge of its constitutional responsibilities;
- 5. Invites the Director-General to include in his future annual reports:
  - (a) data on the general financial picture and on the **main** budgetary adjustments affecting the implementation of the approved programme, such as transfers;

- (b) more detailed information concerning the implementation of the Participation programme;
- 6. <u>Considers</u> further that the preliminary examination of the Director-General's annual report by the Special Committee, which was undertaken on an experimental basis, has proved its usefulness and that the selective approach adoptedbythe Committee for its study in depth of this report was appropriate and fruitful;
- 7. <u>Invites</u> the Special Committee to proceed in the same manner in the future (1970), on the understanding that the main issues concerning the general policy of the Organization will be taken up by the Executive Board itself;

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- 8. <u>Considers</u> that a number of questions which were discussed when the implementation of the 1968 programme was examined, and which are listed in the Annex to the present resolution, deserve to be studied in greater depth when the Future programme is being prepared;
- 9. <u>Invites</u> the Director-General to take into account, in the preparation of the Draft Programme and Budget for 1971-1972, the questions mentioned in the list referred to above as well as the suggestions put forward in the course of the discussion by the Board, as reflected in the summary records of the debate;
- 10. <u>Welcomes</u> the intention of the Director-General to present at the 83rd session of the Board, within the framework of "Important Changes and Innovations" to be proposed by him with regard to the biennium 1971-1972, proposals concerning the publications policy of Unesco.

## ANNEX

The Board recalls that the following points received wide and special consideration during its examination and that of the Special Committee of the Director-General's Report on the activities of the Organization in 1968:

- (a) Concerted efforts in quantitative and qualitative educational development with particular reference to educational planning and research, teacher training, curriculum reform and educational content adapted to country or regional needs and conditions and the integration of culture in educational programmes;
- (b) A larger measure of decentralization in the activities of the Organization, in multi-national and/or regional projects, leading to greater efficacity with emphasis on strengthening of national and regional structures and the adaptability of the Secretariat's field personnel;
- (c) Greater involvement of youth and women in functional literacy programmes;
- (d) Promoting life-long education and clarifying its implications in school and outof-school teaching and cultural and social development;
- (e) Stressing the social and cultural as compared with the purely economic aspects of development and to that end reinforcing in the programmes the application of the social sciences to integrated development, so that development becomes a balanced processleading to the enhancement of the value of human resources and enrichment of the human individual;
- (f) Promoting, in even greater measure, the planned application of science and technology to all aspects of development, with an emphasis on the study of adequate measures for co-ordination at the internationallevel to ensure that Unesco's own particular objectives are achieved;

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- (g) The role of the university in contemporary society and the exploration of new models of higher education consonant with the requirements of modern life and with the aspirations of youth;
- (h) More intensive, varied and imaginative information programmes to promote a better and wider understanding of the activities of Unesco and their relevance to the success of the Second Development Decade and international co-operation;
- (i) Developing, through inter-sector planning, programmes enabling those responsible for written and audio-visual communication media to take part directly in seeking solutions to the ethical problems which are within Unesco's competence.

- 4. 2. 1 Invitations to the Third Regional Conference of Ministers of Education and Ministers responsible for economic planning in the Arab States (82 EX/4 and 82 EX/28)

The Executive Board,

- 1. <u>Noting</u> resolutions 1. 121 and 6 adopted by the General Conference at its fifteenth session,
- 2. Decides that:
  - (a) invitations to participate with the right to vote in the Third Regional Conference of Ministers of Education and Ministers responsible for economic planning in the Arab States shall be extended to the Member States and Associate Members listed in paragraph 3 of document 82 EX/4;
  - (b) invitations to send observers to the Conference shall be extended:
    - (i) to the Holy See,
    - (ii) to the organizations and foundations listed in paragraphs 4, 5 and 6 of document 82 EX/4, with the addition of the World Federation of Democratic Youth (Category B) to the list contained in paragraph 5 (iv).

4. 2. 2 International Education Year: Report of the Director-General (82 EX/5 and 82 EX/28)

- 1. <u>Having examined</u> the report on the preparation of International Education Year (IEY) (82 EX/5),
- 2. <u>Considers</u> that holding such a Year, as envisaged by the Economic and Social Council and the General Assembly of the United Nations, and pursuant to resolutions 1. 111, 1. 112 and 1. 113 adopted by the General Conference at its fifteenth session on the basis of the Director-General's reports, should be something more than a mere celebration, since its purpose is to encourage the governments and the international community to consider what can be done in practice to expand and improve education, and to take consequent action;
- 3. <u>Considers</u> that it would be advisable in order to co-ordinate all efforts and ensure the success of this undertaking, to be informed of what Member States propose to do in the matter and of co-ordinated plans for multidisciplinary action at the international level in which the organizations of the United Nations system and the international governmental and non-governmental organizations participate in their respective fields of action;

- 4. <u>Invites</u> the Director-General to submit at the sixteenth session of the General Conference a preliminary report on the results achieved in the course of the IEY, with particular reference to its qualitative aspects, so that the said Conference, to be held at the end of 1970, may formulate a declaration or draw any conclusions for future guidance that may issue from the endeavours made;
- 5. <u>Considers</u> that when the various national or international plans are drawn up, it would be advisable to highlight not only the link which it is proposed to establish between the objectives of the IEY and the Second United Nations Development Decade, but also the concrete means which, in the matter of education and training, may serve to characterize this development effectively as having man as its principal agent and beneficiary;
- 6. Invites the Director-General to include, in the list of participants in the meeting referred to in paragraph 1008 of document 15 C/5 Approved, educators, sociologists and psychologists, to discuss the bases of education in the light of knowledge acquired about children and adolescents, on the one hand, and about society and the world today on the other;
- 7. Further invites the Director-General:
  - ii) to continue to stimulate the action of Member States and the co-ordination of international plans, as recommended in the above paragraphs;
  - (ii) to draw the special attention of Member States and the international organizations concerned to the present resolution of the Executive Board;
  - (iii) to inform the Executive Board at its next session of the results obtained.

4. 2.3 <u>General rules for the Mohammad Reza Pahlavi Prize for meritorious work in</u> <u>literacy (82 EX/6 and 82 EX/28)</u>

The Executive Board,

- 1. <u>Having examined the report on the Mohammad Reza Pahlavi Prize for meri-</u> torious work in literacy (82 EX/6),
- 2. <u>Having reviewed</u> the successful development of the Prize during 1967 and 1968 and the four modifications to the Rules proposed by the Director-General,

Approves the next text of these Rules as contained in the Annex attached to this resolution, as from 1970, the Rules in force in 1967-1968 remaining applicable in 1969.

#### ANNEX

#### GENERAL RULES FOR THE MOHAMMAD REZA PAHLAVI PRIZE FOR MERITORIOUS WORK IN LITERACY

1. Purpose

The purpose of the Prize is to contribute to securing and maintaining the sympathy and support of public opinion for literacy programmes under way, by awarding the Prize in recognition of the services of an institution, association or individual displaying outstanding merit and achieving special success in contributing to the fight against illiteracy.

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## 2. Prize and honourable mentions

The Prize, worth approximately US \$5,000, may be awarded each year. The amount of a Prize not awarded in a particular year may be attributed the following year, when two Prizes will accordingly be awarded. A limited number of candidates may also be awarded an honourable mention in accordance with the criteria set out in paragraph 5.

#### 3. <u>Selection of prize winners</u>

The selection of the institution, association or individual to whom the Prize will be awarded shall be made by a jury of three persons designated by the Director-General of Unesco. A staff member of Unesco may be appointed by him to serve as secretary of the jury.

#### 4. Eligibility

The Prize is open to institutions, associations or individuals displaying outstanding merit and achieving special success in contributing to literacy. Among those eligible for the Prize are the following:

- (i) national committees for literacy;
- (ii) teachers colleges and universities; schools of primary and secondary levels;
- (iii) special adult education or out-of-school institutions;
- (iv) private or public enterprises;
- (VI co-operatives;
- (vi) trade unions;
- (vii) professional institutions and associations;
- (viii) non-governmental organizations or movements (youth, women, etc.);
- (ix) religious communities;
- $(x) \qquad \mbox{information services (newspapers, radio, television, publishing enterprises) ;}$
- $(xi) \quad \ \ local institutions established in the framework of a national programme (regional and local committees, special literacy teams, etc. ) ;$
- (xii) individuals working for literacy programmes as volunteers, as government officials, or as members of private and non-governmental organizations;
- (xiii) authors of books.
- 5. Criteria for award of Prize

The Prize, which will be indivisible, will be awarded in conformity with the following criteria:

- (a) institutions, organizations or individuals must have carried out literacy activities:
  - (i) by direct teaching, or

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- (ii) by organizing literacy programmes on a national or local level, or
- (iii) by promoting support from the public, or
- (iv) by producing teaching materials or special media for literacy programmes, or
- (v) by carrying out research in fields related to literacy (methods, languages, evaluation, social sciences, etc. ), or
- (vi) by carrying out special surveys of primary importance for literacy planning;
- (vii) by offering youth the possibility of taking part in literacy activities.
- (b) In addition, the following criteria will be considered:
  - the duration of the activity so as to permit an assessment of results and proof of success obtained;
  - (ii) the contribution to the basic objectives of the educational system of the country;
  - (iii) the contribution to local and national development;
  - $(\mathrm{iv})$   $% = (\mathrm{iv})^{-1}$  the value of the activities as an example to stimulate further similar action;
  - (v) the impact of the action carried out with a view to mobilizing new resources for literacy programmes;
  - (vi) the contribution to the understanding and development of the national society and culture;
  - (vii) the contribution to the appreciation of other cultures and to international understanding.

#### 6. Selection and presentation

Candidates for the Prize will be proposed to the Director-General of Unesco by governments of Member States, in consultation with their National Commissions and by international non-governmental organizations specializing in education, which have consultative status with Unesco, each of which may nominate one candidate.

Arrangements for selection, as suit national conditions, may include:

- (i) the announcement of the Prize;
- (ii) the establishment of a committee or committees for the selection of candidates'on the national level;
- (iii) the recommendation to the Director-General of Unesco on the candidates for the award.
- 7. Submission of proposals

Governments and international non-governmental organizations should supply three copies of each recommendation, which in a maximum of five standard pages, should include:

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- (i) a description of the activities carried out;
- (ii) the success achieved;
- (iii) a reference on the criteria mentioned above; and
- (iv) the appraisal of the final national selection committee.
- 8. The last date for submission of proposals to the Director-General shall be 31 July of each year.
- 9. The Prize and the honourable mention winners will usually be announced on the International Literacy Day (8 September) of each year.

4. 2.4 Implementation of the Recommendation concerning the Status of Teachers (82 EX/7 and 82 EX/28)

The Executive Board,

- 1. <u>Having studied</u> document 82 EX/7 on the implementation of the Recommendation concerning the Status of Teachers,
- 2. <u>Bearing in mind</u> the report that the Joint ILO/Unesco Committee of Experts on the Application of this Recommendation adopted at its session in September 1968,
- 3. <u>Noting</u> that the Joint Committee, in April-May 1970, will prepare its report on the replies of Member States to the questionnaire drawn up by it,
- 4. <u>Being of the opinion</u> that its Committee on Discrimination in Education could be given the task of examining this report of the Joint Committee and presenting it to the Board, with comments, at its 85th session, and that, to this end, it would be desirable to change the name of the said Committee,
- 5. Decides:
  - (a) to change the name of the said Committee to "Committee on Conventions and Recommendations in Education";
  - (b) to charge this Committee with the task mentioned in paragraph 4 above;
- 6. <u>Decides</u> to submit the report of the Joint Committee, with its own comments thereon, to the General Conference at its sixteenth session.

4. 2.5 <u>Co-operation with the United Nations Relief and Works Agency (UNRWA)</u> (82 EX/8 and Add. )

- $\frac{Having \ examined}{Nations \ Relief \ and \ Works \ Agency \ (UNRWA) \ (82 \ EX/8 \ and \ Add. \ ) \ ,$
- 2. <u>Recalling</u> its previous resolutions on this question and, in particular, decision 6.8 adopted at its 77th session and decision 7.4 adopted at its 78th session,
- 3. <u>Takes note</u> of the work and recommendations of the Commission of Outside Experts established to examine the textbooks used in UNRWA/Unesco schools;
- 4. <u>Invites</u> the Director-General to continue his consultations with the Government of the Syrian Arab Republic to reconsider its position in regard to the implementation of resolutions 6.8 and 7. 4;

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- 5. <u>Class upon</u> the Governments of Jordan, Lebanon and the United Arab Republic to consider the recommendations of the Commission of Experts, transmit their observations thereon to the Director-General and pursue consultations with him in order to reach an agreement in this matter;
- 6. <u>Authorizes</u> the Director-General to lift the ban, before the beginning of the school year 1969-1970, on those textbooks which he will have approved;
- 7. <u>Calls upon</u> the Government of Israel to permit without any restriction the import and use of the textbooks approved by the Director-General for UNRWA/ Unesco schools in the occupied territories;
- 8. Asks the Director-General to report to the Executive Board at its next session on the application of this resolution.

## 4.3 Natural Sciences

4.3.1 Invitations to the Conference of Ministers of the European Member States responsible for Science Policy (82 EX/9 and 82 EX/28)

The Executive Board,

- 1. <u>Having considered</u> the Director-General's proposals concerning invitations to the Conference of Ministers of European Member States responsible for Science Policy to be held in Europe in May 1970 (82 EX/9, paragraphs 5 and 6),
- 2. Decides:
  - (a) that invitations to participate in the Conference with the right to vote shall be extended to the Member States listed in paragraph 5 of document 82 EX/9;
  - (b) that invitations to send observers to the Conference be extended to:
    - (i) the Holy See, Liechtenstein and San Marino;
    - (ii) the organizations of the United Nations system listed in paragraphs 6 (b) and 6 (c) (i) of document 82 EX/9;
    - (iii) the other intergovernmental organizations listed in paragraph 6
      (c) (ii) of document 82 EX/9;
    - (iv) the international non-governmental organizations listed in paragraph 6 (c) (iii) of document 82 EX/9.

4. 3. 2 Measures to be taken to ensure adequate participation of the interested organizations of the United Nations system in supporting the work of the Intergovernmental Oceanographic Commission (82 EX/IO and 82 EX/28)

- 1. <u>Having examined</u> document 82 EX/IO concerning the work of the Intergovernmental Oceanographic Commission (IOC) ,
- 2. <u>Bearing in mind</u> the need for inter-agency co-operation in the field of oceanography as well as the need to maintain the unity of Unesco's Natural Sciences programme,

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- 3. <u>Authorizes</u> the Director-General, in order to broaden the base of the participation in the work of the IOC, to establish on a provisional basis at an early date and in agreement with the Executive Heads of the United Nations, the Food and Agriculture Organization, the World Meteorological Organization and the Intergovernmental Maritime Consultative Organization, an inter-secretariat committee which, in addition to examining questions of co-ordination concerning the aforesaid organizations' programmes relating to oceanography, would meet with the chairman of the IOC to further common aspects of the work of the IOC and the participating agencies, to recommend to these agencies appropriate support action for the IOC and to co-ordinate such action;
- 4. <u>Authorizes</u> the Director-General, if asked to do so by the IOC, to administer, in accordance with the financial regulations of Unesco, a fund-in-trust to which voluntary contributions from Member States and other sources could be made and which would be used to help towards the execution of the IOC programme;
- 5. <u>Authorizes</u> the Director-General to study the possibility of introducing procedures, consistent with applicable personnel rules and regulations of Unesco, for facilitating the utilization of personnel provided by Member States at their expense to augment the available personnel of the IOC Secretariat, and invites him to report to the Executive Board on this subject;
- 6. <u>Invites</u> the Director-General to organize the staff of the IOC Secretariat and that responsible for the application of the oceanography programme of Unesco under a single officer so as to avoid duplication and ensure maximum efficiency in the execution of both programmes, taking also into account the interest of the other organizations concerned;
- 7. <u>Invites</u> the Director-General to continue, in collaboration with the Intergovernmental Oceanographic Commission, and after consultation with other agencies concerned, the preparation of draft amendments, if necessary, to the present Statutes of the Commission to be submitted to the General Conference at its sixteenth session;
- 8. Invites the IOC to make recommendations for the preparation of the draft oceanography programme of Unesco to be approved by the General Conference and to provide technical advice for the execution of that programme after its approval.

7.1 Dates of the 83rd session of the Executive Board and of meetings of the Board's Committees in 1969

Anouncement concerning the private meetings of 14 and 16 May 1969

- 1. On 14 May 1969 the Executive Board held a private meeting at which the Director-General consulted it on an appointment to a higher post in the Secretariat, in accordance with the provisions of Rule 54 of the Rules of Procedure.
- 2. The Board held another private meeting on <u>16 May 1969</u>. In order to take into account the entry into force, as from 1 January 1969, of a new salary scale for staff in the Professional category and above, the Board adopted the resolution given below concerning the remuneration of the Director-General. It also noted the adjustments which had become necessary in the remuneration of the Deputy Director-General.
- 2. Furthermore, at the same meeting, the Board adopted the decision concluding its examination of item 6.6 of the agenda.

#### Remuneration of tile Director-General

The Executive Board,

- 1. <u>Considering that the General Assembly of the United Nations, at its twenty-third</u> session, revised the salaries and allowances of staff in the Professional category and above, this revision to be applicable on 1 January 1969, as aresult of which these salaries were increased by 5% of the gross salary and one class of post adjustment was incorporated in the gross salary,
- 2. <u>Considering</u> that the relationship between the remuneration of the Director-General and that of other staff members of the Organization in the Professional category and above should remain the same as that obtaining before 1 January 1963,
- 3. Having <u>been informed</u>, moreover, of the measures to this effect taken by other organizations in the United Nations system as regards the remuneration of their Director-General,
- 4. Recommends that the General Conference, at its sixteenth session, increase the Director-General's gross salary to \$47,003 -that is, a net salary of \$30,100 per annum as from 1 January 1971;
- 5. <u>Authorizes</u> the Director-General to receive, as from 1 January 1969, a special temporary allowance of \$4,000 per annum, subject to assessment under the staff assessment plan and to pension assessments, giving him, in 1969-1970, the same gross and net salary as that recommended to the General Conference for its approval;
- 6. Decides, further, to establish the rate of post adjustment, applicable from 1 january 1969, to \$1, 200 per annum for each class of the scale for that adjustment.
