# Rio Platano Biosphere Reserve: Combating Poverty by Sustainable Forestry

Community foresters in the Río Plátano Biosphere Reserve, Honduras, are filling a rapidly growing order for mahogany from world class guitar manufacturer Gibson. But the consequences of their industry are not seen in felled forests and fields of stumps; the woodsmen in this protected area cut and extract the wood sustainably, minimizing their impact on the forest and adhering to a management plan which allows controlled logging in buffer zones in the biosphere reserve.
