The Government of the Dominican Republic and the Spanish Agency for International Cooperation for Development extended the project "Araucaria" in the Dominican Republic for four years; this project sets out actions to ensure the sustainable management of the unique biosphere reserve in the country, the Jaragua-Bahoruca-Enriquillo Biosphere Reserve. 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Building Capacity in Dryland Biosphere Reserves in West Africa

The UNESCO-MAB/UNEP-GEF regional programme, which includes six biosphere reserves in West Africa, aims to improve the understanding of the interactions between societies and savannas in order to facilitate dialogue between the various stakeholders intervening in biosphere reserves.
