Declaration of N'Sele, 1991


Mission

ERAIFT aims to train a new type of specialist in the management of tropical forests and lands, with an interdisciplinary, integrated, systemic and holistic approach.




SYSTEMIC APPROACH

The integrated management of tropical forests and lands should take into account all the elements which influence the bio-physical environment and, in particular, the population, which interacts with its multiple facets and resources – soils, woody and non-woody products, food, intangible resources etc., necessary to satisfy basic needs.



The scientific and conceptual basis for this approach is underpinned by the concepts and laws of the general theory of systems – systemic analysis – essential characteristic of the pedagogic philosophy of ERAIFT.

The emphasis is put on the essential condition of the participation of the local population in integrated development.

The DESS Master's degree from ERAIFT was recognized by the African and Malagasy Council for Higher Education (CAMES), during its regular session, held in Abidjan, 3-5 December 2001. This diploma is the equivalent of the Master's degree of the 'LMD' system of the Bologna Agreement.

Study programme

The programme includes, in terms of credit hours (cr) and duration (months):

28 cr : Theory and practical laboratory work: Nine months:
Chairs 1 to 14

4 cr: Practical laboratory work on management and integrated development: One month: Chair 15

8 cr : Field course on management and integrated development:
Two months: Chair 16/Systemic and Digital District Project

20 cr : DESS Dissertation (6 months)

One credit (1 cr) corresponds to 15 hours of coursework and 30 hours of personal work. Programme total: 60 cr (18 months).

Institutional aspects

UNESCO is the ERAIFT implementing agency, through the Division of Ecological and Earth Sciences, under the directorship of Dr Natarajan Ishwaran. M. Samy Mankoto, is the Project Officer at UNESCO Headquarters responsible for ERAIFT.

The University Affairs Committee is the permanent international quality control mechanism for research and development in ERAIFT. It includes among its members, university professors and high-level researchers with relevant pedagogical experience. It is the principal decision-making body of ERAIFT and the advisory body to UNESCO.

The International Supervisory Committee includes associated countries on a rotational basis and funding agencies.

A Local Management Group in Kinshasa functions under the responsibility of the University Affairs Committee.

INTERNATIONAL CHARACTER OF ERAIFT

ERAIFT is a flagship regional project of the UNESCO MAB Programme serving as a model for other African regions.

In addition to French-speaking African countries,

ERAIFT aims to extend its activities to English, Spanish and Portuguese-speaking African countries, in particular in the framework of NEPAD.

The main objective is to develop a real in-situ network of university research and training centres in the humid and dry tropics by strengthening South-South and South-North South cooperation.

The building of new and the renovation of old buildings, equipped with the latest computer technology, thanks to the support of the EU Trust Fund/WB, will permit increased student capacity in ERAIFT and will facilitate its internationalization.
