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## Introduction

For over sixty years, written words have played a central role in UNESCO's mission to strengthen human development in education, science, and culture. Indeed, "empowering people through the free flow of ideas by word and image" is a fundamental tenet of the Organization's Constitution. As the world grows into an everexpanding Information Society, this commitment to educating through information exchange has also broadened. It has meant a new challenge for UNESCO; one where timely access to information becomes as much a consideration towards achieving progress as the information itself.

In order to keep up with this challenge in the Asia-Pacific region, the UNESCO Asia and Pacific Regional Bureau for Education/UNESCO Bangkok proudly releases the 2007 UNESCO Publications - Asia-Pacific Region catalogue. The catalogue offers a gateway to the many specialized resources that have been generated through a vast number of UNESCO programmes in the region. These programmes address a multitude of themes: universal education, cultural preservation, HIV/AIDS prevention, adolescent reproductive health, communications, science education, ethics, environmental protection, assessment/monitoring/evaluation analyses, and policy creation to name a few. UNESCO's publishing operations are an integral part of ensuring that lessons learned from this work are widely disseminated to strengthen future development projects.

Within Asia and the Pacific, publishing activities support work underway in the Organization's fourteen field offices, with the largest of these located within UNESCO Bangkok's Publication Services unit (PS/IKM). PS/IKM coordinates with the office's twelve working divisions to achieve quality standards through its vital editing, design and printing activities. Effective and efficient distribution of publications is another priority so that, once completed, materials can fulfill their important role of "informing to further the world's educational development."

Towards this aim, most of the publications included in the 2007 catalogue can be freely downloaded from the Internet. Web link addresses are provided within each document synopsis for this purpose, and represent field activities from Bangkok, Almaty, Islamabad, Jakarta, Kathmandu, New Delhi and Phnom Penh. A number of these offices also include local-language translations among their collection of resources. Such translations are often essential in bringing information to those who most depend upon it, and we welcome requests for reprints, adaptations and translations. Indeed, over the last year, we have worked with publishing partners in India, Albania and China to broaden access to UNESCO's publications.

As the 2007 publication catalogue goes to press, UNESCO is preparing to release the results of a two-year review of the Organization's global publishing operations. The resultant new policy measures will usher in a closer global collaboration of information-sharing and cost efficiency that emphasizes a synergistic approach to UNESCO's worldwide publishing activities. The Asia and Pacific Regional Bureau for Education is ready to collaborate in this endeavor, and will continue to support the production of quality publications that meet the needs of its constituents. We are further hopeful that with this broadened reach, publications from the Asia-Pacific region will be more widely utilized in other parts of the world.

The 2007 UNESCO Publications Asia-Pacific Region catalogue serves as an easy-to-use reference of the year's collection. However, UNESCO publishes new resources monthly.
