

“Learning to Live Together” Youth Image Competition

Announcement of Results

UNESCO Bangkok is pleased to announce the results for the “Learning to Live Together” Youth Image Competition, organized for youth residing in the Asia-Pacific region from May to August 2013.

Over 200 submissions were received from 20 countries across the region, and each has been judged based on the following criteria:

- Clear connection of image to the theme of “learning to live together”
- Creativity and originality
- Style and presentation of submission

The top 30 entries for this competition are publically exhibited in the “**Learning to Live Together**” Asia-Pacific Exhibition, held at the Bangkok Art and Culture Centre (BACC) from 17 to 22 September 2013. Each submitter of these entries will receive a Certificate of Recognition from UNESCO Bangkok.

The top 6 winners are as follows:

- 1st place: Alland Dharmawan, 19 years old, Indonesia
- 2nd place: Siddhant Mohanty, 17 years old, India
- 3rd place: Allan Jay Quesada, 26 years old, Philippines
- 4th place: Masyudi Firmansyah, 30 years old, Indonesia
- 5th place: Mir Md Shahriar Islam, 26 years old, Bangladesh
- 6th place: Nimesh Ghimire, 22 years old, Nepal

Each winner will receive a tablet computer sponsored by Haier Group (China) (Global Business Organization) and a Certificate of Accomplishment from UNESCO Bangkok.

We wish to thank all the young people who have participated in this competition. Other than the exhibition at BACC, the submissions will also be showcased in an e-exhibition on UNESCO Bangkok Website and UNESCO media to promote “Learning to Live Together” in the Asia-Pacific region and beyond.
