CONCEPT NOTE

1. Background and Rationale

The countries of the Asia-Pacific region are highly concerned with the monitoring of educational quality. With most countries in this region having made great strides in extending access to education to all, the crucial issue is that of quality, as increase in enrolment does not necessarily equate to improved learning. Furthermore, the measurement of learning outcomes is important for accountability and for governments to justify investments in education. This concern is motivating countries to re-conceptualize national educational assessments as well as to sign up for participation in large-scale, international assessments such as the OECD's Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA) and the IEA's Trends in International Mathematics and Science Study (TIMSS), in order to monitor how their students and schools compare with their counterparts in the region (particularly important in the context of increasing regional integration) and worldwide.

In recognition of growing interest in the Asia-Pacific region and beyond in sharing experience and best practices around the theme of monitoring of educational quality, UNESCO's Asia-Pacific Regional Bureau for Education (UNESCO Bangkok) established the Network on Education Quality Monitoring in the Asia-Pacific (NEQMAP) in March 2013 . NEQMAP aims to improve the quality of learning in the Asia-Pacific by enhancing the use of student learning assessment to strengthen education policy and practice. In order to do so, the network promotes knowledge sharing, research and capacity building on assessment and other enablers of learning in the classroom including curriculum and pedagogy.

At present, NEQMAP has 17 institutional and 1 individual members including Ministries of Education, national assessment bodies, research institutes, universities, NGOs and the private sector from a range of countries in the region. The 1st NEQMAP Steering Group Meeting was organized in September 2013 and resulted in decisions about the priority activities of the network to be implemented during the 2014-2015 period. Among these are research on student learning assessment and its impact on policy and practice and on the assessment of transversal or "21st century" skills, the establishment of a knowledge portal on assessment issues and the organization of capacity building workshops for Ministries of Education and other bodies focused on assessment literacy.

At this juncture, the 2nd annual NEQMAP meeting will be organized. This annual network meeting presents the first opportunity for all current NEQMAP members (plus potential new members) to come together since the network's launch. The meeting will focus on further discussion and exchange of ideas on the implementation of the network activities foreseen for the immediate future and beyond. In addition, it will aim to expand collaboration between
