



Pay rises eroded by inflation

Salaries up by 6.1 per cent but real wage growth is 0.9 per cent

WORKERS in Singapore may have received a more generous pay increase last year, but many of them did not feel much richer for it.

That's because high inflation eroded most of the wage bump, according to the Manpower Ministry's (MOM) latest annual report on wages.

So while a tight labour market helped to calse salaries by 0.1 per cent in terms of dollars and cents, real wage growth last year was just 0.9 per cent.

This was much lower than the


started to soften in the first quarter of this year, with fewer wacancies and slightly higher unemployment of 2.1 per cont.

Given that the economy has aboved but inflation remains high, real wages could stagnate or even fall eligibly this year, warned Me Scienz Ling, based of trausury research and strately at OCBC loads. This means that workers could end up feeling poover despite forcements received in 2012.

To mitigate this, Mr Zalmadin Nordin, chairman of the Government Parliamentary Committee for Manpower, set out two policy

options.





WIDENING WAGE GAP






