

Titus Kuman and Youths For Sustainability (YFS) sucessfully coordinated a group of 35 unemployed youths to form the entity, Kum Youth Focus, and construct and maintain a fish farm in their community of Kolgpeng, Papua New Guinea. In a region of high unemployment, YFS aims to support and facilitate rural youths in obtaining opportunities to gain a long-term sustainable income and to become responsible citizens for their community.

Who's involved?

Project leader: Titus Kuman

Lead organisation: Youths For Sustainability (YFS) and Kum Youth Focus

Other organisations: Foundation of Rural Development, Kolgpeng community, National Fisheries Authority

Objectives:

- Raise the local cash flow among the unemployed youths
- Mobilize youths to work together for common benefits
- Show that unemployed and uneducated youths are not a problem to the

community but assets to the community.

Activities:

- Obtaining technical assistance from the National Fisheries Authority and the Foundation for Rural Development;
- Designing, building and monitoring the fish ponds in accordance with the government standards;
- Organizing community meetings to promote awareness of the initiative and to attract more buyers, in addition to those already identified in the business plan;
- Designing and erecting a billboard with project information to be placed at the entrance to the fish ponds;
- Purchasing 2000 fish fingerlings to be raised in the ponds and selling them in the community in accordance with the business plan.
 - Publicise the activities through local radio, television and newspapers;
