

Towards a Global Secretariat


Some sixty-five years ago, the United Nations was founded as an intergovernmental organization focusing primarily on multilateral diplomacy with negotiations and consultative meetings held at Headquarters.

Today, the United Nations has evolved into a field-based organization with a multitude of different responsibilities in the area of peace and security, humanitarian affairs, human rights and development. Over 64% of its staff works in locations outside Headquarters.
