# **Indicators for Target 4.a**

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#### Target 4.c

By 2030, substantially increase the supply of qualified teachers, including through international cooperation for teacher training in developing countries, especially least developed countries and small island developing States.

- 37. % of teachers qualified according to national standards

# 37 and 39. % of qualified and trained teachers

#### **Definition:** % of teachers who have:

- at least the minimum <u>academic qualifications</u> required for teaching their subjects (qualified)
- at least the minimum <u>pedagogical teacher training</u> (trained)

The indicators are in Tier 1. No need for a placeholder.

Data source and coverage: Administrative data from schools. Available for c120

- Definition: Ratio of pupils to qualified (38) or trained (40) teachers
- The indicators are in Tier 1. No need for a placeholder.
- Data source and coverage: Administrative data from schools. Available for c120

#### Indicators 37-40. Main technical issues

'Qualified' and 'trained' are defined relative to national standards which can vary widely.

Pupil-teacher ratios compare all students to qualified or trained teacher numbers (and not students taught by such teachers).

# 41. Average teacher salary relative to other professions

- Definition: The ratio of the average salary of a fulltime full-year qualified teacher to the average of salaries of professions requiring a similar level of academic qualifications.
- The indicator is in **Tier 2** but is currently only available for a small number of more developed countries.
- A placeholder is needed

#### 41. Main technical issues

- Whether to use statutory or actual average salaries. Statutory salaries should be more readily available for teachers than average salaries but may not exist for comparable professions.
- The comparable professions will vary from country to country. For global monitoring, it will be necessary to define a fixed group which is broadly comparable across countries.

#### 41. Placeholders: Main technical issues

- Average expenditure on teacher compensation is a crude estimate as difficult to match expenditure to teachers, includes expenditure on part-time and fulltime teachers and teachers at all stages of their careers
- Annual gross statutory salary of teachers is currently available for only a very small number of developing countries

### **42. Teacher attrition rate**

- Definition: percentage of teachers at a given level of education leaving the profession in a given school year.
- The indicator is in Tier 2. No Placeholder needed
- Data source and coverage: Estimated from administrative data in two consecutive school years.
  Coverage being extended from Africa to the rest of the world.

#### 42. Main technical issues

- Estimated at the national level rather than measured directly. Does not capture teacher turnover between schools, levels of education or regions of a country.
- Does not capture reasons for leaving (retirement, death, transfer to other professions, migration etc).
- May over-estimate actual attrition rates (eg where contracts are renewed annually or teachers are employed only in term-time)

# 43. % of teachers receiving in-service training in the last 12 months

- Definition: percentage of teachers who, during the last academic year, have received in-service training required for teaching at the relevant level in a given country
- The indicator is in Tier 3. No current data source identified
- Placeholder needed.
