The Executive Board,

1. <u>Bearing in mind</u> 20 C/Resolution 4/1.2/7 in which the General Conference invited the Director-General to provide moral and material assistance towards the organization, each year, of a Black Peoples' Day,

2. <u>Recalling</u> 27 C/Resolution 3.13 in which the General Conference approved the implementation of the intercultural and interregional project entitled "The Slave Route",

3. <u>Recalling also</u> 28 C/Resolution 5.11 on the slave route and the proposal for the establishment at international level of remembrance of the slave-trade,

4. <u>Further recalling</u> that 23 August 1791 was the day on which the slaves of Saint-Domingue and Haiti rose up in rebellion, thus taking the first step towards the abolition of the slave-trade,

5. <u>Noting with interest</u> the support expressed for the UNESCO Slave Route project by the Organization of African Unity (OAU) at its twenty-eighth summit at Dakar in June 1992,

6. <u>Endorses</u> the general approach and conception proposed by the Director-General in document 150 EX/32 concerning the objectives and the programme for the establishment of the remembrance;

<u>Recommends</u> that the General Conference:

(a) proclaim 23 August of every year 'International Day for the Remembrance of the Slave Trade and its Abolition'; and

(b) submit to the United Nations General Assembly a request that all United Nations Member States take part in this remembrance.
