## High-level meeting on the rule of law at the national and international levels

## Pledge registration form

Hungary pledges to ratify/acceed to the following international treaties by the end of 2014:

- International Convention for the Protection of All Persons from Enforced Disappearance;
- Protocol No. 3 to the European Outline Convention on Transfrontier Co-operation between Territorial Communities or Authorities concerning Euroregional Co-operation Groupings (ECGs);
- Third Additional Protocol to the European Convention on Extradition;
- Fourth Additional Protocol to the European Convention on Extradition;

Hungary will also sign the Optional Protocol to the Convention on the Rights of the Child on a communications procedure by the end of 2013.

In the field of international humanitarian law and strengthening the legal protection for victims of armed conflicts, Hungary reiterates its pledges made at the 31st Conference of the Red Cross and Red Crescent.

At national level Hungary will launch by the 1<sup>st</sup> October 2012 an integrity-based corruption prevention project with a total budget of 2,3 million EUR.

Hungary will promote ethical behaviour among public servants, based on a new code of ethics, by training at least 5 000 public servants by March 2014.

Hungary will simplify its administrative procedures regarding birth registration and civic records by the end of 2013.

Hungary will adopt specific measures to address the special needs of women prisoners and women offenders in accordance with the Bangkok Rules by the end of 2014.

Hungary - in accordance with Article 19 of the Convention on the Rights of the Child - will establish child-friendly investigation rooms at every regional police station by the end of 2013.

Hungary will bring its criminal law in line with the provisions of the Rome Statute by adopting a new Criminal Code which will enter into force in July 2013.
