### **Zero stunted children younger than 2 years**

IFDC is helping farmers, particularly women, grow nutritious fruits and vegetables for their families. These farmers are able to provide their families with more diverse, healthy foods.



### **100% access to adequate nutritious food all year round**

We're helping farmers increase crop yields and incomes by giving them access to advanced agricultural tools and profitable markets.



### **All food systems are sustainable**

IFDC is strengthening farmers' role in alleviating climate change with sustainable fertilizer and irrigation methods.



### **100% increase in smallholder productivity and income**

We're connecting farmers with technologies and training to sustainably increase food production.



### **Zero loss or waste of food**

IFDC is linking farmers to post-harvest storage facilities to decrease food loss.
