#### **Addendum**

#### *Summary*

The report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Fund for International Partnerships (UNFIP) (A/53/700) provides detailed information on the genesis of UNFIP and on the first two funding cycles of 1998. The present addendum advises Member States of the outcome of the third, and last, cycle of funding. The report and the addendum provide a complete overview of UNFIP activities during the first year of operations. Information is also made available with respect to the new programming approach that UNFIP and the United Nations Foundation, Inc. are embarking on in 1999.



## Third funding round

1. Detailed information concerning the first two funding cycles of 1998 is contained in the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Fund for International Partnerships (UNFIP) contained in document A/53/700. Member States may recall that initial information was provided in the report with respect to the third tranche, namely, that the UNFIP secretariat had received a total of 189 concept papers, 46 of which were selected for review by the UNFIP Advisory Board at its meeting on 4 December 1998. Of those, a total of 40 were endorsed by the Advisory Board for consideration by the United Nations Foundation, Inc. (UNF). On 2 February 1999, the Foundation announced the approval of its third round of grants, totalling some \$31.7 million for 25 projects involving 14 United Nations organizations. The grants were distributed along the following thematic percentage lines: population and women, 36 per cent; environment, 34 per cent; children's health, 10 per cent; and other areas, 19 per cent. A list of projects approved by the Foundation showing the breakdown by theme, region and agency, is contained in the annex below.

2. The third funding round represents the last funding cycle for the first year of UNFIP/UNF operations. As at February 1999, the Foundation has thus awarded a total of approximately \$87 million for United Nations projects, with 35 per cent earmarked for population and women; 20 per cent for environment; 25 per cent for children's health; and 19 per cent for other areas.

## Next steps

3. Based on the experience gained during the course of the first year of operations, agreement has been reached between the United Nations and the Foundation, in consultation with the Secretary-General's Advisory Board and the Foundation's Board of Directors, on a revised and more streamlined process of programme development for funding by the Foundation. The experience of 1998 provided a basis for the consideration of improvements to the methods of work. It was recognized, for example, that the process of solicitation, review and selection of project proposals needed to promote a greater degree of strategic and programmatic focus. It also needed to encourage the definition of ways to measure the achievements and impact derived from the UNF contribution. The goal of the revised programming approach is to work more closely with the Foundation in the definition of priorities and focus within the broad areas of programmatic concentration already identified by UNF. The

intent is also to promote greater inter-agency consultation in the definition of opportunities to be pursued by the United Nations system with UNF funding.

4. This new approach entails the establishment of so-called Programme Framework Groups (PFGs), which will provide guidance for the preparation of specific projects. The fundamental task of a given PFG will be to identify programmatic opportunities within the given priorities and, taking account of the Foundation's financial parameters, propose the most effective use of UNF support. Separate PFGs will be set up in respect of the following programme areas of ongoing and particular interest to the Foundation: population and women, focusing particularly on adolescent girls and the quality of reproductive health services; children's health, focusing particularly on decreasing childhood mortality and promoting tobacco-free children and youth; and environment, focusing particularly on climate change and biodiversity. It is not foreseen that a PFG will be established to provide guidance for the development of proposals falling outside these priority areas, specifically in support of the Secretary-General's reform programme, in view of the very limited funding allocated by UNF to these types of proposals and the wide range of issues covered.

5. At the time of writing, the revised programming approach was just beginning to take shape. More precisely, the PFG on Population and Women and the PFG on Children's Health have been established, and commenced their work in mid-February 1999. The following United Nations entities are participating at the senior policy level in the PFG on Population and Women: the Department of Economic and Social Affairs of the Secretariat, the Joint and Co-sponsored United Nations Programme on Human Immunodeficiency Virus/Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome (UNAIDS), the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), the United Nations Development Fund for Women (UNIFEM), the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) and the World Health Organization (WHO). The PFG on Children's Health is composed of UNAIDS, UNFPA, UNICEF and WHO. Both PFGs have two external participants: the Population Council and the International Center for Research on Women for the PFG on Population and Women; and Emory University and Johns Hopkins University for the PFG on Children's Health. UNFIP and the Foundation participate in the two Groups in an *ex officio* capacity. The World Bank participates in the work of the PFGs given its major sector lending in the two thematic areas.

6. The programme frameworks that will emanate from the above PFGs, as well as from the PFG on Environment, which will begin its work later in the year, are expected to

be reviewed in the first instance by the Secretary-General's Advisory Board and then by the Board of Directors of the United Nations Foundation. Once a given framework is approved by the Board of Directors, the United Nations system at large will be so informed and the framework proper will be utilized as the basis for the development of future proposals for UNF funding. Further details on the revised programming approach and its results and additional information on the overall activities of UNFIP will be provided to the General Assembly in the next report of the Secretary-General on the Fund.

7. There has been a change in the composition of the UNFIP Advisory Board as set out in paragraph 17 of the Secretary-General's report (A/53/700): it will be recalled that the President of the Economic and Social Council is a member of the Advisory Board; with the change in the presidency of the Council in January 1999, Ambassador F. Paolo Fulci has replaced Ambassador Juan Somavía on the Board.
