9. The situation in Côte d'Ivoire

During the period under review, the Security Council held 12 meetings in connection with the situation in Côte d'Ivoire, including two closed meetings with the troop- and police-contributing countries,³⁶ and adopted four resolutions under Chapter VII of the Charter. The Council continued to focus on political developments in Côte d'Ivoire in the areas of disarmament, demobilization and reintegration; security sector reform; national reconciliation and the preparations for and holding of the 25 October presidential election; as well as the relevant role and mandate of the United Nations Operation in Côte d'Ivoire (UNOCI).³⁷

The Council twice extended the mandate of UNOCI and the French forces which supported it,³⁸ in accordance with the recommendations contained in the reports of the Secretary-General.³⁹ During the period under review, the Council further reduced the military component of UNOCI and affirmed its intention to consider a further downsizing with the possibility of terminating the mission after the October 2015 presidential election on the basis of the security conditions and the capacity of the Government of Côte d'Ivoire to assume its security responsibilities, while acknowledging the reconfiguration of the military presence of UNOCI. The Council also welcomed the full operationalization of the quick reaction force established by resolution <u>2162 (2014)</u> to implement the mandate of UNOCI.

The Council twice renewed and modified the sanctions measures, including extension of the mandate of the Group of Experts.⁴⁰ The Council partially lifted the arms

embargo and decided that supplies of non-lethal equipment and the provision of any technical assistance training or financial assistance intended to enable the Ivorian security forces to use only appropriate and proportionate force while maintaining public order would no longer require notification to the Committee.⁴¹ Notably, the Council terminated the measures preventing the importation by any State of all rough diamonds from Côte d'Ivoire.42
