

5. The situation in Sierra Leone

During the period under review, the Security Council held one meeting and adopted one presidential statement in connection with the situation in Sierra Leone. It received a briefing by the Executive Representative of the Secretary-General for Sierra Leone and Head of the United Nations Integrated Peacebuilding Office in Sierra Leone (UNIPSIL) on the final report of the Secretary-General on UNIPSIL. The Council further was briefed by the Chairperson of the Sierra Leone country-specific configuration of the Peacebuilding Commission.

At its 7148th meeting, on 26 March 2014, the Council highlighted the success achieved in Sierra Leone in the areas of peacebuilding and post-conflict stabilization, and stressed the importance of continued international support. Several Council members recognized the crucial role of the Special Court for Sierra Leone in proving criminal justice and fostering reconciliation in the country.¹⁹ The Council adopted one presidential statement on the completion of the mandate of UNIPSIL and commended the remarkable achievements made by Sierra Leone.²⁰
