## 1. The situation concerning Western Sahara

During the period under review, the Security Council held four meetings, including two private/closed meetings,<sup>2</sup> and adopted two resolutions in connection with the situation concerning Western Sahara. By resolutions <u>2152 (2014)</u> and <u>2218 (2015)</u>, respectively, the Council extended the mandate of the United Nations Mission for the Referendum in Western Sahara (MINURSO)<sup>3</sup> for periods of one year.
