20. Items relating to the situation in the former Yugoslavia

A. The situation in Bosnia and Herzegovina

During 2014 and 2015, the Security Council held six meetings concerning the situation in Bosnia and Herzegovina, and adopted two resolutions. The High Representative briefed the Council four times on the developments covered in his latest reports. The Council twice extended for periods of 12 months the authorization of the multinational stabilization force (European Union Force – EUFOR) and the continued presence of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) in the country, including authorization for the participating Member States to take all necessary measures to assist both organizations in carrying out their missions. At its 7481st meeting, on 8 July 2015, following a vote, the Council did not adopt a draft resolution on the item.
