## **Global Education for All Meeting**

# **Concept Note**

### 1. Introduction

The 2014 GEM will be the last global meeting of all EFA partners before the World Education Forum 2015 in Korea, which will mark the target date of the Dakar goals. It is therefore an event at which, in light of the latest data and analysis concerning EFA progress, key decisions will be taken with regard to a) actions during the last part of the road towards 2015, b) preparations for the World Education Forum 2015 and c) the post-2015 education agenda. In addition, the GEM is a space where participants will share knowledge and experience in an open and interactive manner; review commitments taken at the 2012 GEM, which took place at UNESCO's Headquarters in Paris from 21 to 23 November; debate and compare policies and approaches; and agree on strategies and joint action for addressing education challenges in the year(s) to come. The GEM has replaced since 2012 the annual meetings of the former Working Group and High-Level Group on EFA in the global EFA coordination architecture.

#### 2. Objectives of the Meeting

The purpose of the 2014 GEM is to provide a global platform for dialogue, coordination and collaboration on education development goals. Its objectives are to:

- i) critically *review progress towards the six EFA goals* based on the 2013/2014 EFA Global Monitoring Report (GMR), regional reports and other documents, including initial findings from the National EFA 2015 Reviews; identify bottlenecks holding back progress as well as ongoing initiatives, notably acceleration and 'big push' actions, in order to overcome them; and discuss remaining steps in the EFA process up to 2015, in particular with regard to the finalization of the National EFA 2015 Reviews and the debate of their outcomes at national and regional levels in preparation for the World Education Forum 2015; and
- ii) discuss the *post-2015 education agenda* and the outline and elements of the Framework for Action to be adopted at the World Education Forum 2015; as well as the position, shape and scope of the education agenda in the post-2015 global development agenda.

#### 3. Expected Outcomes

- i) Ministerial/leaders' statement 1-2 pages (to be prepared to the extent possible in advance of the GEM)
- ii) Agreed position on a goal, priorities and targets for education beyond2015
- iii) Detailed roadmap and work plan up to the World Education Forum 2015, spelling out the process for further developing the future education agenda and Framework for Action
- iv) Agreement on a communication and advocacy strategy aiming to ensure that education is centrally integrated in the post-2015 development agenda
- v) Strengthened knowledge base on EFA.

#### 4. Format

The three-day GEM will consist of:

- a) a Ministerial/Leaders' Meeting for Ministers, Vice-Ministers and heads of other EFA constituencies;
- b) a Senior Officials' Meeting; and
- c) a 'Forum' of Parallel Sessions, organized by participating governments and partners, around 3 key themes. The proposed themes are "Increasing Equity and Inclusion – What works?"; "Quality of Education – Teaching and Learning Practices"; and "Skills for Life and Work – Empowering Young People and Adults". Participants wishing to organize a parallel session will be invited to submit proposals to UNESCO.

All sessions, including those of the Ministerial/Leaders' Meeting, will start with very brief presentations to introduce the open plenary debates, which will be guided by moderators in a dynamic and lively manner.

The Working Languages for the Plenary Sessions are English, French, Spanish and Arabic. For the parallel Forum sessions, interpretation will be arranged in as many languages as possible.
