# Executive Summary

**Disclaimer:** The objective of the Executive Summary is to highlight the key salient issues and not to provide a comprehensive coverage of all topics discussed in the report.

## Major events

In April, unlike the previous month, few major events took place. The following are highlighted:


- UNESCO Sharjah Prize for Arab Culture (15 April)
- Launch of the report "Financing Education in sub-Saharan Africa – Meeting the Challenges of Expansion, Equity and Quality" (27 April)

The graphic to the right shows media coverage including these two events.

The award ceremony for the UNESCO Sharjah Prize for Arab Culture generated media coverage in the United Arab Emirates, Sudan, and the Gulf region. The press release announcing the prize-winners was widely quoted in regional newspapers.

The launch of the Institute for Statistics' report on Financing Education in sub-Saharan Africa received limited but quality coverage, with articles in *Afrique en ligne*, *AllAfrica.com*, *This is Africa (Financial Times)*, *Jeune Afrique*, *Afrique 7*, *Afrique 24*, *TV5*, *France Ô*, *Telesud*, *L'Express*, *RFI*, *The Guardian Developer Blog*, *Mareeg*, *Monsters and Critics*, *BBC Africa service*, *NieuwsBank*, *Diario Sur*, *North Korea Times*, *Yahoo News*, *AFP*, *Xinhua*, and *DPA*.

## Media


The peaks in coverage this month clearly relate to news stories with only an indirect connection to UNESCO, such as the bombing in the World Heritage site of Jamaâ El Fna in Morocco and the attempted airline hijacking allegedly by a member of the Kazakh delegation to UNESCO, and the Preah Vihear dispute.

The only peak resulting directly from UNESCO activities or events is associated with the announcement on 7 April of the winner of the Guillermo Cano World Press Freedom award, imprisoned Iranian journalist Ahmad Zeidabadi.

As indicated in the graphic to the right, English leads this month with 560 articles, followed closely by Spanish (548), French (506) and German (415). Between them, these four languages account for approximately 86% of all coverage in major international and national titles.

When all media monitored by the system are taken into account (including local and regional), Spanish leads with 21.4% of articles, followed by English (20.5%) German (18.3%), French (9.2%), Russian (8.9%), Arabic (4.4%), Portuguese (4%). Chinese is further down the ladder with 0.68%.

## UNESCO Website and Social Media Channels

With fewer major events in April, web visits decreased in all regions with the exception of Asia (+0.32%): Oceania -35.32%, South America -23.01%, Europe -14.37%, Africa -14.17%, North America -5.23%.

Asia thus moved into third position in visits by geographical origin, with Africa slightly surpassing Oceania to move into fifth place: Europe accounted for 35% of visits in April, North America 25%, Asia 16%, South America 14%, Africa 5% and Oceania 4%.

The overall growth of social media is rapidly shifting traffic from the web to new channels. UNESCO's social media channels continue to gain popularity, particularly the Chinese miniblog Sina Weibo which was started on 26 February this year and already has over 50 000 fans. Meanwhile, UNESCO's Facebook page is experiencing steady growth with 2 330 new fans this month. Likewise, UNESCO's official Twitter page now has 11 238 fans, a 21% increase on last month.

UNESCO Weibo's followers increased by 37% in April with it now ranking second among all UN agencies and offices. Two campaigns were particularly successful in April: "Kizuna" - a message of hope for Japan's school children", and "World Book and Copyright Day" have received more than 1 000 re-tweets and many positive comments.

A week-long campaign relating to the International Year of Forests proved to be popular on Facebook. Two photo stories attracted a significant number of 'Likes': on UNESCO's Biosphere Reserves and on youth acting to protect cultural heritage in Egypt.





Live Tweeting from events is proving to be a good strategy to attract new fans. Fifteen live Tweets were sent out from the UNESCO-organized conference in the United States of America, 'Interregional Philosophical Dialogue between Africa and the Americas – "Africa and its Diaspora"'. Over the three days of the conference, UNESCO's Twitter page gained 213 new fans.

## UNESCO Publications

The Portuguese edition of one of UNESCO's most important publishing projects, the eight-volume *General History of Africa* (*História geral da África*) remains the most viewed publication on UNESCO's online database this month. Published in December last year, the Portuguese volumes were accessed almost 24 000 times in April, accounting for 3.2% of the total 738 000 PDF consultations.

Spanish-language publications on education and the Spanish edition of the 2005 UNESCO World Report Towards Knowledge Societies (*Hacia las sociedades del conocimiento*) were also very popular in April, reflecting the ongoing active interest in education policy throughout Latin America and the Caribbean.

As illustrated in the graphic to the right, although 61% of the consultations of major UNESCO outputs were of editions published in the current biennium, previous years' titles are still sought after - for example, Spanish editions of *Towards Knowledge Societies* (2005) and *Seven Complex Lessons in Education for the Future* (1999).



## **Major events:**

### **I. UNESCO Sharjah Prize for Arab Culture (15 April)**

The 9<sup>th</sup> Edition of the **UNESCO - Sharjah Prize for Arab culture** was hosted at Headquarters on April 15<sup>th</sup> with the following two events, with the presence of Sheikh Sultan Al Qassimi.

- The awards ceremony for the Prize, and
- A special tribute to Professor Mohammed Arkoun, late president of the international jury of this Prize, including two round tables.

Two eminent cultural personalities, one from France and the other from Sudan, received the 2010 UNESCO - Sharjah Prize for Arab Culture, recognizing their lifelong work that addresses major challenges in promoting Arab performing arts for dialogue and reconciliation.

Fifteen high level scholars and official representatives participated in two round tables devoted to the issue of Islamic Humanism in Mohammed Arkoun's thinking and to his career.

**Participants:** 800 people in Room I (350 more participants than in 2010)

**Audience:** Executives UNESCO Permanent Delegates, UNESCO Senior staff and guests, non-governmental organizations, academics and scholars, students in Arabic culture, journalists.

#### **Press coverage:**

The award ceremony for the UNESCO Sharjah Prize for Arab Culture generated media coverage in the United Arab Emirates, Sudan, and the Gulf region. Forty journalists and media workers were accredited for this event. The TV channel Al-Arabiya and the Emirates' channel aired reports made on site with pictures of the award ceremony and the intervention of the DG, the Governor of Sharjah and the laureates. The press release announcing the prize-winners was widely quoted in regional newspapers (25 articles based on UNESCO press release).


The announcement of the Sharjah Prize had only minimal impact on UNESCO's Facebook page. A link to the press release received 31 likes, while 41 fans liked the photo gallery of the two prize-winners.

## **II. Launch of the report “Financing Education in sub-Saharan Africa – Meeting the Challenges of Expansion, Equity and Quality” (27 April)**

On April 27, the UNESCO Institute for Statistics released a new report, entitled *Financing Education in Sub-Saharan Africa: Meeting the Challenges of Expansion, Equity and Quality*. The report presents comprehensive and timely data on the financing of education in 45 African countries. It also includes historical data to track financing trends since the World Education Forum in 2000. In short, it provides the statistical evidence to evaluate the policy trade-offs in responding to the rising demand for primary and secondary education across the region.

The report was launched during two events on 27 April. At Headquarters, DPI organized a press breakfast for about 10 journalists reporting on education issues and Africa. On the same day, UIS statisticians presented the report during an event organized with the Brookings Institute in Washington DC.

Other forthcoming presentations: UNESCO New York Office will be organizing a presentation of the report for UN staff on 17 May. UIS director will be presenting the report to UNESCO Education Staff and Permanent Delegations on 11 May.

Additional requests came from *Le Monde*, *The East African*, *IPS*, *Africa Confidential*. All have indicated they are writing about the report.

Several interviews were done with media outlets. Requests for interviews on the report continue to be made.

### **Social media:**

The UIS Report on education investment in Africa was fairly popular on Tweeter. Three Tweets were sent out one of which was re-tweeted 27 times.

## 1. UNESCO Website - <http://www.unesco.org>

UNESCO publishes a wide array of web content. Although the majority is today available primarily in English and French, content is increasingly available in the six official languages of the Organization, as well as in certain subportals in Portuguese, Vietnamese, and others. Today over 5.68 million unesco.org pages (many of course database driven) are referenced by Google.

UNESCO's website traffic is measured today through tags embedded in pages. With these, **page views**, **visits**, and **visitors** are tracked. It must be noted that the totals do not cover all UNESCO traffic as not all content is yet tagged, and some UNESCO content is currently published in non unesco.org sites (eg Google docs, Facebook, Twitter, certain institute and field office websites, etc.). Thus traffic totals may be lower than in reality. Year-to-year trends are however an accurate reflection for the majority of content, as the pages tagged have been consistent for several years. In turn, certain other statistics, such as publication downloads (which are measured through our UNESDOC tool) may be far too high since we can only currently measure hits on a document rather than successful downloads.

### Traffic indicators explained:

**Page views:** The page view is the most widely used indicator to reflect the level of traffic to a website. A page view is counted when the page requested by the user is loaded into the internet browser. Note: Page views are very different from the outdated concept of 'hits'. A 'hit' is counted for each of the many elements in a Web page (i.e. image, animation or video are all counted as separate 'hits', while a page view counts all elements on a page as one page view).


**Visits:** A visit is defined as a series of page requests from the same uniquely identified client with a time of no more than 30 minutes between each page request.

**Visitors:** A Visitor counts once within the timescale of 30 minutes. A visitor can make multiple visits. Identification is made to the visitor's computer, not the person, usually via cookie and/or IP+User Agent. Thus the same person visiting from two different computers will count as two Visitors.

- **Highest Traffic Day:** 2<sup>nd</sup> August: all time record of pages views: **578 734** (World Heritage Committee - New World Heritage sites announced)

- **Highest traffic month:** March (**2,5 MM visits** and **6,9 MM pages views** – L'Oréal prizes, Water day and Women's day)


### 1.1 Traffic Variation: April 2011 vs. April 2010 and 2009



The decrease in web traffic is in line with global trends. Overall web page traffic across the internet has been declining in the last year as social media traffic (e.g. Facebook, Twitter, YouTube, etc) has skyrocketed. Webtrends (March 2011) shows 68% of the Fortune 100 (the largest firms in the World in market capitalization) saw an average 23% decline in web traffic from 2009 to 2010 as social media took off. 65% of non e-commerce companies now receive more visits to their Facebook pages than their websites.

### Daily Web Traffic Patterns



### Geographical origin of visits in April








UNESCO products for written and audiovisual media are:








The two peaks at the end of the month correspond mainly to the bomb attack on the Jamaâ El Fna World Heritage site in Morocco and the attempted airline hijacking allegedly by a member of the Kazakh delegation to UNESCO. The peak on the seventh of April can be attributed to the announcement of the winner of this year's Guillermo Cano World Press Freedom Prize. The second peak on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of April is due to renewed skirmishes on the Thai Cambodian border, near the World Heritage site of Preah Vihear, in which six people died. Coverage of the ceremony for the Sharjah prize was minor and limited to a few titles in the countries concerned.





### 3. UNESCO's Social Media Channels

UNESCO has been utilizing social media since September 2009 after signing a strategic partnership with YouTube to promote UNESCO video content in the six official languages of the Organization. Facebook became an official UNESCO communication channel in September 2010, as did Twitter, the microblogging website. UNESCO registered a page on Sina Weibo, the most popular form of social media in China, similar to Twitter (which is not accessible in China) in February this year. On 16 March, Youku, a Chinese video sharing site, became the latest official UNESCO social media channel.

UNESCO's social media channels continue to gain popularity, particularly Sina Weibo which was started this year on 26 February, and already has over 50 000 fans. Meanwhile, UNESCO's Facebook page is experiencing a steady growth with 2 330 new fans this month. Likewise, UNESCO's official Twitter page now has 11 238 fans, a 21% increase on last month.

UNESCO's Sina Weibo channel now ranks second among UN agencies and Country Offices. The number of followers rose by 37% in April. During the last two weeks of April alone, UNESCO's Sina Weibo account gained more than 10,000 followers, bringing the total to 50 000. With the increase of fans, the influence of UNESCO's Weibo is growing.

In terms of content, Sina Weibo started an initiative to post information about UNESCO's Member States. The initiative draws information from the "States in Focus" section of the Member States website ([www.unesco.int](http://www.unesco.int))

Two campaigns on Sina Weibo in April were particularly popular. Firstly a post on 'Kizuna' – a message of hope for Japan's school children" was posted on 29 April and become the most popular message on UNESCO's Sina Weibo channel to date. It was been re-tweeted 1 825 times, and received 155 comments. Secondly, posts relating to "World Book and Copyright Day" received more than a 1 000 re-tweets and several positive comments.

A week-long campaign relating to the International Year of Forests, which highlighted various UNESCO programmes, proved to be popular on Facebook. One photo story in particular about UNESCO's Biosphere Reserves attracted 261 'Likes'. A photo story from the field about how UNESCO's Cairo Office is mobilizing local youth groups to safeguard their cultural heritage generated considerable interest on Facebook in April and received 169 'Likes'.

Live Tweeting from events is proving to be a good strategy for attracting new fans. SHS sent out 15 live Tweets from the UNESCO-organized conference in the United States of America, 'Interregional Philosophical Dialogue between Africa and the Americas – "Africa and its Diaspora"'. Over the three days of the conference, UNESCO's Twitter page gained 213 new fans.








Breakdown of 1368 photo requests by origin in April 2011






The UNESCO Library collections offer an overview of the Organization's current and past activities and programmes as recorded in print publications and other resources.

## 6. Publications - <http://www.unesco.org/new/en/unesco/resources/publications/>

'UNESCO publications' cover the output of the programmes of the Organization and feature in the biennial Publications Plan. They are produced in a variety of formats (books, CD-ROMs, ebooks, etc.) and are classified into different categories (global and regional reports, monographs, reviews, technical studies, atlases, etc.). They are distributed for free via UNESCO's networks and on-line, or as sales products under the 'UNESCO Publishing' imprint.

The Portuguese edition of one of UNESCO's most important publishing projects, the eight-volume *General History of Africa (História geral da África)* remained the most viewed publication on UNESCO's online database this month. Published in December last year, the Portuguese volumes were accessed almost 24 000 times in April, accounting for 3.2% of the total 738 000 PDF consultations.

Spanish-language publications on education and the Spanish edition of the 2005 UNESCO World Report *Towards Knowledge Societies (Hacia las sociedades del conocimiento)* were also very popular in April, reflecting the ongoing active interest throughout Latin America and the Caribbean in reviewing education policy agendas and developing common educational goals. This interest can also be seen in consultations of flagship UNESCO publications. Although 75% of the consultations of these major UNESCO outputs were of editions published in the current biennium, the Spanish editions of *Towards Knowledge Societies* and of the 1999 *Seven Complex Lessons in Education for the Future (Los siete saberes necesarios para la educación del futuro)* were in second and fourth place respectively.

The number of UNESCO publications available for viewing through Google Books continues to grow, with 123 titles now offered. These publications were viewed 11 392 times in April, a substantial rise of 29% over the March figure.

Books on world heritage and culture predominated among sales at the UNESCO Bookshop in April, and among online and international sales. Spanish editions from the series of short books on the silk and spice roads made up the Bookshop's three bestsellers, while four French editions of major Culture Sector publications featured in the top five bestsellers online and internationally: *Atlas des langues en danger dans le monde (Atlas of the World's Languages in Danger)*; Volumes 1 and 4 from the *History of Humanity (Histoire de l'humanité)* series; and *Aux sources des musiques du monde*.



In April 2011, **40 new logos** have been elaborated for internal and external audiences: 76% for the Secretariat, 10% for Intergovernmental Programme Members, 7% for Network Members, 7% for UNESCO Partners.
