Executive Summary

Disclaimer: The objective of the Executive Summary is to highlight salient issues and not to provide a comprehensive coverage of all topics discussed in the report.

Media and Major Events

The month of June was dominated by the annual World Heritage Committee meeting which took place in Doha (Qatar) between the 15th and 25th of the month. As usual, the event generated enormous media interest in all regions of the world, peaking on the days when new sites were being inscribed on the World Heritage List. This is clearly visible in the graph showing daily coverage about UNESCO in the world media.

The Committee decisions that generated most international media attention related to controversies around the status of the Great Barrier Reef and boundary changes to the Tasmanian Wilderness site requested by the Australian government, but refused by the Committee. The inclusion on the World Heritage List of the Qhapaq Nan (Inca Trail) in Latin America and the Grotte Chauvet in France also prompted excellent coverage beyond national borders.

Earlier in the month, the announcement of new biosphere reserves received reasonable media attention, limited mainly to the countries in which the new reserves are located. The release of the new policy papers by the GMR team, showing a severe drop in aid to education, and stagnating out-of-school figures also did fairly well, especially in countries where the problems are most marked, including India.

The opening of the "People, Book, Land" exhibition, organized by the Simon Wiesenthal Centre and UNESCO, received some coverage – mostly in Israel and France.



UNESCO Website and Social Media Channels


For the third year in a row the summertime confirms its low traffic trend. As a result, page views dropped by 12%, but peaked on 23 June with almost 240K page views to the World Heritage Centre website, and especially to the new inscribed properties on the World Heritage List. As every year, the World Heritage Committee meeting represents a source of web traffic to the unesco.org website.

On our specialized web sites: on "unesco.int" page views dropped for the third consecutive month, but remain well above last year's traffic during the same month (+51%); visits to "Unescommunity" increased this month by 45%, pages views by 50% with a particular interest for the "Staff meeting with the Director-General" held on 10 June.

Articles monitored daily in all media sources in which "UNESCO" appears in a story




Total number of articles in all media rose by 28% since May

Visits: -20% ; Page views -12%




June was a strong month for social media channels, starting with the #UNESCOCup hashtag trending in Italy on Twitter, on the day of the first-ever UNESCO football cup. Our annual World Heritage Committee proved to be a boon for social media in all languages. New sites helped generate significant new likes and followers on our social media channels corresponding to the sites' region and languages. Notably, the inscription of the Inca Route generated 3,456 likes/7,061 shares on Spanish Facebook. Retweets and tweets by the political leaders of Costa Rica, India, Mexico, among others, helped to drive traffic and interest.




Publications

Online viewing of UNESCO top ten publications in June has increased since May of this year (+16%) and compared to May last year (+49%). The two main flagship reports of UNESCO, the *EFA Global Monitoring Report 2013-2014* and the *World Water Development Report 2014*, continue to fare extremely well in the top ten downloads. Titles in Spanish and Portuguese account for almost two-thirds of the titles in this table. Bookshop and online sales were largely dominated by World Heritage titles with the exception of two SC titles on Climate Change and Harmful Marine Microalgae.




UNESDOC

The UNESDOC database contains to date some 144,000 records, and registered this month an outstanding 1.3 million downloads. While the number of downloads are fluctuating all over the year, they have been steadily growing in the past three months, representing an increase by 57% since March this year and by 61% compared to June last year. Top 20 downloads were exclusively for publications, in Portuguese, Spanish and English.



UNESCO visits

For the fourth month in a row, more than 1,000 visitors benefited of a guided tour of HQ. A 14% drop however compared to May, since June is usually an exam period for the visit's main target public. In addition, the Visitor Service also inaugurated this month the very first "Open UNESCO Campus" - dedicated this time to Ocean -, gathering 359 young people for a comprehensive briefing on a major UNESCO theme by internal and international specialists. Focus on a Field Office

Major events:

I. 26th Session of the International Coordinating Council of the Man and Biosphere Programme (10-13 June)

The 26th Session of the International Coordinating Council (ICC) of UNESCO's Man and the Biosphere Programme (MAB), was held in Jönköping, Sweden in the vicinity of the East Vättern Landscape Biosphere Reserve, the youngest of the five Swedish biosphere reserves from 10 to 13 June 2014. The opening by the outgoing Chair of the MAB Council, Ms Boshra Salem, was followed by opening remarks of Mr Magnus Kindbom, Swedish State Secretary for Rural Affairs, Ms Anita Hansbo, the Vice Chancellor of Jönköping University and three University of Jönköping students who made a statement. The Director-General warmly welcomed the MAB-ICC delegates and made her opening remarks in a video message.



Following the election of the new MAB ICC Bureau, a new Chairperson was elected, M. Sergio Guevara Sada from Mexico.



East Vättern Scarp Landscape (Sweden)

As decided by the Council, 13 new biosphere reserves were approved, including two transboundary biosphere reserves, three biosphere reserves withdrew from the World Network of Biosphere Reserves (WNBR) and five biosphere reserve extensions were approved. The WNBR is now composed of 631 biosphere reserves in 119 countries including 14 transboundary biosphere reserves.

The Council made decision on 88 recommendations formulated by the International Advisory Committee for Biosphere Reserves on periodic review reports, including 43 decisions related to reports received in connection with the implementation of the exit strategy adopted at its last session.

Furthermore the Council welcomed the presentation of Ms Ana Luisa R. Figueroa (Mexico), Director of Islands of the Gulf of California Flora and Fauna Protection, winner of the 2014 Michel Batisse Award on her case study "A group of fishermen and fishing families became guardians of the San Pedro Martir Island, which is part of the Islas del Golfo de California Biosphere Reserve". The Council endorsed six winners of the 2014 MAB Young Scientist Award.

With regard to date and venue of the twenty-seventh session of the MAB-ICC to be held in Paris, the proposed dates are 8-12 June 2015.

Observers from the following Member States were present: Albania, Argentina, Austria, Canada, China, Colombia, Democratic People's Republic of Korea, India, Indonesia, Italy, Niger, Nigeria, Norway, Oman, Pakistan, Poland, Peru, Serbia, Switzerland, The former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Turkey, and United States of America.

Press coverage: Press coverage for this event was limited mainly to those countries in which new biosphere reserves were named, which is to be expected, and based almost entirely on the press release issued by the Media Services section. Coverage was particularly good in the countries of Latin America and Germany. The news was also well reported in Albania, Italy, Japan, Malaysia, and Spain. Despite the translation of the media advisory into Swedish (thanks to the National Commission), there was virtually nothing in the Swedish press apart from two stories in a local news outlet and on a minor website. Part of the explanation for this lies in the location of the meeting at Jönköping, some 280 kilometres south-west of Stockholm, and a long way from any key media centre. Another disincentive for Swedish journalists was the fact that no Swedish biosphere reserve was named.

Social media: Interest for UNESCO biospheres has grown a bit on social media, relative to the past two years, with 210 likes on Facebook. This is due largely to the fact that few people know that biospheres constitute a distinct category of UNESCO sites. II. 38th Session of the World Heritage Committee (15-25 June)

The 38th session of the World Heritage Committee was held in Doha, Qatar from 15 to 25 June. During the session the Committee reviewed 142 state of conservation reports (concerning 150 sites, see [here](#)) for sites already inscribed on the World Heritage List, and added 26 new sites to the List. Four extensions were added to existing sites. Three sites were added to the List of World Heritage in Danger, and one was removed. The World Heritage List now numbers 1,007 properties: 779 cultural, 197 natural and 31 mixed in 161 countries. Myanmar had a site inscribed on the List for the first time.



This was the third session to be live webstreamed via the World Heritage Centre website, with all Committee documents available to the public.

There was also extra media attention due to the announcement by Qatar's Prime Minister Abdullah bin Nasser bin Khalifa Al Thani, at the beginning of the session, of a \$10 million donation to a new fund for protecting World Heritage sites affected by conflict or natural disaster, as well as financing other projects.

Participants: 1,164 badges were distributed in total, including 1,711 Website registration and 37 international journalists attending the Committee (these are participants in the Committee session only; higher number of badges last year is due to the fact that it included all local, technical, cleaning etc staff present as well).

Press coverage: This year's Committee meeting confirmed yet again that it is the premier media event on UNESCO's annual calendar. Stories on new sites and decisions taken concerning several others were carried in leading international, national and local media in all regions. A steady stream of articles was published and broadcast in the weeks prior to the meeting. On the 18th of June, more than 3,000 stories on the subject were monitored in world media... and this is not an exhaustive figure. From the start of the meeting on the 14th to the end on the 25th, the media services section monitored a total of 19,564 articles.


Press highlights include interviews with the BBC, Al Jazeera, CCTV, ABC and SBS (Australia), Kyodo News (Japan), SABC (South Africa), TBS (South Korea), FR3 (France), RFI, Reuters, AFP, AP, DPA, Qatar News Agency, The Times of India, The Australian, Science and The Guardian (UK and Aus). Al Jazeera devoted an edition of its prestigious current affairs programme "Inside Story" to the protection and conservation of cultural heritage and the work of the Committee, and The Gulf Times published a series of special features on World Heritage just prior to and during the meeting.

The fact that the meeting was webcast proved to be particularly advantageous, allowing journalists to cover the meeting from a distance and to use video extracts from the streaming for television news reports.

Social media: World Heritage posts were very successful this year, especially for the Inca Road, which was 'liked' almost 3,500 times on Facebook in Spanish, and the Great Himalayan National Park on Twitter in English (944 RTs). New listings such as la Grotte Chauvet, Jeddah, and the Grand Canal set off new likes and followers on our channels in Arabic, Chinese and Spanish. Laura Chinchilla (President of Costa Rica), Narendra Modi (Indian Prime Minister) and the Mexican Presidency all retweeted from UNESCO's accounts, and tweeted support for their countries' new World Heritage inscriptions. Plans are under way to work with all countries to promote their new listings on all national social/digital assets, such as Tourism Boards, and Ministries of Culture.

Two chronic problems must be corrected for next year: 1. Photos of the sites submitted to the World Heritage Centre must be available for use on social media. This is still not the case, because of a clause in our internal nomination documents. We will start to anticipate next year's Committee already. 2. Delegations should all be briefed, well in advance of the Committee, to require that relevant national communications social media channels be ready to communicate with UNESCO on new inscriptions. The absence of such procedure limits considerably the outreach potential of the World Heritage Committee on new media.

III. Scientific conference and commemorative event on the underwater cultural heritage of the First World War (26-28 June)



The following day an orchestra played the Last Post while flowers were lain down at the West Diep heritage site of WWI. A Dive for Peace Day gathered dive clubs and societies on WWI underwater heritage. A call of UNESCO on all ships at sea to sound a signal in memory of WWI and to respect its submerged heritage was taken up by port masters and cruiselines worldwide.

The First World War left behind thousands of submerged heritage sites that today, a hundred years later, are precious heritage falling finally and with the centenary of their sinking under the protection of the UNESCO 2001 Convention on the Protection of the Underwater Cultural Heritage.

Beijing launches its new Office website in 2 languages

In June 2014, during the Director-General Irina Bokova's visit to China, the Beijing Office launched its new website: www.unescobej.org



At the end of 2013, UNESCO's Division of Public Information in partnership with UNESCO's Beijing Office, launched a pilot project to expand UNESCO's outreach to the Chinese public, with the support of the private sector in China. Under this project, a dedicated Public Information team based in Beijing composed of a Web Developer and a Content Creation Specialist developed a bi-lingual (English and Chinese) website with the Drupal open-source content management framework and with the "look and feel" of the new UNESCO global website.

The new website aims to increase UNESCO's visibility among the Mandarin speaking community in China and abroad by providing content about UNESCO's programmes implemented in the North-East Asia Cluster.

As opposed by its predecessor, it is characterized by enhanced use of photos, videos and infographics, while the homepage integrates social media accounts: "Sina Weibo" (microblogging) and "Youku" (social media platform for online video sharing).

Director-General's visit to China (2-5 June 2014)

The Director-General's official trip to China has received wide local coverage with almost 300 articles on the Chinese media, covering the key events during the visit: the Inauguration of the new Category II Center IKCEST, the Director-General's meeting with President Xi Jinping and the First Lady Peng Liyuan, the inauguration of the Suzhou World Language Conference, and the DG's speech at Tsinghua University on "Leadership, Soft Power and Values for a Better Future of All." UNESCO also renewed its media partnership with Xinhua News Agency.



Highlights on events: Annual China UNESCO World Heritage Forum

Jointly organized by the UNESCO Beijing Office and the World Natural Heritage Conservation and Research Centre of the Chinese Ministry of Housing and Urban-Rural Development, in Shilin (Yunnan Province) on 4-5 June, the forum attracted 16 Chinese mainstream media providing visibility to the event in newspapers, magazines and on TV. Beijing Office's Programme Specialist for Culture was interviewed by the channel CCTV4 for a documentary on World Heritage. In addition, the Shilin Forum was promoted through Sina Weibo and Wechat with more than 10,000 viewers of the news.











A page view is counted when the page requested by the user is loaded into the internet browser. Note: Page views are very different from the outdated concept of 'hits'. A 'hit' is counted for each of the many elements in a Web page (i.e. image, animation or video are all counted as separate 'hits', while a page view counts all elements on a page as one page view).

² **Visits:** A visit is defined as a series of page requests from the same uniquely identified client with a time of no more than 30 minutes between each page request.

³ **Visitors:** A Visitor counts once within the timescale of 30 minutes. A visitor can make multiple visits. Identification is made to the visitor's computer, not the person, usually via cookie and/or IP+User Agent. Thus the same person visiting from two different computers will count as two Visitors.




The month of June was dominated by the annual World Heritage Committee meeting which took place in Doha (Qatar) between the 15th and 25th of the month. As usual, the event generated enormous media interest in all regions of the world, peaking on the days when new sites were being inscribed on the World Heritage List. This is clearly visible in the graph showing daily coverage about UNESCO in the world media.

The Committee decisions that generated most international media attention related to controversies around the status of the Great Barrier Reef and boundary changes to the Tasmanian Wilderness site requested by the Australian government, but refused by the Committee. The inclusion on the World Heritage List of the Qhapaq Nan (Inca Trail) in Latin America and the Grotte Chauvet in France also prompted excellent coverage beyond national borders.


Earlier in the month, the announcement of new biosphere reserves received reasonable media attention, limited mainly to the countries in which the new reserves are located. The release of the new policy papers by the GMR team, showing a severe drop in aid to education, and stagnating out-of-school figures also did fairly well, especially in countries where the problems are most marked, including India.

The opening of the “People, Book, Land” exhibition, organized by the Simon Weisenthal Centre and UNESCO, received some coverage – mostly in Israel and France.



3. UNESCO Social Media Channels

June was a strong month for social media channels, starting with the #UNESCOCup hashtag trending in Italy on Twitter, on the day of the first-ever UNESCO football cup. Our annual World Heritage Committee proved to be a boon for social media in all languages. New sites helped generate significant new likes and followers on our social media channels corresponding to the sites' region and languages. Notably, the inscription of the Inca Route generated 3,456 likes/7,061 shares on Spanish Facebook. Retweets and tweets by the political leaders of Costa Rica, India, Mexico, among others, helped to drive traffic and interest.

Spanish Facebook account shows this month again the strongest growth in likes (+21%); A 404% increase compared to January 2014










'UNESCO publications' cover the output of the programmes of the Organization and feature in the biennial Publications Plan. They are produced in a variety of formats (books, CD-ROMs, ebooks, etc.) and are classified into different categories (global and regional reports, monographs, reviews, technical studies, atlases, etc.). They are distributed for free via UNESCO's networks and on-line, or as sales products under the 'UNESCO Publishing' imprint.

Online viewing of UNESCO top ten publications in June has increased since May of this year (+16%) and compared to May last year (+49%). The two main flagship reports of UNESCO, the *EFA Global Monitoring Report 2013-2014* and the *World Water Development Report 2014*, continue to fare extremely well in the top ten downloads. Titles in Spanish and Portuguese account for almost two-thirds of the titles in this table. Bookshop and online sales were largely dominated by World Heritage titles with the exception of two SC titles on Climate Change and Harmful Marine Microalgae.




