Executive Summary

Disclaimer: The objective of the Executive Summary is to highlight salient issues and not to provide a comprehensive coverage of all topics discussed in the report.

Media and Major Events

The top media event for UNESCO in the global media during the month of October was World Teachers' Day. The press release issued by UNESCO revealing new data on qualified teachers was picked up by media across all regions. The other UNESCO event that drew press interest was the Cultural Industries forum, held in Florence, although coverage was mainly limited to Italian news outlets.

In other news about UNESCO, the press release announcing that a wreck off the Haitian coast was not Christopher Columbus' Santa Maria also made headlines around the world, promoting articles in top tier media including Le Monde, The Guardian, El Mundo, The Washington Post, CBC, the BBC and scores of others.

Otherwise, much of the reporting about UNESCO during the month concerned remarks made by the Director-General on a several issues. These included the awarding of the Nobel Peace Prize to Malala Yousafzai and Kailash Satyarthi, about which Ms Bokova was interviewed live by CNN, the BBC, Radio France International, Deutsche Welle and National Public Radio; the continuing destruction of cultural heritage in Iraq and Syria; and the condemnations of the murders of two Mexican journalists, including a "citizen journalist" who used social media to report on organized crime.

Articles also began to appear in different regions on elements nominated for inscription on the intangible heritage register.






UNESCO Website and Social Media Channels

Web traffic has been growing for the third month in a row, but remains slightly lower than last year in the same period. October is usually one of the most busy months, and October 2014 is no exception with 2.6 million visits to our public website. Mobile and tablet browsers made up 22% of the total traffic. The specially developed page for the 70th anniversary of UNESCO scored almost 1,500 views per day since its go-live date on 30 October.

UNESCO.int registered a whopping 72% increase in page views during the Executive Board month, and Unescommunity - who celebrated this month its 2nd anniversary -, performed also very well (+170% in page views), especially with articles about the Executive Board.







October 2014 saw a compelling variety of innovative initiatives as а Twitter takeover such @GuardianTeach, an infographic competition with the world's lead infographic site Visual.ly, and an exclusive Al Jazeera "The Stream" show aired on Oct 27 (stream.aljazeera.com/story/201410272102-0024294), connecting live TV with UNESCO experts and our social media channels. This dynamism drove growth on UNESCO's social media channels in all languages, with remarkable performance in Arabic & French Twitter, and Spanish & Portuguese Facebook. Having doubled our combined audiences from 1.2 million last year to 2.4 million today, our social media channels generate stronger pick-up for each message we publish. It leaves no doubt in the judiciousness of our strategic decision to centralize content through global accounts.

Our partnerships with the Guardian newspaper and Al Jazeera "Stream" show the importance of tapping into the large social media communities of our "traditional" media partners. "Traditional" media is massively developing specialized communities on social media which we must target as a priority growth area in the future.

The Brasilia Office deserves special applause for the quality of social media content it designed. A simple but elegant "Parabéns" to Malala for winning the Nobel Prize was shared over 10K times.

A "Selfie" competition, with irresistibly adorable promotional visuals, proved a crowd-pleaser for World Teachers' Day

It underscores the critical need for in-house graphic design, as social media – which is increasingly driven by visual imagery – is becoming a visual messaging strategy.


This month, more than 520,000 video views were registered on our YouTube channels (all combined), a 25% increase compared to September. Intangible heritage videos viewings continue to dominate by far.


Publications


Online viewing of UNESCO's top ten publications in October is difficult to estimate due to lack of figures for the whole month. Extrapolating from the two weeks where figures were available it is likely that the viewing was on the increase compared to September last and October 2013. The two main flagship reports of UNESCO, the EFA Global Monitoring Report 2013-2014 and the World Water Development Report 2014, continue to fare well in the top ten downloads. Titles in Spanish account for more than 60% of the publications in this table with the UNESCO World Report Towards Knowledge Societies in Spanish in second position. Page views on Google Books have more than doubled since the same period in 2013. Bookshop and online sales were largely dominated by titles on heritage and on education.



Major events:

I. Third UNESCO World Forum on Culture and Cultural Industries (02-04 October 2014)

The third edition of the UNESCO World Forum on Culture and Cultural Industries took place from 2 to 4 October 2014 in Palazzo Vecchio, Florence, Italy. The event, organized in cooperation with the Italian Government and with the support of the Tuscany Region and the Municipality of Florence, was devoted to the theme "Culture, Creativity and Sustainable Development. Research, Innovation, Opportunities".

The objectives of this edition, were to share experiences and propose strategic recommendations on the role of culture and cultural industries in promoting sustainable development, showcase the results of the UNDG Post-2015 Dialogues on Culture and Development, and inform the elaboration process of the UN Post-2015 Development Agenda.

The Forum was opened by Irina Bokova, Director-General of UNESCO; Dario Nardella, Mayor of Florence; Mario Giro, Undersecretary of State for Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation of Italy; Sara Nocentini, Regional Advisor on Culture and Tourism; and Dario Franceschini, Minister of Cultural Heritage and Activities and Tourism of Italy.

Organized in plenary sessions and thematic panel discussions, the Forum was devoted to the following topics: Culture and Creativity: a Double Commitment to the Future; Cultural Industries, Employment and Growth; Nurturing Culture for the Sustainable Development of Urban and Rural Areas; Innovation, Technology and Know-How for Sustainable Futures; The Power of Culture for Inclusive Societies; New Approaches to Measuring Change; Investing in Culture; and Culture and the Post-2015 Development Agenda.

Keynote speakers included Mari Elka Pangestu, Minister of Tourism and Creative Economy of the Republic of Indonesia; Olga Kefalogianni, Minister of Tourism of Greece; Vittorio Gregotti, architect of international renown; Elizabeta Kanceska-Milevska, Minister of Culture of the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia and Mabel Causarano, Minister of Culture of Paraguay.

The plenary on "Culture and the Post-2015 Development Agenda" represented a defining moment of the Forum. Introductory remarks were given by Irina Bokova, Director-General of UNESCO and by Gina Casar, Under-Secretary General and Associate Administrator of UNDP, and representatives of the Governments of Serbia, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Morocco and Mali presented the results of national consultations on Culture and Development. The session was closed by Gustavo Meza-Cuadra, Permanent Representative of Peru to the UN and Chair of the Group of Friends on Culture and Development, and by Luis Mora, Representative of UNFPA.



The Forum resulted in the adoption of the <u>Florence Declaration</u>, a strategic document putting forth the core principles and priorities for culture and cultural industries within the post-2015 development agenda and calling governments, civil society and private sector actors to take action in global partnership to promote creative environments, processes and products.

Press coverage: Most of the coverage about the Forum came from the Italian media, however the event also drew the attention of news outlets in several other countries. The national Italian tv network, RAI, reported exhaustively on the event, and the ANSA and Adnkronos news agencies issued several dispatches. Interviews were done with the DG, programme specialists and other participants by journalists from leading titles, such as Le Monde or De Morgen (Belgium), as well as the EFE news agency (Spain), IPS, Russian news outlets and news media from as far away as Finland and Denmark.

Social media: Top message was: "Culture is our most powerful force for creativity & renewal. It must be central to the global development agenda" (100 RTs) Because the city of Florence – a WH site – was one of the organizers, it was an opportunity to showcase photos of the city's architectural marvels. Given that this Forum was a high-level affair, outreach efforts via social media were necessarily limited. It must be highlighted that key Forum participants - such as the City of Florence (@ComuneFi) & Mario Giro – shared our messages via Twitter. This is standard practice in the social media of most UN agencies, and this reflex should become systematically integrated in the communications planning process.







II. Report of mission to Haiti to investigate shipwreck (03 October 2014)

In May 2014, the American explorer Barry Clifford announced that he had discovered the remains of the famed Columbus wreck of the *Santa Maria* off Cap Haitien, Haiti. The announcement made immediate headlines internationally. Due to doubts about the identification of the wreck, the Minister of Culture of Haiti requested in June 2014 the UNESCO 2001 Convention's Scientific and Technical Advisory Body (STAB) to assist Haiti.

The UNESCO STAB sent an operational mission to Haiti, which took place from 5 to 22 September 2014 with strong cooperation of the UNESCO Port au Prince Field Office and the Haitian Ministry of Culture as well as backstopping from HQ. The UNESCO team made a careful examination of the site, and submitted a report to the STAB shortly after the completion of the mission. The Secretariat then contacted a wide number of experts, both from Europe and the US, in order to get their opinions on the information gathered during the mission. Based on the opinions of the experts, the STAB concluded that the site was not the *Santa Maria*. This opinion was expressed in the official UNESCO evaluation report on 3 October 2014, which was provided to the Ministry of Culture of Haiti on 6 October 2014. The report presents all of the evidence gathered during the mission, as well as the analysis and opinions of the other experts.

The report was published on 6 October and subject of a DPI press release. Its findings where reflected by several hundreds of articles in the international press.

A wider investigation of Haiti's underwater cultural heritage is now envisioned. History Channel, Discovery Channel and Arte have requested to be allowed to cover the further research of UNESCO.


Press coverage: The press release announcing the outcome of the UNESCO mission was reported around the world, with over 600 stories monitored in media across all regions, including such leading titles including Le Monde, the BBC, El Mundo and the Washington Post.

Social media: Our tweets about this report received tepid interest – unsurprisingly so, given its speculative nature. But the global media took to it with great interest especially on the Twittersphere, as evidenced by many tweets – retweeted thousands of times – published on the details of the mission.

III. World Teachers' Day (05 October 2014)

In recalling the commitments made by the international community in 1966, UNESCO and its partners ILO, EI, UNDP, UNICEF and the International Task Force on Teachers for Education for All organized, on the occasion of the 20th anniversary of World Teachers' Day (WTD), a series of events at UNESCO HQ on 6-7 October. The official WTD celebration was opened by Qian Tang, Assistant Director-General for Education. The forum entitled "Teaching today: an international overview of professional development and conditions of work", allowed a large range of public (teachers, education specialists, researchers, student teachers, education ministry personnel, general public...) to discuss and exchange during the four participative workshops on "Life and working conditions of teachers", "Teachers' continuous professional development", "How can ICT support teacher training?" and "Pedagogical innovations in education".

For the first time this year, the UNESCO-Hamdan Prize was awarded at HQ on Tuesday 7 October. This 3rd edition of the Prize rewarded Oxfam Novib and Education International (Belgium) for the programme "Quality Educators for All: Every Child needs a Good Teacher (Quality-Ed)"; SOS Villages d'Enfants (Madagascar) for its "Teacher Training Programme"; and ProEd Foundation (Panama) for its "Teachers Teaching Teachers – Professional Learning Community (PLC)" project. The Prize ceremony was chaired by Qian Tang, Assistant Director-General for Education and the trophies and certificates were offered to the winners by H.H. Sheikh Hamdan Bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Deputy Ruler of Dubai and the United Arab Emirates Minister of Finance, and Irina Bokova, Director General of UNESCO.





A conference entitled "Teachers for the 21st century" was also organized on 7 October. The two-day celebrations were concluded by a concert – supported by the Hamdan Award Foundation – of the famous kora player from Mali, Balaké Sissoko.

In addition, 200 events were organized worldwide and pinned on the events map. From 8 to 19 September, an online consultation on the themes of the four forum workshops were held, and the conclusions were shared during the Forum's opening.

A major effort was made by UNESCO and partners to sponsor 50 experts from around the world to be present at the event resulting in a discussion spanning experiences from all regions.

Press coverage: The press release highlighting the lack of qualified teachers in different regions of the world was published widely in several regions. At least 120 articles were monitored in English and French alone – all of them referencing UNESCO's data concerning teachers, and all transmitting the Organisation's concern over the global shortage of trained teachers.

Social media: On WTD, @UNESCO did a Twitter take-over of @GuardianTeach – a specialized education channel of the Guardian Newspaper, with 75K followers at the time of this operation. From 2pm to 4pm (UK time), we had full control of the Guardian's account. This exceptional opportunity allowed us to recruit new audiences back to @UNESCO. UNESCO's Director of Teaching Policy, Edem Adubra (@Adubra_E), fielded questions from @GuardianTeach followers.

This communications scheme demonstrates great potential in tapping into the large social media communities of our "traditional" media partners. It is the perfect way of improving synergies, within UNESCO, between media relations and social media. This will be a priority growth area for the coming year. The top message, on both @GuardianTeach and @UNESCO, was: "5 demands to improve teacher well-being on World Teachers Day. Do you agree? @GuardianTeach. This message, combined with another by @EFAreport on the launch of a toolkit for teachers advocacy, performed better than any other message we've posted in the past 3 years for World Teachers Day. They are concrete, with a strong advocacy drive, that is missing from much of our communications material on the Day. This angle should be looked into for the upcoming edition of WTD. The Brasilia office did a wonderful "Selfie" photo competition, with adorable visuals that proved a crowd-pleaser for World Teachers' Day.

IV. 1st Global Forum on Youth Policies (28-30 October 2014)

The first Global Forum of Youth Policies was held from 28 to 30 October 2014, in Baku, Azerbaijan, hosted by the Ministry of Youth and Sport of Azerbaijan. Co-convened by the Office of the UN Secretary-General's Envoy on Youth, UNESCO, UNDP, and the Council of Europe, the Forum allowed to take stock of progress in the development, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of youth policies, since the adoption of the World Programme of Action for Youth in 1995.

Bringing together more than 700 participants from 165 countries, with a strong participation of ministers responsible for youth, experts, youth advocates, civil society representatives, UN representatives, international and regional organizations, to discuss youth policies through three different lenses (thematic, structural and region-specific), the Forum responded to the importance of looking at youth policy work in a holistic and multi-stakeholder perspective. It distilled lessons learned and good practices, while also identifying key challenges, in particular within the context of the Post-2015 Development Agenda.

The three-day Forum concluded with the launch of the "Baku Commitment to Youth Policies" which highlights 8 guiding principles for integrated and inclusive youth policy development and 10 concrete commitments made by the co-conveners of the Forum and open to all international, regional and national stakeholders interested in joining this global partnership. Among these, the most prominent is the launch of a Global Initiative on Youth Policies that will provide technical assistance to governments and countries that are in the process of developing national youth policies. UNESCO will be collaborating closely with co-conveners to operationalize the Initiative and to provide national governments and youth stakeholders with a concrete mechanism and tool for policy advice and support.

The top messages concern issues of cardinal importance for today's youth – the mismatch between education and skills, and the current state of youth policy. It is unfortunate that our partner's resources are not available in languages other than English, where these messages could get considerably more mileage.

V. Launch Ceremony for the celebration of the 70th Anniversary of UNESCO – Tribute to Nelson Mandela (31 October 2014)

La cérémonie de lancement des célébrations du 70e anniversaire de l'UNESCO en hommage à Nelson Mandela s'est tenue le 31 octobre au Siège de l'Organisation. Plus de 1 000 personnes se sont déplacées pour assister à l'événement durant lequel discours, témoignages et performances artistiques se sont succédé pour rendre hommage à Nelson Mandela.

Ouverte par la Directrice générale, Irina Bokova et présentée par l'ADG/ERI, Eric Falt et l'artiste franco-malienne Inna Modja, la cérémonie était marquée par la présence et l'intervention du Président de la République d'Haïti, Michel Martelly, invité d'honneur, dont c'était la première visite officielle à l'UNESCO. De nombreuses personnalités ont également pris part à l'événement, notamment Nathi Mthethwa, ministre des Arts et de la culture d'Afrique du Sud; Pr. Iba Der Thiam, député de l'Assemblée nationale, représentant Macky Sall, Président de la République du Sénégal; Lakhdar Brahimi, ancien Représentant spécial du Secrétaire général des Nations Unies en Afrique du Sud; Jean Chabi Orou, Ambassadeur du Bénin et Président du Groupe africain à l'UNESCO; Mohamed Sameh Amr, Président du Conseil exécutif de l'UNESCO et Hao Ping, Président de la Conférence générale de l'UNESCO.

Ponctuant les interventions, les performances artistiques des Mahotella Queens, groupe de danse et de chant sud-africains, de Sally Nyolo, chanteuse camerounaise, accompagnée par l'artiste de Sand Art, David Myriam, de Sam Tshabalala, chorégraphe et de sa troupe, et de Mory Kanté, chanteur et musicien guinéen, ont été une autre forme d'hommage.

Plus tôt dans la journée, Irina Bokova inaugurait deux expositions présentées au Siège de l'UNESCO: « *Cultiver une culture de la paix* », exposée sur les grilles de l'Organisation, présentant les lauréats et finalistes du Prix Alfred Fried de photographie 2014, et "*Nelson Mandela - de prisonnier à président*", consacrée à Nelson Mandela et à son action, qui a remporté un vif succès auprès des visiteurs et du personnel.

Le colloque qui précédait immédiatement la cérémonie, intitulé « L'héritage de Mandela : la voie vers un avenir commun de paix et de solidarité », a réuni quelque 500 personnes autour de personnalités telles que Nathi Mthethwa, ministre des Arts et de la culture

d'Afrique du Sud, représentant le gouvernement d'Afrique du Sud et en particulier l'African National Congress (ANC), le parti politique de Nelson Mandela ; le Professeur Akinwande Oluwole Soyinka, poète et dramaturge nigérian, premier auteur africain à recevoir le prix Nobel de littérature (1986).

Ces événements, ont bénéficié du soutien de Marianna Vardinoyannis, Ambassadrice de bonne volonté de l'UNESCO, des Délégations permanentes d'Afrique du Sud et de la République populaire de Chine auprès de l'UNESCO, et du Musée de l'apartheid et des Editions Lammerhuber.

A l'occasion de ces manifestations, un Campus OPEN UNESCO était organisé dans la même semaine et a accueilli 55 jeunes de banlieue de l'association « Fête le Mur », créée par le chanteur et ancien champion de tennis Yannick Noah, pour évoquer Nelson Mandela et ses actions.

Press coverage: This event was mainly an internal activity and did not generate any mainstream media coverage.

Social media: The hashtag #unesco70 was launched for the 70th anniversary celebrations and will be used throughout 2015. Unfortunately, it was not communicated on time to Haitian president <u>@MichelJMartelly</u>, who actively covered his visit to UNESCO on his Twitter & Facebook, which have almost 100K and 160K followers respectively. Again, this is evidence of a need to include social media in the communications planning of our external relations work. In the past month, we have lost out on too many opportunities to position UNESCO on the highly influential streams of our partners, which often have millions of followers. This operational gap must be closed — especially since just about every leading organization today has understood the value of increasing its outreach, through strategic positioning on the accounts of top influencers.







Focus on UNESCO Office in Doha

To highlight the outreach efforts of Field Offices, the report focuses each month since January 2014 on a different Field Office, and publishes the results of their public information activities. For further details, please contact directly the office concerned.

Improving the Office's visibility

The UNESCO Doha Office serves as the Cluster Office for Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, Kuwait, United Arab Emirates, Oman and Yemen. In recent months, the Office has been building up both in terms of human resources and visibility, enabling the team to rethink its communication strategy and achieve the following visibility milestones. The Office's website is the main communication tool and is still going through development.

- A new website was launched in October 2014 using several platforms (links to social media accounts, video messages, photo albums, highlights) to offer information that is as diverse and rich as possible and provide insights into the main activities conducted by the office. So far, the Office has published an average **three to four articles** a week. With the new website available, the Office observed a rise in website traffic in October 2014 with 1,973 page views (+79%) and 575 visits (+53%), compared to September 2014.
- The UNESCO Office in Doha serves seven countries. As such, its website aims to reflect the diverse activities
 undertaken in the region, both in terms of geographical location and sectors. The website is available in Arabic and
 English and a strategy for translation of all materials in both languages is currently being finalized.

Informing the public and partners about the Office's major activities



UNESCO Doha collaborates with Qatar University for AL-Bairaq project

UNESCO Doha is collaborating with Qatar University to launch the AL-Bairaq project, an outreach Programme which encourages high school students to discover and practice research methodologies and innovative scientific experiments with the Qatar University Center for Advanced Materials (CAM). The initiative is part of UNESCO Doha's efforts to unlock the potential of young people in Qatar to engage in activities related to science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM)



Building a strong foundation for Open Educational Resources in Bahrain

Within the framework of guaranteeing universal access to high quality education, UNESCO together with the Ministry of Education of the Kingdom of Bahrain and the Regional Centre for Information and Communication Technology (CICT) organized a three-day "National Workshop on Developing Open Educational Resources (OER) Policies", in Manama, Bahrain,



Consultation meeting with National Commissions of the GCC to UNESCO

To reinforce cooperation and establish a comprehensive plan for joint programming, the Doha Office organized for the first time a two-day consultation meeting with Secretaries General of the GCC National Commissions. The consultation was also an opportunity for the office to enhance its visibility in each cluster country through the National Commissions.



Inaugural International Day to End Impunity for Crimes Against Journalists

To inaugurate the first International Day to End Impunity, the Doha Office took part in various events in Qatar to mark November 2nd to convey the Director-General's message and share information about the implementation of the UN Plan of Action for the Safety of Journalists and the Issue of Impunity. Numerous interviews were conducted with local and international media, including a live interview on Al Jazeera English.



World Innovation Summit for Education

UNESCO was well represented during the WISE Summit for Education with the presence of the Assistant Director-General for Strategic Planning, Hans D'Orville as well as colleagues from the Education Sector both at Headquarters and in field offices. A video highlighting UNESCO's visibility during WISE will soon be available on the office's website.

In the press

The UNESCO Doha Office was represented in Qatar media with at least 5 newspaper articles, 3 video interviews and 2 radio interviews in October. During the same period, the Office was also featured in Bahrain, Kuwait and Oman. In addition, UNESCO Doha Office has partnered with major local newspaper in Qatar to issue a series of dedicated pages in conjunction with COP 18 and the World Heritage Committee promoting UNESCO's role and activities. As part of UN Day, an Op-Ed written by all UN Agencies operating in Bahrain was published in a local newspaper to which UNESCO Doha Office contributed.

The UNESCO Doha Office has launched a new photo gallery to enable website's visitors to access photos linked to events organized by the Office as well as events attended by the UNESCO Doha team. The Office also intends to produce more video materials to promote the Office's activities.


Both a communication and a knowledge management tool, UNESCO's websites, with over 2.7 million pages of content, are today a key component of its public information strategy. Maintained by Corporate Web Services in close collaboration with the Programme Sectors, the main site is updated continually in all 6 UN languages (with some subportals also in Portuguese, Vietnamese, et al).

Web traffic shown here (page views, visits, visitors, country and language of visit, etc) has been measured since September 2011 with the free Google Analytics toolset via tags embedded in pages. More detailed statistics on specific programmes can be made available to the responsible officers upon request (contact v.pham@unesco.org).

Web traffic has been growing for the third month in a row, but remains slightly lower than last year in the same period. October is usually one of the most busy months, and October 2014 is no exception with 2.6 million visits to our public website. Mobile and tablet browsers made up 22% of the total traffic. The specially developed page for the 70th anniversary of UNESCO scored almost 1,500 views per day since its go-live date on 30 October.

UNESCO.int registered a whopping 72% increase in page views during this Executive Board month, and Unescommunity - who celebrated this month its 2nd anniversary -, performed also very well (+171% in page views) especially with the articles about the Executive Board.



¹ Page views: The page view is the most widely used indicator to reflect the level of traffic to a website. A page view is counted when the page requested by the user is loaded into the internet browser. Note: Page views are very different from the outdated concept of 'hits'. A 'hit' is counted for each of the many elements in a Web page (i.e. image, animation or video are all counted as separate 'hits', while a page view counts all elements on a page as one page view).

² Visits: A visit is defined as a series of page requests from the same uniquely identified client with a time of no more than 30 minutes between each page request.

³ Visitors: A Visitor counts once within the timescale of 30 minutes. A visitor can make multiple visits. Identification is made to the visitor's computer, not the person, usually via cookie and/or IP+User Agent. Thus the same person visiting from two different computers will count as two Visitors.




The top media event for UNESCO in the global media during the month of October was World Teachers' Day. The press release issued by UNESCO revealing new data on qualified teachers was picked up by media across all regions. The other UNESCO event that drew press interest was the Cultural Industries forum, held in Florence, although coverage was mainly limited to Italian news outlets.

In other news about UNESCO, the press release announcing that a wreck off the Haitian coast was not Christopher Columbus' Santa Maria also made headlines around the world, promoting articles in top tier media including Le Monde, The Guardian, El Mundo, The Washington Post, CBC, the BBC and scores of others.


Otherwise, much of the reporting about UNESCO during the month concerned remarks made by the Director-General on a several issues. These included the awarding of the Nobel Peace Prize to Malala Yousafzai and Kailash Satyarthi, about which Ms Bokova was interviewed live by CNN, the BBC, Radio France International, Deutsche Welle and National Public Radio; the continuing destruction of cultural heritage in Iraq and Syria; and the condemnations of the murders of two Mexican journalists, including a "citizen journalist" who used social media to report on organized crime.

Articles also began to appear in different regions on elements nominated for inscription on the intangible heritage register.



3. UNESCO Social Media Channels

October 2014 saw a compelling variety of innovative initiatives – such as a Twitter takeover of @GuardianTeach, an infographic competition with the world's lead infographic site Visual.ly, and an exclusive Al Jazeera "The Stream" show aired on Oct 27 (stream.aljazeera.com/story/201410272102-0024294), connecting live TV with UNESCO experts and our social media channels. This dynamism drove growth on UNESCO's social media channels in all languages, with remarkable performance in Arabic & French Twitter, and Spanish & Portuguese Facebook. Having doubled our combined audiences from 1.2 million last year to 2.4 million today, our social media channels generate stronger pick-up for each message we publish. It leaves no doubt in the judiciousness of our strategic decision to centralize content through global accounts.

Our partnerships with the Guardian newspaper and Al Jazeera "Stream" show the importance of tapping into the large social media communities of our "traditional" media partners. "Traditional" media is massively developing specialized communities on social media which we must target as a priority growth area in the future.

The Brasilia office deserves special applause for the quality of social media content it designed. A simple but elegant "Parabéns" to Malala for winning the Nobel Prize was shared over 10K times. A "Selfie" competition, with irresistibly adorable promotional visuals, proved a crowd-pleaser for World Teachers' Day. It underscores the critical need for inhouse graphic design, as social media – which is increasingly driven by visual imagery – is becoming a visual messaging strategy.

An application has been specially developed for conducting the statistical consultation of electronic files (PDFs) from 1 January 2006.






The UNESCO Library collections offer an overview of the Organization's current and past activities and programmes as recorded in print publications and other resources.

'UNESCO publications' cover the output of the programmes of the Organization and feature in the biennial Publications Plan. They are produced in a variety of formats (books, CD-ROMs, ebooks, etc.) and are classified into different categories (global and regional reports, monographs, reviews, technical studies, atlases, etc.). They are distributed for free via UNESCO's networks and on-line, or as sales products under the 'UNESCO Publishing' imprint.


Online viewing of UNESCO's top ten publications in October is difficult to estimate due to lack of figures for the whole month. Extrapolating from the two weeks where figures were available it is likely that the viewing was on the increase compared to September last and October 2013. The two main flagship reports of UNESCO, the *EFA Global Monitoring Report 2013-2014* and the *World Water Development Report 2014*, continue to fare well in the top ten downloads. Titles in Spanish account for more than 60% of the publications in this table with the UNESCO World Report *Towards Knowledge Societies* in Spanish in second position. Page views on Google Books have more than doubled since the same period in 2013. Bookshop and online sales were largely dominated by titles on heritage and on education.





5. Profile of visitors




