The project is part of a broader EU initiative to support civil society and media and is implemented by the UNESCO Amman office in close coordination with the main state and non- state media institutions in lordan.

The project is funded by the European Union and implemented by the UNESCO Amman Office in close cooperation with the Ministry of State for Media Affairs and the media community in Jordan.

The project will be implemented in close collaboration with the media and has two phases, with the first one focusing on research and analysis of the contemporary media landscape. This will shape the structure and implementation of activities in the second phase.

ASSESSING MEDIA DEVELOPMENT ordan

In order to understand the contemporary Jordanian media landscape, and design activities to further improve the same, an assessment of the media situation in Jordan based on UNESCO's Media Development Indicators (MDI) is currently being carried out.

The MDI were developed with a view of providing a framework for an assessment and recommendations of how the media can best contribute to, and benefit from, good governance and democratic development.

The MDI look at five aspects of the media environment. Taken as a whole, they provide an in-depth picture of the media ecology and policy directions in order to ensure freedom of expression, pluralism and diversity of the media.

The Jordanian MDI analysis will be complemented with a comparative analysis of best Public Service Broadcasting (PSB) practices in selected EU countries and the contemporary practice in Jordan.

The MDI study in Jordan will form the basis for a review of the implementation of the Government's Action Plan for the Media Strategy, leading to a revised Action Plan agreed on by the media stakeholders. This will inform the designing of the capacity building activities in the project.

UNESCO has commissioned International Media Support (IMS) to conduct the MDI analysis for Jordan. IMS has brought together a competent research team comprising two international and four Jordanian researchers with extensive experiences in media development and research.

In addition to Tunisia, Egypt and Palestine, Jordan will be the fourth Arab country for which the MDI have been assessed. The assessment is expected to be published in July 2015.

First Advisory Board meeting in February 2015

To ensure qualitative oversight of the MDI study, UNESCO and IMS established an Advisory Board, comprising eight key Jordanian experts able to bring senior advice to the MDI research team and the study.

The Advisory Board provides input and guidance to the research team on methodology, qualitative oversight of the study, experts' input on the assessment process, and feedback on the draft assessment report and its recommendations.

Members of the board are Dr. Bassem Tweisi, Dean of the Jordan Media Institute, Dr. Marwan Muasher, vice president for studies at Carnegie Endowement for International Studies, Dr. Muhanad Al-Azzah, member of the Upper House of Parliament, George Hawatmeh, director of Awan organization, Mohammad Qtaishat, specialized lawyer, Dr. Helmi Sari, head of the social science faculty at the University of Jordan, Lina Ejeilat, co-founder and Editor-in-Chief at 7iber.com, and Rana Sweis, a Jordanian freelance iournalist.

NATIONAL CONSULTATIONS & EXPERT GROUPS

The Support to Media in Jordan project team is currently organizing consultation sessions across the Kingdom to establish an informed discussion on the Jordanian media landscape, media development and the preliminary findings of the MDI study.

To ensure a comprehensive approach, two sessions will take place in the north province, three in the middle province and three in the south province within the next months.

Each session will include 15-20 participants in a two-hour meeting and will host representatives from the government, state and non-state media, students, academia, CSO's, MP's, citizen journalists, etc.

In addition to the consultations, the Project Team is also arranging five thematic working groups to further inform the second phase of the project as well as the drafting process of the Media Strategy Action Plan.

UNESCO will facilitate the thematic groups in April and May, and use the inputs to draft an Action Plan that will be presented to the project's Steering Committee and the Government for their consideration. Expert groups are organized around the following themes:

- Public Service Broadcasting 1.
- Self-regulation of the media, independent complaints mechanism for the media 2.
- 3. Journalism education and journalism training
- Regional broadcasters: private, public and community owned 4.
- 5. Media literacy
