# **Executive Summary**

**Disclaimer:** The objective of the Executive Summary is to highlight salient issues and not to provide a comprehensive coverage of all topics discussed in the report.

#### **Media and Major Events**

Overall, media coverage for November fell by 20 percent over the same period in 2013. Nonetheless, several events kept UNESCO in the headlines around the world during the month.

The first International Day to End Impunity for Crimes against Journalists (2/11) drew the attention of the press in all regions. An op-ed by the Director-General on the issue was published in Liberation (France), the Miami Herald (USA), the Mail and Guardian (South Africa), El Universal (Mexico) and Al Hayat (Pan-Arab). The press release issued by UNESCO for the event was relayed by scores of news outlets, especially in Latin America, and many more reported on their own national situations. The Education for Sustainable Development Conference also received excellent news coverage, especially in Japan where it was hosted, but also in several African and Latin American nations. An op-ed by the Director-General on the issue was published in Asahi-Shimbun, one of Japan's leading dailies, The Standard (Kenya), the Journal du Mali and the Huffington Post (U.S).


Like the ESD conference, most of the coverage for the conference in New Delhi on ITC's and Disabled People, came from local and regional media, with reports in *The Times of India, Bangladesh News, The Asian Age* and the *India Education Magazine*, among others.


However, the biggest story of the month, in terms of press coverage was the annual meeting of the Intangible Heritage Committee. As can clearly be seen in the graph opposite, daily press coverage increased significantly during the meeting, especially during the inscription of new elements (24 to 28 November). The overwhelming majority of articles monitored during this period were devoted to the new elements. The figures are almost identical to last year's coverage of this event.

Earlier in the month, the Director-General's visit to Iraq was also well covered with articles on Ms Bokova's statements during the visit reported in all regions of the world. Many of the stories that appeared on the web were accompanied by television footage by the Reuters news agency, shot during the Director-General's visit to the Baghdad Museum. Ms Bokova was also interviewed at length by the *Christian Science Monitor* (US) and Associated Press (AP), whose stories were relayed by scores of other media.

#### **UNESCO Website and Social Media Channels**

November traffic was stable compared to last month's high figures. It shows only a 7 percent drop in page views compared to the same month last year, when UNESCO hosted the General Conference.

These results are explained by the significance of the November major events, such as the International Day to End Impunity for Crimes Against Journalists, the UNESCO World Conference on Education for Sustainable Development, the International Conference "From Exclusion to Empowerment" and the meeting of the Intergovernmental Committee for the Safeguarding of the Intangible Cultural Heritage among others, that brought many users to the dedicated websites.

On unesco.int, page views increased for the third month in a row (+17%) and have almost doubled compared to same month last year - who peaked at that time during the General Conference.

The most viewed pages on Unescommunity were articles about Staff Day 2014, the medals assigned to MSS, the HRM tutorials and the Correspondence microsite.


In November 2014, UNESCO has 2.5 million followers in key social media channels, in all 6 UNESCO languages, up from 1.3 million exactly one year ago. As social media is increasingly driven by visual imagery, this month we focused efforts on improving the look and feel of our social media communications. This effort proved to be immensely helpful for audience understanding of, and engagement with, UNESCO's activities. Coverage of International Day for Tolerance and World Philosophy Day – two of our more popular awareness days on social media – benefited immensely from this approach compared to past years. Our Arabic Twitter had its most successful posts ever thanks to creative, original imagery. A post about Simone de Beauvoir was shared 29K times in Spanish.


#### **Publications**


Online viewing has slightly decreased compared to September and October (estimated figures) of this year but show a strong increase versus November 2013. The two main flagship reports of UNESCO, the *EFA Global Monitoring Report 2013-2014* and the *World Water Development Report 2014*, continue to fare well in the top ten downloads. Titles in Spanish account for 54 percent of the publications in this table with the UNESCO World Report *Towards Knowledge Societies* in Spanish in top position. Page views on Google Books have risen for four months in a row, and show a 79 percent increase compared to same month last year. Bookshop and online sales were largely dominated by titles on heritage and on education.



# Major events:

I. International Day to End Impunity for Crimes Against Journalists (02 November 2014): Seminar and Inter-regional Dialogue on the Protection of Journalists (03 November) and the Third UN Inter-Agency Meeting on the Safety of Journalists and the Issue of Impunity (04 November)

The inaugural International Day to End Impunity for Crimes against Journalists was commemorated by two main events, which both took place in Strasbourg, France on 3 and 4 November 2014. In addition, a High-Level Panel Discussion was convened at the United Nations Headquarters in New York as well as several local initiatives in Africa.

The Seminar and Inter-regional Dialogue on the protection of journalists was co-organized by UNESCO, the Council of Europe, the Centre for Freedom of the Media of the University of Sheffield, and the European Lawyers' Union on 3 November 2014. It brought together legal experts from different regions around the world to address the gaps in judicial frameworks and protective mechanisms for journalists and where improvements could be made. Concurrently, a High-Level Panel Discussion entitled "Ending Impunity: Upholding the Rule of Law" focused on the Rule of Law as a prerequisite for sustainable development and good governance. The event was a joint initiative of UNESCO and the Permanent Missions of Argentina, Austria, Costa Rica, France, Greece, and Tunisia to the United Nations.

On 4 November 2014 the third UN Inter-Agency Meeting on the Safety of Journalists and the Issue of Impunity reviewed the pilot phase of the UN Plan of Action on the Safety of Journalists and the Issue of Impunity. Attended by international participants from different stakeholders, the conference brought forth several recommendations for its second phase. Twenty-three NGOs reaffirmed their support to the UN Plan of Action in a public statement after the Meeting.

**Participants:** The main events brought together over 100 participants from more than 70 different organizations, including representatives from NGOs, IGOs, UN Agencies, Member States, Academia, and media practitioners.

**Audience:** The audience at the main events were the participants, including the following VIPs: Ms Leila M. De Lima, the Honourable Secretary of Justice of the Republic of the Philippines, Mr David Kaye, the UN Special Rapporteur on the promotion and protection of the right to freedom of opinion and expression, and Ms Dunja Mijatović, OSCE Representative of the Media. Mr Zeid Ra'ad Al Hussein, the UN High Commissioner for Human Rights, and Mr Ban Kimoon, UN Secretary-General, showed their support through a video message.

**Website statistics:** Media advisory: 90 visits/336 page views. <u>Int. Day to End Impunity for Crimes against Journalists webpage</u>: 2,169 visits/3,552 page views.

**Press coverage:** The event was extensively covered by media outlets in all regions. An op-ed by the Director-General was placed in *The Miami Herald, Liberation* (France), the *Mail and Guardian* (South Africa), *El Universal* (Mexico) and *Al Hayat* (Pan-Arab). Many national news outlets looked at the situation in their own countries, publishing features and editorials on the subject. Most stories referenced UNESCO's statistics on the killing of journalists.

**Social media:** An infographic competition with the world's lead infographic site Visual.ly (blog.visual.ly/infographic-competition-end-impunity/) resulted in a high number of quality submissions. 1 winner and 19 honorable mentions were selected. Interestingly, the majority of submissions came from Latin America, where press freedom is a top concern. It shows that our work strongly resonates with the Latin American public, and the need to focus more resources in content creation and social media outreach to this part of the world.

We also set up an Al Jazeera "The Stream" show aired on 27 October (stream.aljazeera.com/story/201410272102-0024294). The show is an example of social TV: the live TV programme is driven by real time social media input from audiences. # II. UNESCO World Conference on Education for Sustainable Development – Learning Today for a Sustainable Future (10-12 November 2014)

Organized by UNESCO and the Japanese Government, the World Conference on Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) was held from 10 to 12 November 2014 in Aichi-Nagoya, Japan, to mark the end of the UN Decade of ESD (2005-2014) and launch the Global Action Programme on ESD. Under the banner of "Learning Today for a Sustainable Future", it brought together more than 1,100 participants.

The conference was opened by the Director-General and His Imperial Highness the Crown Prince of Japan. Four plenary sessions, a high-level roundtable, 34 workshops, 25 side events and numerous exhibitions gave participants the opportunity to dialogue around challenges and opportunities of ESD, showcase their work and lessons learnt, and discuss specific ESD issues and key areas for scaling up activities under the Global Action Programme.

Major outcomes of the Conference are: 1) adoption of the Aichi-Nagoya Declaration, calling for urgent action to mainstream ESD and include ESD in the post-2015 development agenda; 2) launching of the Final Report on the UN Decade of ESD, Shaping the Future We Want; 3) launching of the Global Action Programme on Education for Sustainable Development, as official follow-up to the UN Decade, as well as a Roadmap for the Implementation of the GAP.

The conference was preceded by a set of Stakeholder Meetings which brought together key ESD stakeholder groups such as UNESCO ASPnet schools and youth representatives from 4 to 8 November 2014 in Okayama, Japan.

Participants: More than 1,100 participants from 150 countries.

**Press coverage:** The ESD conference did very well in the media, both in Japan and elsewhere. Articles were published in virtually all of Japan's leading dailies, and the top Japanese television network, NHK, along with other national television channels, broadcast regular stories from the event. Internationally, it was covered by several media from Latin America (O Globo, El Mercurio and Clarin), Mali, Morocco, Malawi and Egypt, and was relayed by UN Radio and UN News. The Director-General's op-ed on the subject was published in Asahi Shimbun (Japan), Le Journal du Mali, The Standard (Kenya), the Huffington Post and Al Gomohria (Egypt).

**Social media:** Though this event is largely for education experts, participants were very active, particularly on Twitter, and shared their thoughts using the hashtag #ESD. The Japanese press covered the event significantly and promoted it through their official social media channels.

To make the event relevant for the general public, a series of digital cards were developed, illustrating the spirit of our work. The one about Mandela performed best, especially in Spanish where it was shared 19K times. These cards were picked up by many partners, and widely shared.



# III. International Conference "From Exclusion to Empowerment – The Role of Information and Communication Technologies for Persons with Disabilities (24-26 November 2014)

The International Conference on the Role of ICTs for Persons with Disabilities took place in New Delhi, India from 24 to 26 November 2014. Organized by UNESCO and the Government of India, it brought together some 800 women and men from around the world (80 countries).

The event was opened with a video message from Professor Stephen Hawking, author of "A Brief History of Time" in which he appealed for the "need to make sure this technology becomes available to those who need it so that no one lives in silence."... "I speak for people who cannot hear," he said. "Without technology, I would not be able to ask for a cup of tea, let alone speak about my theory of the universe."

In her opening address, the Director-General, Irina Bokova highlighted that "promoting the rights of persons with disabilities is about human dignity -- it is also about sustainable development of communities and peoples".

In their keynote speeches, Dr Karan Singh, Member of India's Upper House of Parliament and India's representative to UNESCO's Executive Board and Sir Philip Craven, President of International Paralympic Committee stressed the importance of accessibility, legal rights and public awareness.

Furthermore, the international event included the 'We Care Film Fest 2014' film festival which committed its twelve years' experience to the Conference's cause, because film and media of all kinds (including social media) play a key cultural and attitudinal role in shaping the way that societies treat disability issues. 25 films on disability issues were screened over the three days.

The ICT exhibition organized as a part of the international event offered an excellent platform for visitors to learn about existing technological solutions, good practices and encourage a constructive dialogue on the opportunities ICTs offer for persons with disabilities.

More than hundred speakers from around the world contributed to the thematic discussions on partnerships and sustainable development, technological solutions and access to information and knowledge. The high level drafting group for the preparation of the Outcome Declaration was chaired by Mr Lenin Moreno, Former Vice-President of Ecuador and Special Envoy of the United Nations for Disability and Accessibility issues. The working group concluded its work with the Outcome Document – the New Delhi Declaration on Inclusive ICTs for Persons with Disabilities – Making Empowerment Reality. It calls everyone to change mindsets and attitudes by raising public awareness for a more inclusive and human rights oriented approach to disability issues, rather than a fundamentally medical approach. It also emphasizes the formulation of national legal frameworks and mechanisms, policies, budget, capacity plans to meet the needs and demands of people with disabilities, and urges the adoption and implementation of national accessibility standards. The Declaration also calls on the scientific and technological community to recognize the obligation of meeting the needs of persons with disabilities and consulting with them on specifications for accessible, affordable and inclusive products, services and content taking into account Universal "Design for All" principles.

**Press coverage:** The conference in New Delhi on ITC's and Disabled People was well covered in India. The national public service broadcaster was the official media partner for the event, which resulted in regular television reports by Doordarshan News (DD News) and on All India Radio. This included a half-hour feature on DD News, aired on 29 December. The Times of India also reported on the event. Internationally, the conference received coverage on Kuwait TV and Al Jazeera, but also in *the Bangladesh News* and *The Asian Age*, among others.

**Social media**: Live Twitter coverage was made available on @UNESCOnow. A Facebook post garnered 201 likes. Social media coverage was limited by a paucity of material intended for casual, non-expert audiences; most all content was directed at event participants. Interestingly, an exceptional video message for the event was recorded by the British scientist Stephen Hawking. We are currently trying to ask him to upload the video on his own Facebook, with a link to UNESCO's event. In the future, whenever we ask famous personalities to record messages, we should alter our strategy: Ask them to promote our activities on their social media sites, as their followers are necessarily more receptive to messages coming from them than from us.

# IV. 9th Session of the Intergovernmental Committee for the Safeguarding of the Intangible Cultural Heritage (24-28 November 2014)

The ninth session of the Intergovernmental Committee for the Safeguarding of the Intangible Cultural Heritage was held at UNESCO Headquarters from 24 to 28 November 2014. The opening session was attended by the Assistant Director-General for Culture. Chaired by José Manuel Rodríguez Cuadros (Peru), the Committee completed its work after five days of intensive debates.

The Committee welcomed the significant progress made in the implementation of the Convention, as well as expressed its appreciation of the overall strategy of capacity building set up by UNESCO to support the States and communities in their safeguarding efforts.

It also examined the preliminary recommendations of possible directives on safeguarding intangible cultural heritage and sustainable development at the national level and also established the new Evaluation Body which will examine, on an experimental basis for the 2015 cycle, nominations for inscription on the Urgent Safeguarding List and on the Representative List, proposals of safeguarding programmes for the Register of Best Practices and international assistance requests.

The Committee examined 27 periodic reports from States Parties on the implementation of the Convention and eight reports on elements inscribed on the Urgent Safeguarding List. It also inscribed three elements on the List of Intangible Cultural Heritage in Need of Urgen Safeguarding the carillon culture Safeguarding and 34 elements on the Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity, and selected one safeguarding programme for the Register of Best Practices.

Following the invitation of the Government of Namibia, the 10<sup>th</sup> session of the Intergovernmental Committee will be held in this country from 30 November to 4 December 2015. H.E. Ms Trudie Amulungu (Namibia) was elected Chairperson of the next session.

Participants: 1,071 (unprecedented number since the adoption of the Convention)

Audience: 138 States represented (24 Members of the Committee), States Parties to the Convention (107), UNESCO Member States non party to the Convention (7), accredited NGOs (64), Category 2 Centers (6), experts, media, and general public.



Press coverage: The meeting of the Intergouvernmental Committee for the safeguarding of intangible cultural heritage once again attracted media attention worldwide. More than 130 journalists covered the event, producing several hundred dispatches and reports. A press breakfast was organized ahead of the meeting (20 journalists present). Two press conferences were organized by delegations to announce or comment their inscriptions on the Intangible Heritage Lists. Capoeira (Brazil), Washi (Japan) and the Peruvian and Bolivian elements are among the most covered in their respective countries and also abroad. Financial restrictions prevented the webcasting of the session this year. No were there any pictures taken on the session. Six press releases were issued, as well as live tweets for each inscription, photo galleries and B-rolls. A number of interviews were done by UNESCO Staff (see details at interviews section), but many more were done with the delegates from different countries, and, of course, the practitioners of intangible heritage present at the meeting.

Social media: This year, every new inscription was announced and illustrated with photo collages illustrating the rich facets of the tradition. This is a remarkable step forward, as copyright concerns prevented us from doing so in past years. As social media is increasingly driven by visual, rather than written communications, we will need to actively encourage Member States to submit better supporting visuals. Currently the photos used are of poor resolution, and look rather dated. Among all the inscriptions, Capoeira stands us as the top performer, in all languages. This is arguably because the supporting visual is the most attractive, and modern. It garnered almost 11K shares on the FB page of our Brazil office.

### Focus on UNESCO Office in New Delhi

To highlight the outreach efforts of Field Offices, the report focuses each month since January 2014 on a different Field Office, and publishes the results of their public information activities. For further details, please contact directly the office concerned.

#### Director General's visit to India (24-26 November 2014)

On her third visit to India, the Director-General, Irina Bokova, after opening the UNESCO International Conference on the role of ICTs for persons with disabilities, held bilateral meetings with five Union Ministers namely, Smt. Sushma Swaraj, Minister of External Affairs; Smt. Smriti Zubin Irani, Minister of HRD; Shri M. Venkaiah Naidu, Minister of Urban Development; Dr. Harsh Vardhan, Minister of S&T and Earth Sciences; Dr Mahesh Sharma, Minister of State for Culture, to discuss their projects, vision and prospects for reinforced collaboration with UNESCO. During her meeting with the Minister of HRD, the DG welcomed the different initiatives of the Government and highlighted the emerging role of India as a leader in different areas of socio-economic development, particularly in sustainable development. She also met with Kailash Satyarthi, co-laureate of the 2014 Nobel Peace Prize and a longtime friend of UNESCO, through his involvement in the Education for All movement as founder and president of the Global Campaign for Education.



A Letter of Intent was signed by the Director-General and the Secretary, Ministry of Earth Sciences, Dr. Shailesh Nayak for cooperation in the field of reducing disaster risks and capacity building in earth sciences. In her various meetings, the DG appreciated the achievements of India in different areas of education, culture, heritage, oceanography, and communication. During her meeting with Minister of State for Culture she handed over the certificates establishing Rani-Ki Vav and the Himalayan National Park as World Heritage Sites following their inscription in June 2014.

The need for inclusive and innovative education were the key themes of the inaugural UNESCO MGIEP (Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Education for Peace and Sustainable Development) distinguished lecture presented by the Director-General. The event was attended by young pupils from schools, universities, and research institutes, dignitaries from government & nongovernment organizations, and international diplomatic missions. At the end of the lecture a momentum was offered to Dr. Karan Singh for his lifetime contribution to peace, tolerance and understanding.

#### UNESCO International Conference on "From Exclusion to Empowerment: Role of ICTs for Persons Disabilities" (Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi, 24-26 November, 2014)

In a powerful show of commitment, three Ministers from the Indian Government joined the Director-General in opening the UNESCO International Conference, whose principal objective was to promote the human rights and fundamental freedoms of person with disabilities. It also sought to encourage all stakeholders to take concrete measures for the empowerment of persons with disabilities through the effective application of information and communication technologies (ICTs). The Conference was attended by more than 1,000 high-level participants from around the world, and was built on the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (2006). The programme included three plenary sessions and panel discussions, a film festival – 'We Care' - that screened short films and documentaries on the multiple abilities of persons with disabilities and the exhibition on innovative ICT solutions, low-cost assistive technologies and ICTs for persons with disabilities.



Both a communication and a knowledge management tool, UNESCO's websites, with over 2.7 million pages of content, are today a key component of its public information strategy. Maintained by Corporate Web Services in close collaboration with the Programme Sectors, the main site is updated continually in all 6 UN languages (with some subportals also in Portuguese, Vietnamese, et al).

Web traffic shown here (page views, visits, visitors, country and language of visit, etc) has been measured since September 2011 with the free Google Analytics toolset via tags embedded in pages. More detailed statistics on specific programmes can be made available to the responsible officers upon request (contact v.pham@unesco.org).

November traffic was stable compared to last month's high figures. It shows only a 7 percent drop in page views compared to the same month last year, when UNESCO hosted the General Conference.


These results are explained by significance of the November major events, such as the International Day to End Impunity for Crimes Against Journalists, the UNESCO World Conference on Education for Sustainable Development, the International Conference "From Exclusion to Empowerment" and the meeting of the Intergovernmental Committee for the Safeguarding of the Intangible Cultural Heritage among others, that brought many users to the dedicated websites.

On unesco.int, page views increased for the third month in a row (+17%) and have almost doubled compared to same month last year - who peaked at that time during the General Conference.

The most viewed pages on Unescommunity were articles about Staff Day 2014, the medals assigned to MSS, the HRM tutorials and the Correspondence microsite.





Overall, media coverage for November fell by 20 percent over the same period in 2013. Nonetheless, several events kept UNESCO in the headlines around the world during the month.


The first International Day to End Impunity for Crimes against Journalists (2/11) drew the attention of the press in all regions. An op-ed by the Director-General on the issue was published in *Liberation* (France), the *Miami Herald* (USA), the *Mail and Guardian* (South Africa), *El Universal* (Mexico) and Al Hayat (Pan-Arab). The press release issued by UNESCO for the event was relayed by scores of news outlets, especially in Latin America, and many more reported on their own national situations. The Education for Sustainable Development Conference also received excellent news coverage, especially in Japan where it was hosted, but also in several African and Latin American nations. An op-ed by the Director-General on the issue was published in *Asahi-Shimbun*, one of Japan's leading dailies, *The Standard* (Kenya), the *Journal du Mali* and the *Huffington Post* (U.S).

Like the ESD conference, most of the coverage for the conference in New Delhi on ITC's and Disabled People, came from local and regional media, with reports in *The Times of India, Bangladesh News, The Asian Age* and the *India Education Magazine*, among others.


However, the biggest story of the month, in terms of press coverage was the annual meeting of the Intangible Heritage Committee. As can clearly be seen in the graph opposite, daily press coverage increased significantly during the meeting, especially during the inscription of new elements (24 to 28 November). The overwhelming majority of articles monitored during this period were devoted to the new elements. The figures are almost identical to last year's coverage of this event.

Earlier in the month, the Director-General's visit to Iraq was also well covered with articles on Ms Bokova's statements during the visit reported in all regions of the world. Many of the stories that appeared on the web were accompanied by television footage by the Reuters news agency, shot during the Director-General's visit to the Baghdad Museum. Ms Bokova was also interviewed at length by the *Christian Science Monitor* (US) and Associated Press (AP), whose stories were relayed by scores of other media.


### 3. UNESCO Social Media Channels



These documents and publications are produced by UNESCO Headquarters, UNESCO Offices and Institutes and cover all areas of its activities: education, natural sciences, social and human sciences, culture, communication and information. An application has been specially developed for conducting the statistical consultation of electronic files (PDFs) from 1 January 2006.

In November, **146,240** records were available online in PDF format (146,030 in October), including documents, publications, communication material and other working documents.




The UNESCO Library collections offer an overview of the Organization's current and past activities and programmes as recorded in print publications and other resources.



They are produced in a variety of formats (books, CD-ROMs, ebooks, etc.) and are classified into different categories (global and regional reports, monographs, reviews, technical studies, atlases, etc.). They are distributed for free via UNESCO's networks and on-line, or as sales products under the 'UNESCO Publishing' imprint.

Online viewing has slightly decreased compared to September and October (estimated figures) of this year but show a strong increase versus November 2013. The two main flagship reports of UNESCO, the *EFA Global Monitoring Report 2013-2014* and the *World Water Development Report 2014*, continue to fare well in the top ten downloads. Titles in Spanish account for 54 percent of the publications in this table with the UNESCO World Report *Towards Knowledge Societies* in Spanish in top position. Page views on Google Books have risen for four months in a row, and show a 79 percent increase compared to same month last year. Bookshop and online sales were largely dominated by titles on heritage and on education.





# 9.1. Patronage

Patronage is UNESCO's most prestigious form of moral support. It is granted to demonstrate UNESCO's endorsement of an activity organized under the responsibility of an external organization. UNESCO's patronage is granted to a range of activities, such as cinematographic and audiovisual productions, publications, meetings, conferences and cultural performances, award ceremonies, as well as a range of other events of regional and international scale. Information on patronage requests and their follow-up is recorded in a central database managed by ERI/DPI/PBM. The database is updated daily and shared with the focal points for UNESCO name and logo use of each Sector.

# 10. Media Partnerships

UNESCO has partnership agreements with the media, such as newspaper companies (Asahi Shimbun / Japan, Dong-A Daily and The Chosun Ilbo / Korea) and TV networks (NHK and TBS / Japan). Memoranda of Understanding have been recently signed with major press agencies (RIA Novosti / Russia, Xinhua News Agency / People's Republic of China, Al Jazeera / Qatar).

The general purpose of these partnerships is to enhance public awareness of our message and activities through written and audiovisual products where the name and logo of UNESCO is present. The results of these partnerships are measurable according to the area of collaboration (e.g. intangible cultural heritage) in terms of UNESCO name and logo exposure to the Media audience (statistical data) and comments by the readers/audience if any.
