Dr Abdulla El Reyes invited the representative of the Director-General, Indrajit Banerjee, Director of the Knowledge Societies Division, to introduce item 7.2. In accordance with the procedures adopted in 2007 for the monitoring of the implementation of UNESCO conventions and recommendations for which no specific institutional mechanism is provided (177 EX/Decision 35 (I)), the Governing Bodies have adopted a multi-stage procedure for the monitoring of the implementation of these standard-setting instruments, including the Recommendation concerning the Promotion and Use of Multillingualism and Universal Access to Cyberspace (2003). Pursuant to 36/Resolution 58 and in compliance with the timetable for 2014-2017 of work of the Committee on Conventions and Recommendations of the Executive Board (CR) on the implementation of these standard-setting instruments (195 EX/Decision 15) and 197 EX/Decision 20 (VII), the Director-General submitted to the 38 th session of the General Conference the third consolidated report on the implementation of this Recommendation.

Summary of debate	Following a proposal by the Government of Kuwait to establish in Kuwait City a Global Centre for Excellence (GCE) for the Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities through Information and Communication Technologies (ICT) as a category 2 centre under the auspices of UNESCO, a technical mission to Kuwait was undertaken in 2014 to assess its feasibility. The evaluation of the proposal was carried out in conformity with the criteria outlined in document 37 C/18 Part I.		
	Following 197 EX/Decision 16 Part XXII, document 38 C/18 Part XXII contains a draft resolution for the approval of the granting to the Centre of the status of a category 2 centre under the auspices of UNESCO.		
	The Chairperson, Dr. Abdulla El Reyes (United Arab Emirates) informed the representatives of Member States that item 4.4 will be examined without debate.		
	The representative of the Director-General, Mr Getachew Engida took the floor.

United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland took the floor to comment on document 38 C/48. The following countries also made their comments: Colombia, Brazil, Egypt, and Ecuador. The Chairperson invited the delegates to examine the resolution contained in paragraph 12 of document 38 C/48, in order to ensure that UNESCO's mandate and priorities figure prominently in taking forward the 2030 sustainable development agenda and beyond. The draft resolution was recommended to the General Conference for its adoption. The Chairperson thanked all the representatives of Member States for their contributions. He closed Debate 8 at 4:30 p.m. and announced that the examination and adoption of the Report of the Communication Commission (CI) will take place during the Plenary session on 17 or 18 November 2015.
